Those of you who have been to this dance know what I'm talking about; it doesn't get any better than this. They've been making their annual pilgrimage to the Pacific Northwest for 25 years and graciously including the PCDC community. Who knows when their 'wild' ride will come to an end? Don't miss this! Tuesday November 20: Buddy System with George Marshall. I suppose for inspiration I could put a Great Bear Trio CD in the player but that is only part of the picture of the band Buddy System. Noah VanNorstrand (of Great Bear Trio fame) is on fiddle, mandolin and foot percussion; with Julie Vallimont on piano, accordion and jawharp. They have taken the country by storm since they started performing together in 2014." The last time they came to town some of us had the pleasure of attending their performance at a house concert. What a wonderful time it was getting up close and personal and marveling at their musical talents, which range from rollicking to soulful. For contra dances they shift seamlessly into tremendously energetic high gear to provide awesome dancing. What a wonderful evening it will be!

But of course, the main floor is reserved for the foot-stomping, sweatinducing joy that is contra dance. And here we will have two of the top Pacific

Admission at the door covers all three floors of dancing. Take a break sometime during the evening from your favorite dance style and take a spin on one of the other floors. You will have a blast! Five hours of dancing at Norse Hall from 8 pm to 1 am; contra lesson at 7:30. Admission is on a sliding scale: \$10-\$25.

PCDC Policy Updates

PCDC is a non-profit educational organization whose primary purpose is to promote the knowledge and encourage the practice of traditional country dance and music through activities and programs open to the general public.

The PCDC **Grant Fund** was created to increase the knowledge and skill of our community of dancers and musicians by helping members attend dance and music camps and workshops. The following changes to grants policy will be implemented beginning January 1, 2019:

- Applicants must have been a PCDC member for at least six months prior to the application
- · Members can apply for a grant annually
- Members can apply for a grant up to 60 days after an event
- As the purpose of the grant is to increase knowledge and skill levels, grant recipients will be asked to submit a written statement on how their attendance at a particular event will enrich and/or increase their contribution to our community.

Grant amounts:

- \$75 grants are given for weekend events
- \$100 grants are given for long weekend (four days/ three nights) dance camps

- \$150 grants are given for workshops or camps that are five days or longer
- A grant cannot fund greater than 100% of any event. For example if a workshop costs \$35, the grant will be for \$35.

PCDC, along with the first and third Saturday dance organizers have decided to move to a **sliding scale admission** of \$6-\$15 for all their regular contra dances. You are invited to pay what you can afford, what you have been paying or pay a little more than usual. Special events, such as the New Year's Dance, may be priced higher.

And sadly, there may be more changes on the horizon for the **Fulton Community Center**. Portland Parks and Recreation has a new commissioner (Nick Fish) and is in the midst of a search for a new director. They project being able to begin evaluating the small community centers including Fulton sometime in February 2019 and I, Christine Appleberry, am already signed up to be on the evaluation committee. Portland Parks and Recreation has been trying to close Fulton since 2005 and it now appears that they will succeed, perhaps sooner rather than later. PCDC, together with the other contra dance organizers, has therefore created a hall search committee to systematically look for an alternative hall. We will keep you posted on our search. And in the meantime, we will keep dancing.

Sue Songer Receives CDSS Award

CDSS, the Country Dance & Song Society of which PCDC is a member, recently announced that Sue Songer will be the 2019 recipient of its "Lifetime Contribution Award." CDSS says, "It's hard to imagine the Portland dance and music scene without Sue. She has been an integral part of that scene since the 1980's - as a musician, as the leader of the Portland Megaband, as a leader on planning and production committees and as the walking, talking tune encyclopedia we all depend on." A source close to Sue says, "This is a well-deserved national recognition for her decades of leadership...and advocacy in the community, and her teaching and playing across the country...she does it all with grace and joy!" Sue will be honored on Saturday March 30, 2019 at a celebration in Portland which will feature jams, a potluck, an award ceremony and an open band/caller contra dance. -Editor

PCDC Board Meeting Minutes

August 21, 2018. Present: Christine Appleberry, Ric Goldman, Rich Goss, Sara Munz, Sue Songer and guests: Kim Appleberry, William Watson.

Treasurer's Report (via email): We are almost finished moving all accounting activities onto QuickBooks to streamline financials. The current fiscal year's books should be closed by early September and we should be able to file on time and without needing an extension, a major milestone for us. Jaydra and Ric met to look at opportunities to automate and make more of our financial processes available online. Jaydra feels we need to have a more formal annual budgeting process for all ongoing activities so we can start overall organization planning.

Chair's Report: The Hillsboro Contra has new organizers. Victor Fiore and Tarka Ayres are taking over from Ivan Camacho, who has returned part of the Hillsboro grant. The PCDC Dance Tunes Sessions asked to be funded for the 2018-2019 year at the same rate as last year. The board approved this without objection.

ECD Report: The Friday series is doing well. Ball preparation continues. Current registration is already at 69 (about half full).

Contra Committee: The committee is looking into declines in attendance and membership and wants to adopt sliding-scale admissions as used in Corvallis, Eugene and this year's Megaband. The First Saturday Contra Dance also plans to move to a sliding scale admission.

Raindance Report: The committee is meeting with PCDC's treasurer regarding the adoption of new accounting procedures.

Northwest Passage Report: Current registration is 119 (out of 125 max) campers. NWP will continue alternating between contra and English programs. The 2019 contra camp staff will include Adina Gordon, KGB and Eloise & Co.; the program will include one ECD workshop.

Grants: One approved, one on hold.

New Business: The administration of Fulton Park is being reorganized by the city once again. We are having trouble scheduling any 2019 dances until after Jan 2, 2019, which could be rather last minute for some. We will contact Portland Parks and Recreation to determine what the issues are.

Sept. 18, 2018. Present: Christine Appleberry, Rich Goss, Noah Grunzweig, Jaydra Perfetti, Sue Songer.

New grants policy. The new grants policy will take effect in January, 2019. The application will include a mechanism requiring the recipient to report back to the board within two months of the event attended. This report will go to the chair. Christine will write an article for Footnotes explaining the grants policy as well as the new sliding scale admission for contra dances. We will put out the word about grants at dances prior to January. Rich will send us a link to the Google doc that has the list of past grant recipients.

Hall Search. After much discussion and consultation, the board concluded that the likelihood of losing the Fulton Community Center is great and that we should therefore proceed with looking for a replacement. Sue will talk to

Dan Compton, who organizes the Third Saturday Contra Dance, about the Fulton situation. Sue will ask Dave Hamlin to contact the Milwaukie Community Club about availability for Sat. night, Fri. night, and other weeknights and she will ask the Polish Hall about its availability for regular dances. Christine will investigate whether the schools have already vacated Fulton and will include an update on the hall search in her Footnotes article.

The board brainstormed a few ideas regarding the Saturday contra dances with a consensus that all options should be on the table including changing the day of the week that the dances are held. We had mistakenly believed that the Milwaukie Community Club was available every Saturday, so some discussion was given to that before learning that it is not always available.

It was decided to form a hall search committee which will consist of Rich, Sue, Kim Appleberry, a representative from the Contra Committee, a representative from the band UnLeashed! (First Saturday Dance), and a representative from the Third Saturday Dance. Sue will ask Dave Hamlin if he would be interested in chairing the committee.

Other business. One grant was approved. [Next PCDC board meetings: 11/8, 12/6.]
