Winter's chill has come early this year, tingling the nose and numbing the foot. One great respite from the winter tingle/numb cycle is dancing, and as the crowds indicate, this winter has proved no exception. With a very successful scholarship dance now passed and the Christmas dance just to come, winter spirits are looking very bright.

### Special events

Breitenbush Dance and Ski Vacation. Fight the post Christmas blues with a retreat at Breitenbush hot springs. Running from Dec 27th to the 1st at Breitenbush Hot Springs, the week will feature contra/square dances on the 30th and 31st. There will be two bands and callers, including Roger Peacock, Phil and Vivian Williams, Dennis Rothrock, and Deborah and Creighton Lindsey. A five day stay costs \$150, 3 days for \$100, or \$35 per day. This includes lodging (4-5 / cabin), 3 meals a day, guided ski tours and the evening dances. First Friday Dances. We have a hot set of first friday dances coming up in the new year. The January dance will feature Larry Smith, a caller now living in La Grande who some may remember from the dawn dance. This dance also introduces Tommy Hayes, one of the hottest bodhran players in the world and a former member of the irish musical group, Stockton's Wing.

The February dance promises a lot of variety, with several new callers all living here in Portland. The first friday dances are aimed at strengthening our dancing community by providing opportunities for new musicians and callers to develop their skill. Besides new callers, sit-in musicians are welcome to join the scheduled band at this and all first friday dances.

Contradance Classes. Portland Public Schools in conjunction with Portland Parks and Recreation will sponsor an 8 week course in New England style contra and square dancing at MLC. The course will present the basics of New England dancing for beginners, provide an opportunity to work on styling, and show a variety of formations and dances leading to strong overall dancing skills. Classes will be on Wednesdays from 7:30 to 9, starting January 15th. The instructor will be Bob Nisbet.

Early American Vintage Ball. An unusual evening of Early American dancing will be presented at the Fulton Community center late in January. Bob Nisbet has prepared an evening of vintage dance and a great lineup of musicians. Everyone is encouraged to dress up for this semi-

formal costumed event, to help spirit our community back two centuries, at least for one evening. \$4 PCDC/\$5 others.

Musicians and Callers Workshop. PCDC is sponsoring a free workshop on playing for and calling dances. In the musicians workshop, Edith Farrar and George Penk will advise aspiring dance musicians in techniques for playing good dance music. In a separate workshop, callers and potential callers will participate in open discussion about techniques for calling. A dance that evening will provide workshop participants with practical experience. Nonparticipants are encouraged to come to the dance.

Ski and Dance Weekend. Once again Portland dancers can gather up their skis and dance shoes for a blowout at the Mt. Hood Kiwanis Camp over the weekend of Feb. 21. The Friday night potluck/party will be followed on Saturday by a cross country ski tour and a evening dance called by Craig Shinn. No skiing or dancing experience is necessary, and the cost is only \$35 (not including skis). Call Ted Remillard for more information.

Camp Wannadance began last year, the first winter weekend camp put on by our dancing neighbors to the north. The camp is well worth the trip and happens at Fort Flagler, near Port Townsend, on the weekend following ski/dance. The staff includes Brad Foster, Laurie Andres, John Culhane and John Krumm. Last year's non-staff campers included the Canotes and Sandy Bradley, and filled up very quickly, so early registration is recommended. PCDC Spring Weekend. Mark your calendars now for the weekend of April 10th, when PCDC will host a spring weekend at Camp Kiwanilong, near Astoria. Workshops will focus on French country dance, Irish dance and contras, with dance parties each night. Staff includes Cour de Miracles, White Hart (including Mike Saunders & Dale Russ), Vickie Yancy, and Joan and Danny Hathaway. Festivities begin Thursday night and run through Sunday.

# Dean Kenty Scholarship Fund

PCDC established the Dean Kenty Scholarship Fund to encourage the involvement of Portland country dancers at music and dance events in the Pacific Northwest and elsewhere. Scholarships assist persons who attend such workshops in order to enhance their knowledge and skills. The scholarships are intended to permit dance and music experiences that might not be otherwise financially possible.

Scholarships come in two varieties: work scholarships to PCDC weekends, valued at \$25, and grants of \$40 or \$80 to non-PCDC music or dance events. Work scholarships generally entail assisting in the kitchen or camp cleanup. PCDC scholarships began in 1981 when three grants were awarded to the Bay Area Country Dance Society camp in Mendocino, CA. Work scholarships were initiated in 1982 with the first Suttle Lake weekend. When Dean Kenty died in September of 1983, the scholarship fund was named in his memory. Approximately 80 scholarships have been awarded over the last five years.

For 1986, PCDC will award up to five work scholarships to the spring weekend and ten work scholarships for the fall weekend. The number of grants will depend on the scholarship fund level, but are expected to be about six \$40 grants and six \$80 grants. The sum total of these scholarships is \$1095. Work

scholarships are awarded to PCDC members first, but persons from outside the organization may apply. Grants are for PCDC members only. We are trying to spread these scholarships as widely as possible through the organization. #### Synopsis of regular dances

Unless otherwise noted, these dances are open to everyone—experienced or not. Partners are not necessary, all dances are taught, and children are admitted without charge.

PCDC First Friday Dance. This a contra dance at the Multnomah Art Center which showcases a collection of local and regional callers and dance bands. Cost is \$3 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$4. If you are interested in calling or booking a band for this dance, please contact PCDC. Extra musicians are welcome to sit in with the invited band.

PCDC English Country Dance. English country dancing is alive and well in Portland. Come experience the form and grace of dancing which provided a root for modern square and contra dance style. This First Saturday of the month dance is held at Fulton Community Center, starts at 7:30pm and features live music and several callers. For more information, contact Kate MacMillan, 255-2226. Cost is \$2.

Stumptown Cloggers' Barn Dance. On the second Friday of the month the Stumptown Cloggers sponsor a dance of mostly squares and a few contras in the old roller rink at Oaks Park. It is a large room with a good floor, and usually features

a Stumptown performance as an intermission event. Cost \$3.50.

Second Saturday Contra Dance. This is the longest continuously running contra dance in the state. For over seven years, Craig Shinn and Carl Wester have been introducing Portlanders to New England Contra Dancing. The location and bands have changed, but the dance goes on, currently in Multnomah Art Center. Cost is \$3 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$4.

Portland Ceili Dance. In Irish, ceili means loosely "a gathering of friends." Lively Irish music, sometimes played by world famous musicians, very aerobic dancing in a warm company of friends and a full bar are only a few of the notable features of this Third Friday of the month dance. The basic steps are taught usually from 8 to 8:30, then dances are called until 11. The band plays until around 1am. Because of the bar, you must be 21 or older to enter. Cost is \$3.50 for members of the Portland Ceili Society, \$4.50 for others.

Fourth Friday Square and Swing Dance. Rich Kuras and Ned Leager call squares and contras intermixed with swing and cajun dances at the St. John's Eagles Hall, on John street between Lombard and Ivanhoe. Cost is \$3.50.
