Start your Fall right—on September 1, PCDC's First Friday Dance welcomes one of Seattle's hottest callers, LauraMé Smith. Music will be dished out by the nationally-acclaimed Small Wonder String Band. Missing excitement in your life? Then don't miss this dance! At the Multnomah Art Center.

Don't plan on attending the September Third Saturday Contradance—everyone will be at PCDC's Suttle Lake Fall Weekend, September 15-18. Smith, the dance instruction of Walter and Nancyanna Dill, and the music of Edith Farrar, Carolyn Hatch and the Hurricane Ridgerunners. A special Occasional Production is planned for Oct. 10: Donnal Lunny and Liam O'Flynn in concert. These guys were two of the founders of Planxty, one of the foremost bands in the '70's revival of traditional Irish music. On Oct. 14, the PCDC Second Saturday Contradance moves to the Redland Grange for our annual Dusk 'til Done Dance (formerly "Dusk to Dawn" — the people on 'set-up committee' seem to be done before dawn). Dynamic callers, exciting music, great food—don't miss this landmark event! Watch for the flyers, T-shirts, buttons, air fresheners and commemorative watch fobs.

Occasional Productions presents Stanley Greenthal in concert Sunday, Oct. 22. Stanley will perform his original Northwest songs and music, accompanied by Gary Haggerty and probably some other folks. 8 pm at the Old Church.

The all-star lineup includes contra/English/squares/you-name-it callers Brad Foster and Jim Morrison, couple-dance teacher Kathy Dark, and flatfooting instructors John D. Holeman and Ruth Pershing. A very special concert is planned for Nov. 3: Masters of the Folk Violin. This national touring show includes Kenny Baker (old-time, bluegrass, swing), Seamus Connolly (Irish), Joe Cormier (Cape Breton), Claude Williams (jazz), Michael Doucet (Cajun), and Alison Krauss (Texas-style). In addition to the music of these legends and superstars there will be exhibits on violin-making, plus booths featuring local folk music organizations. It's all happening at the Northwest Service Center, 1819 NW Everett Street.

Since all of Oregon's fiddlers will be at the concert, we've asked Seattle's Luther Black to bring along a hot band from north of the border for November 3's PCDC First Friday Contradance. Your ears will have a great time at either event, so the choice is up to your feet.

Attentive readers will by now have noticed a dearth of East Avenue Tavern announcements. The East Ave has reverted to its previous owners, and things are currently in flux. As of publication time, the Tavern is expected to reopen in mid-August. We'll let you know of future plans as we learn of them.

Synopsis of regular dances

Unless stated, all dances are open to everyone—experienced or not, with or without partners, and feature live music. All dances are taught and children are admitted without charge. At any PCDC dance where sit-in musicians are encouraged to play, they will be admitted free.

PCDC First Friday Dance. This contra dance at MAC showcases local and regional callers and dance bands. Cost is \$3.50 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$4.50. If you'd like to call or book a band for this dance, please contact PCDC. Musicians are encouraged to sit in with the hired band, but will not be miked. A beginners workshop is held at 7:30.

PCDC First Saturday English Country Dance. English Country dance is a source of modern square and contra dance style. This dance is held at Fulton Community Center. For more information, contact Kate, 727-9607. Cost \$3.00.

Second Saturday Contra Dance is the longest continuously running contra dance in the state. This dance is similar to the first Friday dance, maintaining this tradition's ongoingness. A beginners workshop is held at 7:30. Cost is \$3.50 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$4.50.

Portland Ceili Society Dance is "a gathering of friends" with lively Irish music, frequently played by world famous musicians. Very aerobic dancing and a full bar are only a few of the notable features of this Third Friday of the month dance, held at VFW Lodge 907, but also is off for the summer. Cost \$5.

Third Saturday Contra Dance is a dance series organized by Paul McCullough at Fulton Community Center, which is just off Barbur Blvd. The dances tend towards the challenging side, and a workshop is available at 7:15 for beginners. Cost is \$4.50.

Vancouver Country Dance continues at the Marshall Recreation Center. A family evening organized by Evergreen Folkways, the series concentrates on dances of an American or Celtic tradition. Sit-in musicians are encouraged. Cost is \$3.

Fourth Saturday Contra Dance is another independent dance series, organized by Moggy Vanderkin. It is held at Fulton Park Community Center starting at 8 pm, and has a workshop for beginners starting at 7:15 pm. Cost is \$4.50.

PCDC July Board Minutes. Donations made to national Country Dance & Song Society (75th anniversary) and Oregon Public Broadcasting (for folk programming). Still looking into possibility of a Cajun dance to try out the 11th & Burnside hall, though that hall is looking less attractive than previously. Suttle Lake flyers have been sent out. PCDC will not be responsible for child care at Suttle Lake, but some members may set up babysitting services on their own. The planned Dusk to Dawn dance (October 14) will be changed to a "Dusk 'til Done" dance, based on past experience. Callers and musicians still need to be determined. A special English dance will be held July 29. A caller's retreat for West Coast callers and dancers has been proposed; a committee will explore this. A committee has been assembled to analyze PCDC expenses and income, to examine options that would enable us to pay musicians and callers a higher rate. Pro's and con's of having a regular caller or group of callers for one of the PCDC monthly contradances were discussed, and will be pursued further at the next Board meeting. Richard has volunteered to pursue greater publicity for our events. Carla has volunteered to take on the position of Secretary. Robert will be leaving town for a while, so Terri & Dave will take over the newsletter.
