PCDC kicks off a busy Fall schedule with its First Friday Dance, September 2. Leading the melée will be always-popular Seattle caller Laura Mé Smith. Her musicians will be the equally-celebrated Clyde Curley, Rick Meyers, and Dave Mount. 8 PM at Multnomah Art Center.

Remember: you can get in free to the First Friday and Second Saturday PCDC dances if you are one of the first two PCDC members arriving at 7 PM to help set up.

If you've got a musical instrument in your closet, take it out and visit one of the monthly jam sessions, open to all ability levels. The first Monday of each month offers the **Old-Time Music Jam Session** at Bill & Nancy Martin's lovely home in Vancouver (206/695-4361). On the second Wednesday you can not only jam but also share a lesson from one of Portland's leading musicians at the **Beginner Music Teaching Session** (call Susan at 503/771-0035).

The PCDC Family Dance returns on September 10. We'll be having one of these the second Saturday of every other month this year, so if you don't yet have a family this might be a good time to get one! Actually, organizer Merilee Karrinvites everyone of every age to show up, with or without hangers-on, for a great time. Merilee will be the caller/teacher in September, with the fantastic music of Seattle sweeties Cathie Whitesides & Hank Bradley. 5-7 PM at MAC. And bring a dish for the potluck dinner, 7-8 PM.

Cathie & Hank will be hanging around after dinner to play for the PCDC Second Saturday Dance of September 10. Hank is one of the founding members of the square and contradance scene in Seattle, though of late he's drifted off into the odd rhythms of Eastern European music. That we are again being treated to his wide-ranging repertoire of American music is partly due to his recent pairing with former Bay Area fiddler Cathie. The Bay Area's loss has been the Northwest's gain, as Cathie (no stranger to 13/8 meters herself) is recognized as one of the best dance fiddlers on the West Coast. For your dancing pleasure, our own Mary Devlin will be directing the traffic patterns at this hot dance. 8 PM at MAC.

Most of Portland's contradance fiends will be out of town the weekend of September 16, at PCDC's Fall Dance & Music Weekend at Suttle Lake. Camp has been full for some time now, but if you have a history of buying winning lottery tickets you might want to check with Norman (503/236-8062) about last-minute cancellations.

Some of the Suttle Lake excitement will be coming back to Portland, though, at a Special Post-Suttle Lake Dance on Monday, September 19. Camp caller Scott Higgs, mandolin/guitar/other-fretted-things wizard Paul Kotapish, and pianist Paul Machlis will be joined by our own master fiddler George Penk for a fantastic night of dance. 8 PM at MAC.

Another out-of-town guest will grace Portland the following weekend. Fried Herman has been a mainstay of the contemporary English country dance scene in New York for decades. She has written some of the most popular modern dances in this genre, and is out on a rare West Coast visit. October 1 brings the annual reawakening of the First Saturday English Country Dance. Portland's longest-playing English band, the NewTonians, will be back to belt out the tunes, this month to the teaching and calling of Dick Lewis. 8 PM at Fulton Community Center.

This seems to be the Fall where Portland has made it to the national dance register! The caller for the October 7 PCDC First Friday Dance will be Santa Barbara's Jonathan Southard. We can't tell you much about him, except that he's good enough to be doing a major Northwest tour. Joining him on-stage will be one of Portland's fastest-rising bands, Twisted Shamrock. 8 PM at MAC.

Salem caller **Todd Silverstein** will arrive the next night at PCDC's **Second Saturday Dance**, Oct. 8. The busy **George Penk** will be joined by cronies **Creighton Lindsay** and **Dennis Rothrock**. Swing Kama Sutra

Thanks to James Williams and Dana Nau (& Internet) for this definitive list of swing position variations.

- 1. Ballroom position.
- 2. Like ballroom position, but grasping the other's fingers rather than their hand.
- Like ballroom position, but holding your partner's forearm rather than their hand.
- 4. Butterfly: like ballroom position, except that the man's left hand and woman's right hand are free
- 5. Like ballroom position, except that the man puts his left arm behind his back, and the woman takes it with her right.
- Nottingham swing: cup partner's right elbow with the right hand (without putting the thumb on the inside of the elbow—that hurts), and join left hands underneath.
- 7. Irish: join right hands with elbows bent, and cup your partner's right elbow with your left hand.
- Northumberland: hold your partner's right shoulder with your right hand. Join left hands underneath.
- Hold your partner's right shoulder with your right hand. Join left hands at face level.
- 10. Hold your partner's right shoulder with your right hand. Join left hands above your heads.
- Hold your partner's right shoulder with your right hand, and your partner's left shoulder with your left hand. Thus your right and left arms are crossed, and so are your partner's.
- 12. Manx: crosshands hold, with arms bent so elbows are together.
- 13. One partner clasps his/her hands together; the other cups hands around those of the first partner. Both partners have elbows bent.
- 14. Man's hands crossed, with woman's hands coming up from underneath to grasp the man's.
- 15. Like above, with roles reversed.

- 16. Woman's hands on the man's shoulders, his hands on her back.
- 17. Both partners hold each other's arms or shoulders (depending on the relative length of the arms), with elbows slightly bent.
- 18. One partner's hands are on the other's back. The other's hands are free.
- 19. Each partner has his/her hands around the other's neck.
- 20. Welsh: right hands on each other's backs, left hands joined underneath.
- 21. Right hands on each other's backs, left hands joined above your heads.
- 22. Tulloch or Hullichan: Stand right shoulder to right shoulder with your partner. Put your left hand behind your back and your right hand behind your partner's back. Take your partner's left hand with your right hand, and your partner's right hand with your left.
- Nose Swing: Link right elbows, with forearms pointing up, and hold your nose with your right hand. Hold left hands underneath.
- 24. Ear-Nose Swing: Like the nose swing, but hold your partner's right ear with your left hand.
- 25. Stand right shoulder to right shoulder with your partner, link right elbows, and take your partner's left hand with your left hand.
- 26. Same as above, but with your left hands behind your backs.
- 27. Back cross: the man puts his left hand behind his back, and the woman takes it with her left. The woman puts her right hand behind her back, and the man takes it with his right.
- 28. Cuddle-up (from a swing dance position of the same name): Start out holding both hands (right in left, left in right). The man raises his left arm and turns the woman under, without letting go of either hand.
