#### Special events

PCDC Board Elections occurred at our general membership meeting, potluck and dance. Several people retired from our board: Bob Nisbet, Monique Wilson, and as previously announced, Jim Howe. The elections brought in several new board members: Emily Cohen, Lani Martin, Terri Walker and Jeff Weber. We'd like to thank our retiring board members for the effort they've mustered in promoting dance and music in Portland, and we welcome new members of our board.

The Horseflies are a soulful and expressive old-time stringband from the East Coast, who are touring the Northwest this summer. In 1986 the band was nominated for best Old Time String Band by the Society for the Preservation of Bluegrass Music of America. They have two records out on the Rounder label, and they will be in Portland on the 11th and 12th of July for a concert/dance and an instrumental workshop. The concert will run for an hour, followed by a dance called by Warren Argo. At 2pm on Sunday, the band members will lead instrumental

workshops on banjo, backup guitar, fiddle and bass. Both events will be held at MAC.

Associated with this year's Portland Highland Games is the first annual Columbia-Pacific Scottish Fiddle Competition and Workshop. The Saturday workshop requires preregistration by July 3rd. Contact Marge van Nus, 1521 NE 97th Ave., Vancouver, WA 98664. The Sunday competition has Junior, Novice and Open categories.

We've already been getting inquiries about our Fall Dance Weekend at Suttle Lake. Ted Sannella will return to the Northwest for this September 17-20th event, accompanied by Wild Asparagus. Bruce Hamilton will teach English and Scottish dance, and Liz Dreisbach and Derek Booth will be on hand to provide English and Scottish dance music. The weekend is sure to be a sell-out. Get your applications in early. Work scholarships are available.

## Unless stated, all dances are open to everyone—experienced or not, with or without partners, and feature live music. All dances are taught and children are admitted without charge. At any PCDC dance where sit-in musicians are encouraged to play, they will be admitted free.

PCDC First Friday Dance. This contra dance at MAC showcases local and regional callers and dance bands. Cost is \$3.50 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$4.50. PCDC English Country Dance. English Country dance is a source of modern square and contra dance style. This First Saturday of the month dance is held at Fulton Community Center, and starts at 7:30pm. For

Stumptown Cloggers' Barn Dance occurs on the second Friday of the month on the old roller rink at Oaks Park. Mostly squares and a few contras, it is in a large room with a good floor, and usually features a Stumptown performance at the intermission. Cost \$3.50.

Second Saturday Contra Dance is the longest continuously running contra dance in the state. This dance is similar to the first Friday dance, maintaining this tradition's ongoingness. A beginners workshop is held at 7:30. Cost is \$3.50 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$4.50.

Portland Celli Society Dance is "a gathering of friends" with lively Irish music, sometimes played by world famous musicians. Very aerobic dancing and a full bar are only a few of the notable features of this Third Friday of the month dance, held at VFW Lodge 907. The basic steps are taught usually from 8 to 8:30, and the dance goes on until 1am. Cost is \$3.50 for Portland Ceili Society members, others \$4.50. You must be over 21 to enter.

Third Saturday Contra Dance is a dance series organized by Paul McCullough at Fulton Community Center, which is just off Barbur Blvd. The dances tend towards the challenging side, and a workshop is available at 7:15 for beginners. Cost is \$4.

Third Saturday Celtic, American and Scandinavian Dance is organized by Evergreen Folkways in Vancouver at the Marshall Recreation Center. The series concentrates on dances of an American or Celtic tradition (including Irish and Welsh). Sit-in musicians are encouraged. Cost is \$3.

#### The Country Dance Form

Carl Wittman was a lover, dancer, teacher and researcher of English and Scottish country dances, whose life was tragically cut short last year. His legacy lives on in a source book of English and Scottish country dances, called Sun Assembly, to be published this year, and in a poster produced by The Heather and The Rose, proceeds from which will help defray the publishing costs of the book.

The country ounce form can be thought of as an exquisite vessel, in itself beautiful in shape, yet highly abstract.

(We can choose to fill this vessel with whatever meaning we like! If we like, we can pursue a pasticular friendship;

we can rejoice in a sense of community; we can see in the music and the dance the highest of spiritual values; we can see it as good fun.

The dance is all of these and greater than all of them.

May Board Meeting. About 30 people attended the Penn Fix calling and dance workshops, which cost PCDC about \$200. New membership cards which were to be distributed now appear to be lost. Due to a communications breakdown between the coordinator and door person of the May 1st Friday dance, the musicians and caller were not paid. We will pay them an extra \$10 each for their trouble. The Playford Ball had a large number of beginners, possibly due to the special notice given it by Willamette Week. English dances will resume in September. Fulton Park has still not been confirmed for the dawn dance, but we still have the Warner Grange reserved. The annual scholarship dance will be held the 2nd saturday of October. Final plans are in place for the general membership meeting at Laurelhurst Park. Three \$80 scholarships were given, one each for Fiddletunes, Mendocino or Augusta, and Lady of the Lake. \$300 is being held in reserve for Suttle Lake, leaving \$137 to be dispensed for other events through October. Molly will look into options for child care to control the problem of children running around and getting hurt at dances. A PCDC flyer will be put together for distribution at Folklife festival. Completed forms, bylaws, etc. in application for tax-exempt status were sent to CDSS April 8th. CDSS replied with a statement about application and renewal fees, which still must be sorted out.

June Board and General Membership Meeting. We've already received some requests for Suttle Lake applications. This year's English dance series netted a \$25 surplus. The Bruce Hamilton English workshop cost \$279. Final arrangements are being made for the Horseflies concert/dance and musicians workshops. Ann Johnston has been confirmed as the cook for Suttle Lake weekend. Plans are being made to deliver out-of-town staff, who are arriving on Wednesday and Thursday of that week. Attendance will be limited to 100-110. The special Monday night dance with Ted will start a little late, due to class commitments at Fulton Park. The Corvallis dancers would like to coordinate their 1st Saturday dance with our 1st Friday dance when out-of-town callers come through Portland. Fulton Park will be available for the dawn dance. Rental fees there will remain \$15.00/hour as long as we pay \$200 yearly in piano and other non-refundable fees. A musicians benefit fund will be created and funded by the annual New Year's dance. Policies for disbursement of the fund will be decided later. Moggy and Eric will try to organize parental sharing of child care responsibilities at the regular dances. Lani Martin, Jeff Weber, Terri Walker and Emily Cohen were elected to the board at the general membership meeting. Eric Griswold and Robert Reed were reelected. Replacement officers for treasurer and secretary will be decided at the July board meeting.
