Thursday, November 9 brings a very special dance, as Occasional Productions presents Alasdair Fraser and Paul Machlis. These nationally-renowned Scottish musicians seldom venture this way, and an opportunity to dance to their music is doubly rare. ductions turns Sunday, November 12 into a French Folk Music & Dance Festival, with the music and dance of Brittany performed by Ad Vielle que pourra. Their hurdy-gurdy, fiddle, flute, bouzouki, and accordion provide the backdrop for andros, mazurkas, bourées, gavottes and other traditional Breton dances. Synopsis of regular dances

Unless stated, all dances are open to everyone—experienced or not, with or without partners, and feature live music. All dances are taught and children are admitted without charge. At any PCDC dance where sit-in musicians are encouraged to play, they will be admitted free.

PCDC First Friday Dance. This contra dance at MAC showcases local and regional callers and dance bands. Cost is \$4.00 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$5.00. If you'd like to call or book a band for this dance, please contact PCDC. Musicians are encouraged to sit in with the hired band, but will not be miked. A beginners' workshop is held at 7:30.

PCDC First Saturday English Country Dance. English Country dance is a source of modern square and contra dance style. This dance is held at Fulton Community Center. For more information, contact Kate, 727-9607. Cost \$3.00.

Second Saturday Contra Dance is the longest continuously running contra dance in the state. This dance is similar to the first Friday dance, maintaining the tradition. A beginners' workshop is held at 7:30. Cost is \$4.00 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$5.00.

Portland Ceili Society Dance is "a gathering of friends" with lively Irish music, frequently played by world famous musicians. Very aerobic dancing and a full bar are only a few of the notable features of this Third Friday of the month dance, held at VFW Lodge 907, but also is off for the summer. Cost \$5.

Third Saturday Contra Dance is a dance series organized by Paul McCullough at Fulton Community Center, which is just off Barbur Blvd. The dances tend towards the challenging side, and a workshop is available at 7:30 for beginners. Cost is \$4.50.

Vancouver Country Dance continues at the Marshall Recreation Center. A family evening organized by Evergreen Folkways, the series concentrates on dances of American & Celtic tradition. Sitin musicians are encouraged. Cost is \$3.

Fourth Saturday Contra Dance is another independent dance series, organized by Moggy Vanderkin. It is held at Fulton Park starting at 8 pm, and has a workshop for beginners starting at 7:30 pm. Cost is \$4.50.

PCDC September Board Minutes. Moggy has resigned from the board. Mary will join Deborah as the Booking Committee. George is putting together the Dusk 'til Done Dance. Suttle Lake is full. Proposal to allow preregistration for next year's Suttle Lake voted down. Doorkeepers reminded that members of any folklore society get reciprocal discounts at our dances. Emily & Carla will arrange the New Year's Eve Dance. Possibility of letting beginner musicians jam before each dance was discussed and voted down, as would interfere with sound check and beginner workshop. Paul presented an analysis of the current musician/caller pay policy, plus several alternatives. In order to boost musician/caller reimbursement while still maintaining PCDC's financial viability, the following was decided: (1) raise admission to \$4 member/\$5 non-member; (2) raise membership fee to \$10, plus \$5 additional household member; (3) eliminate the "newsletter only" membership; (4) increase caller/musician guarantee to \$50; (5) after paying guarantee, plus costs of dance and PCDC production charge, split the remainder evenly among caller, musicians, and PCDC. Other topics discussed: rotating membership card colors, board member identifying buttons, board meeting schedule.

PCDC October Board Minutes. Suttle Lake was a great success. Despite selling out, though, it lost \$1,178, due mainly to some unforeseen travel expenses and a last-minute change in camp rental charges. Ideas for avoiding such problems next year were discussed, and passed on to the Suttle committee. Tony Parkes' mid-week dance also lost money. PCDC's checking account is now empty. To replenish the coffers, it was decided to change November's benefit dance from a musician's scholarship benefit to a general PCDC benefit. Terri has agreed to contract to PCDC to produce monthly flyers for our dances. Luther Black has asked whether we could put on a special benefit dance for our national organization (CDSS); tentatively scheduled for March, with Luther calling and probably Seattle musicians. PCDC will have a table at November's Masters of the Folk Violin Concert; Dave will coordinate. The New Year's Eve dance (also a PCDC benefit) will be at MAC.
