PCDC New Year's Dance Party. Bring your feet, your fiddles, your feathers and flash, and your favorite desserts to the New Year's bash. Proceeds of our second annual dance party go to a musician's benefit fund, established this year by PCDC to help when catastrophe strikes musical contributors to our community. Celebrate the arrival of the new year and then dance until 2. No alcohol please.

Just Singin' in the Rain is the theme for our January second Saturday dance. Bob Nisbet will croon the hits, both new and old, from that immortal era of singing squares and contras. Right hand to your partner, box the gnat and settle down. Make it twice!

East Avenue Tavern presents a lot of talented folk over the next couple of months. Connie Kaldor brings her pianistic wit and humorous repertoire of original songs to the tav Jan. 14th. For an Irish flavored evening, check out the talents of Danny Carnahan and Robin Petrie on Feb. 5th. On the 10th, don't miss Greg Brown, that songwriting dynamo whose wit and poignancy earned him a regular slot on A Prairie Home Companion. Jim Page, a perennial favorite of northwest audiences, graces the stage on Feb. 12th. Steel guitar fanciers should be there on the 19th for Bob Brossman, one of the real showmen of the guitar. And winding up the month on the 24th is the one and only Jesse Winchester. All shows begin around 9 pm.

Work Songs of the Sea continues in its fine tradition of sharing sea shanteys, this second year at the Echo Theatre. The concert goes until 10 pm on the last Saturday in January, and will be followed by a singer's free-for-all and party. Last year the place was packed, so come

early, open your throats and learn a new chorus or a new harmony.

Cameron Stewart comes to call in February from his home in Vancouver, B.C. His dances are all the rage in Seattle, and joining him will be two Seattle-ites, Edith Farrar and Erin Shrader.

PCDC Ski-dance Weekend. After a year's hiatus, that wild weekend of sliding, sogging and sashaying returns to the Mt. Hood Kiwanis camp. After a Friday night potluck and party, spend the day on the slopes, returning that night for a dance called by Bob Nisbet. Lodging, three meals and the dance are only \$40, due by Feb. 18th. Camp Wannadance. If two weekends in a row is not enough of a retreat, get away for a third. Fort Flagler, on the windswept tip of Marrowstone Island, will once again house this fourth annual Seattle dance weekend. Fred Breunig will be coming from Putney, VT to teach New England and English country dances. Frank Hall and Mary Beth Roska (from Bloomington, IN) will teach squares, contras, play party games and clogging, both English and hometown-style. Sherry Nevins will give swing dance classes. The hot musical staff includes Selma Kaplan (from Altamont, NY) and Lauries Andres. This plus food by Julie's Kouzina runs \$70 (early payment). Applications with at least a \$30 deposit must be in by Feb 6th. Admission to this popular weekend is usually by lottery, so be sure to get your applications in early. Unless stated, all dances are open to everyone—experienced or not, with or without partners, and feature live music. All dances are taught and children are admitted without charge. At any PCDC dance where sit-in musicians are encouraged to play, they will be admitted free.

PCDC First Friday Dance. This contra dance at MAC showcases local and regional callers and dance bands. Cost is \$3.50 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$4.50. If you'd like to call or book a band for this dance, please contact PCDC. Musicians are encouraged to sit in with the hired band, but will not be miked. A beginners workshop is held at 7:30.

PCDC First Saturday English Country Dance. English Country dance is a source of modern square and contra dance style. This dance is held at Fulton Community Center, and starts at 7:30pm. For more information, contact Kate, 255-2226. Cost is \$2,50.

## Synopsis of regular dances

Stumptown Cloggers' Barn Dance swings on the second Friday of the month at Oaks Park. Mostly squares and a few contras, it is in a large room with a good floor, and usually features a Stumptown performance at the intermission. Cost \$3.50.

Second Saturday Contra Dance is the longest continuously running contra dance in the state. This dance is similar to the first Friday dance, maintaining this tradition's ongoingness. A beginners workshop is held at 7:30. Cost is \$3.50 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$4.50.

Portland Celli Society Dance is "a gathering of friends" with lively Irish music, frequently played by world famous musicians. Very aerobic dancing and a full bar are only a few of the notable features of this Third Friday of the month dance, held at VFW Lodge 907. It starts at 8pm and goes on until 1am. Cost is

\$3.50 for Portland Ceili Society members, others \$4.50. You must be over 21 to enter.

Third Saturday Contra Dance is a dance series organized by Paul McCullough at Fulton Community Center, which is just off Barbur Blvd. The dances tend towards the challenging side, and a workshop is available at 7:15 for beginners. Cost is \$4.

Third Saturday Celtic, American and Scandinavian Dance is organized by Evergreen Folkways in Vancouver at the Marshall Recreation Center. The series concentrates on dances of an American or Celtic tradition (including Irish and Welsh). Sit-in musicians are encouraged, Cost is \$3.

Fourth Saturday Contra Dance is another independent dance series, organized by Moggy Vanderkin. It is held at Fulton Park starting at 8pm, and has a workshop for beginners starting at 7:15pm. Cost is \$4.

January Board Meeting. Funds were approved for Emily to consult with an accountant in preparing the half-yearly budget report. The New Year's Dance was a great success, with a good number of cleanup volunteers, but there was some conjestion around the dessert tables, and suggestions about celebrating "the big moment" more vehemently. Todd Whitemore, Rodney Miller and Peter Barnes are swinging through the Northwest and available for a mid-week dance in April. No agenda for a retreat has crystallized, so none will be planned this winter. Children at the MAC were not well controlled at the last dance. Though no complaints were heard, we need to get this under control. A standard announcement list has been developed to insure coverage of all important announcements at each dance. Dina Blade has been hired to teach step, tap and swing dance at Suttle Lake '88. The board contributed \$100 to Folklife and \$50 to CDSS. The sound system used at English dances has been upgraded. Mail-in membership renewals have not been receiving membership cards due to some confusion about responsibilities. Jeff will talk to Bob Nisbet about how best to handle this situation. Around three board positions will be available in June. The board expressed a desire to have some musicians on the board.

February Board Meeting. A double entry bookkeeping system is now being employed for PCDC's treasury, but the half-yearly budget report is still not done. A new planning calendar was introduced to the board, showing regional as well as local non-PCDC events. Suttle Lake weekend will include Jenny Shimer, Bob Dalsemer and Dina Blade and is budgeted at \$8500. The 1988 Dusk to Dawn dance is tentatively scheduled for Oct 8th, and will feature Christy Keevil. The general membership meeting and picnic will be held at Fulton Park, to coincide with the dance there that evening. Millie Ortega will be available for a Cajun dance workshop in May, and plans are afoot to make it a wild weekend of dance, including swing, contra, the Playford Ball and cajun. With our new nonprofit status, PCDC will begin issuing receipts to volunteer musicians (such as at our benefits and our English dances) as "in kind" contributions, suitable for tax deductions. Moggy suggested raising band minimums to \$50, in keeping with other dances in the area; Emily will do a financial analysis of the proposed change.
