PCDC's annual fall Dusk to Dawn Dance will be in town for the first time this year, on Nov 14th. Fulton Park will be the site of this enduring tradition. Luther Black will come down to share the mike with several local callers, including Paul McCullough and Bob Nisbet. Come share the thrill of waltzing by the dawn's early light. Get your admission badges early and have them personalized with your very own name as part of the design, on sale for \$7 at local dances in October and November, or send a check to PCDC, 3510 NE Schuyler, Portland, OR 97212.

Eugene Harvest Ball. English and Scottish dance aficionados won't want to miss the annual ball, this year at the Walterville Community Hall, 12 miles east of Springfield on highway 126 (turn left at the Walterville General store). Music will be provided by Alasdair Fraser and Paul Machlis. A 1:30 to 4 pm workshop will review the dances, which will be done with minimal walk-throughs at the 8 pm ball. \$10 covers the workshop and the dance.

Alasdair Fraser and Paul Machlis will also provide the music for the November Third Saturday dance in Portland. Alasdair has earned national recognition for his

fiddle playing, including gigs with Jean Redpath on A Prairie Home Companion. It will be an exciting musical evening.

Christmas Dance and Winter Solstice. Evergreen Folkways continues their tradition of Christmas dance parties over at the Marshall center in Vancouver. This annual event includes dancing, singing, wassail, a dessert potluck and lots more. Bring an ornament to add to the tree. Boxing Day Dance. Got a case of the day-after-Christmas doldrums? Shake 'em out at the Fourth Saturday dance. Traditionally, Boxing day is when British employers would hand out gift boxes to their staff, the first night of Twelfth-night. Cascade Mountain Year End Dance Camp. Synopsis of regular dances

Unless stated, all dances are open to everyone—experienced or not, with or without partners, and feature live music. All dances are taught and children are admitted without charge. At any PCDC dance where sit-in musicians are encouraged to play, they will be admitted free.

PCDC First Friday Dance. This contra dance at MAC showcases local and regional callers and dance bands. Cost is \$3.50 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$4.50. If you'd like to call or book a band for this dance, please contact PCDC. Musicians are encouraged to sit in with the hired band, but will not be miked. A beginners workshop is held at 7:30.

PCDC First Saturday English Country Dance. English Country dance is a source of modern square and contra dance style. This dance is held at Fulton Community Center, and starts at 7:30pm. For more information, contact Kate, 255-2226. Cost is \$2.50.

Stumptown Cloggers' Barn Dance

swings on the second Friday of the month at Oaks Park. Mostly squares and a few contras, it is in a large room with a good floor, and usually features a Stumptown performance at the intermission. Cost \$3.50.

Second Saturday Contra Dance is the longest continuously running contra dance in the state. This dance is similar to the first Friday dance, maintaining this tradition's ongoingness. A beginners workshop is held at 7:30. Cost is \$3.50 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$4.50.

Third Tuesday English Dance Workshop is a chance to experiment with unfamiliar or challenging English dances, as well as improve your style. It runs from 7:30 to 9:30 at Friends Meeting House, and will rely on taped music.

Portland Ceili Society Dance is "a gathering of friends" with lively Irish music, frequently played by world famous musicians. Very aerobic dancing and a full bar are only a few of the notable features of this Third Friday of the month dance, held at VFW Lodge 907. It starts at 8pm and goes on until 1am. Cost is \$3.50 for Portland Ceili Society members, others \$4.50. You must be over 21 to enter.

Third Saturday Contra Dance is a dance series organized by Paul McCullough at Fulton Community Center, which is just off Barbur Blvd. The dances tend towards the challenging side, and a workshop is available at 7:15 for beginners. Cost is \$4.

Third Saturday Celtic, American and Scandinavian Dance is organized by Evergreen Folkways in Vancouver at the Marshall Recreation Center. The series concentrates on dances of an American or Celtic tradition (including Irish and Welsh). Sit in musicians are encouraged. Cost is \$3.

Fourth Saturday Contra Dance is another independent dance series, organized by Moggy Vanderkin. It is held at Fulton Park starting at 8pm, and has a workshop for beginners starting at 7:15pm. Cost is \$4.



September Board Meeting. Molly will prepare a new description of PCDC activities for national CDSS directory of member dance organizations. Dance coordinators were reminded that they are responsible to arrange lodging, if necessary, for out-of-town callers and musicians. Suttle Lake, the scholarship dance and the dawn dance planning are mostly complete. PCDC now has 501(c)3 federal tax exempt status as a CDSS member organization. Contributions in excess of the \$8.00 membership fee are tax deductable. Coverage of dances in the media has been spotty, despite current efforts. Suggestions for improving publicity included a business card sized generic schedule, and adding radio and TV stations to the mailing list. It was decided that those seeking signatures for petitions may NOT place them on the front table at dances without prior board approval. Deborah will work on a welcome letter for new members. \$80 scholarships were given to Lefty, Dennis and Louise to help them attend the Acadian Festival in Louisiana.

October Board Meeting. The City of McMinnville's request for folkdance instructors for their Parks and Recreation program will be pursued by Moggy, though PCDC will not respond to the request. A moderate loss (under \$200) was reported for the Suttle Lake weekend. The First Friday dance lost some money, probably due to the combination of Silver Falls weekend and no notice of it in the newsletter. The board discussed ways to improve the attendence of English dances, through flyers, articles, and special talent. On admission fees, the board decided: no special spectators admission will be provided, disabled persons will be included in the seniors' discount, discount coupons will be provided in exchange for volunteer service at dances. Deborah will design the coupon. Eric Griswold resigned from the board due to time commitments elsewhere. It was noted in discussing publicity that newspapers generally require separate notification for dance events, rather than just sending them a newsletter. PCDC will sponsor another sea chantey concert Jan 30th.
