PCDC September Board Minutes. Spælimenninir is doing a West Coast tour, and have contacted us to set up a dance/concert. George spoke with Norske Runddansere about co-sponsoring this, and three of their board members came to our September meeting. Ideas for increasing Portland's visibility to touring musicians were bandied about. George is proceeding to assemble a master two-year calendar of events. Plans were finalized for the Dusk 'til Done Dance, including two 10th Anniversary cakes. Questions were raised about what objects are appropriate for sale at PCDC events (such as tee shirts or books); this will be discussed at a future meeting.
