Synopsis of regular dances

Unless stated, all dances are open to everyone—experienced or not, with or without partners, and feature live music. All dances are taught and children are admitted without charge. At any PCDC dance where sit in musicians are encouraged to play, they will be admitted free.

PCDC First Friday Dance. This contra dance at MAC showcases local and regional callers and dance bands. Cost is \$4.00 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$5.00. If you'd like to call or book a band for this dance, please contact PCDC. Musicians are encouraged to sit in with the hired band, but will not be miked. A beginners' workshop is held at 7:30.

PCDC First Saturday English Country Dance. English Country dance is a source of modern square and contra dance style. This dance is held at FCC. For more information, contact Kate, 727-9607. Cost \$3.00.

Second Saturday Contra Dance, the longest continuously running contra dance in the state is held at MAC. This dance is similar to the first Friday dance, maintaining the tradition. A beginners' workshop is held at 7:30. Cost is \$4.00 for seniors and PCDC members, others \$5.00.

Second Tuesday Contra Dance Series is a dance series for seasoned dancers organized by Paul McCullough at Teamsters' Hall, 1020 NE 3rd. 7:30 - 10:30. Cost is \$4.50.

Portland Ceili Society Dance is "a gathering of friends" with lively Irish

music, frequently played by world famous musicians. Very aerobic dancing and a full bar are only a few of the notable features of this Third Friday of the month dance, held at Portland Police Athletic Association. Cost \$5.

Third Saturday Contra Dance is a dance series organized by Paul McCullough at FCC, which is just off Barbur Blvd. The dances tend towards the challenging side, and a workshop is available at 7:30 for beginners. Cost is \$4.50.

Fourth Saturday Contra Dance is another independent dance series, organized by Moggy Vanderkin. It is held at FCC starting at 8 pm, and has a workshop for beginners starting at 7:30 pm. Cost is \$4.50.


