#### Synopsis of regular dances

Unless stated, all dances are open to everyone—experienced or not, with or without partners, and feature live music. All dances are taught and children are admitted without charge. At any PCDC dance where sit-in musicians are encouraged to play, they will be admitted free.

PCDC First Friday Dance. This contra dance at MAC showcases local and regional callers and dance bands. Cost is \$4.00 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$5.00. If you'd like to call or book a band for this dance, please contact PCDC. Musicians are encouraged to sit in with the hired band, but will not be miked. A beginners' workshop is held at 7:30.

PCDC First Saturday English Country Dance. English Country dance is a source of modern square and contra dance style. This dance is held at FCC. For more information, contact Kate, 727-9607. Cost \$3.00.

Second Saturday Contra Dance, the longest continuously running contra dance in the state is held at MAC. This dance is similar to the first Friday dance, maintaining the tradition. A beginners' workshop is held at 7:30. Cost is \$4.00 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$5.00.

Portland Ceili Society Dance is "a gathering of friends" with lively Irish music, frequently played by world famous musicians. Very aerobic dancing and a full bar are only a few of the notable features of this Third Friday of the month dance, held at Portland Police Athletic Association. Cost \$5.

Third Saturday Contra Dance is a dance series organized by Paul McCullough at FCC, which is just off Barbur Blyd. The dances tend towards the challenging side, and a workshop is available at 7:30 for beginners. Cost is \$4.50.

Third Sunday Vancouver Country Dance and potluck is held at the Marshall Recreation Center. A family evening organized by Evergreen Folkways, the series concentrates on dances of American & Celtic tradition. Sit-in musicians are encouraged. Cost is \$3.

Fourth Saturday Contra Dance is another independent dance series, organized by Moggy Vanderkin. It is held at FCC starting at 8 pm, and has a workshop for beginners starting at 7:30 pm. Cost is \$4.50.

PCDC November Board Minutes. Carla has resigned, as she somewhere found too many more important commitments. No one clse has volunteered to be Secretary-for-Life. The Dusk 'til Done Dance was well-attended and receipts covered expenses. People seemed happy to end at 3:30 am. The hall was echo-y and sloped, though, so next year we might move the dance elsewhere. Dave & Deborah will run a PCDC table/display at the Masters of the Folk Violin concert. New pay policy & admission fee go into effect November 3. New Year's Dance arrangements being made. CDSS Benefit Dance planned for late March, Dick Lewis organizing. Dick & Molly are writing up a history of PCDC. Molly is investigating a workshop for English music-playing; the Board has authorized \$75-\$100 for this. A Waltz Workshop will happen in February, and include a discount toward that night's English Dance.

PCDC December Board Minutes. The benefit dance brought in a useful amount of cash, including \$438 generated by Paul McCullough's challenge matching donation. (THANKS!) English Dances are getting lots of new people, though not quite breaking-even yet. An English Dance Workshop will happen January 14, and a Waltz Workshop February 3. The 2nd Saturday Dance in February will be merged with Stumptown's annual Valentine's Ball. PCDC will help subsidize the next three Stumptown Sunday Afternoon Dances on a trial basis. Feedback from Paul after the benefit dance was discussed; we will run the New Year's Dance a bit more tightly. Ideas for more-organized managing of all our dances were discussed, and will be implemented immediately. Paul will soon start a monthly Callers' Workshop. Suttle Lake '90 staff looks like: contras and squares with Ted Sanella, George, Heather, Clyde; Cajun with Millie Ortego, Blackfish. Richard has agreed to host the Board Meeting in August 1990.
