

Dancer Involvement

The PCDC board extends its thanks to each of you who has stayed on at the end of a dance to help put MAC back in order. Because of your participation we have been able to reduce our cleanup time from 45 minutes to 15 for the past few dances!

There are also other, less physical ways to become involved in the organization of our dances. Suppose you have an idea about something you would like to see happen at the dances, or perhaps you have a question or complaint about an aspect of a dance that you didn't like so well. Do you know how to make your voice heard and your opinion count?

For starters, the names and phone numbers of all the board members are provided in each newsletter so that you can get hold of us and tell us what you think. Pick any name and number and give a call. At the very least you can have a discussion with someone who can likely clarify issues and who knows how to instigate changes.

The PCDC board meeting is another avenue available for you and your ideas. Any PCDC member can request that an item be put on the agenda for discussion at a board meeting. You can submit your idea by asking a board member to present it for you at the next meeting, by writing it down in a letter to the board, or by coming to a meeting and presenting it yourself.

The recent Sellwood dances are good examples of the impact that just one person can have on our community. The Sellwood Masonic Temple was discovered by a PCDC member who then got in touch with the board so we could evaluate the hall as a potential dance space. Her ideas and actions have led to three successful dances on the East Side and plans for more.

Finally, even if you don't have an item for the agenda, you are welcome to attend the PCDC board meetings. Again, call any board member to learn details of when and where the meetings will be held. You may participate fully in all discussions, though only board members can vote. Over the past year, it has become the norm for us to have a visitor or two at meetings.

We look forward to seeing and hearing from more of you.

A Web of Folksongs

A recent Seattle Folklore Society Flyer included a short article by Tom Herriman in which he describes a discovery he made while searching for folk music sites on the World Wide Web. Point your browser at http://pubweb.parc.xerox.com/digitrad and you will find

yourself looking at a collection of over 5,000 folksongs! Not only can you get song lists by title and subject—just type in a word and you'll instantly get back a list of all songs that contain that word anywhere in their lyrics or title. And if you want to hear how a song goes, many of them include a simple audio rendition of the melody.

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Book Review

Contra Dance Choreography: A Reflection of Social Change, by Mary McNab Dart

(Garland Publishing, New York, 1995, 271 pages) reviewed by Penn Fix

Mary Dart's new book provides a much wider scope of the contradance world than its title indicates. With this, her Ph.D. dissertation defending her thesis that contradances reflect wider social change and contribute to that change, Dart provides the first scholarly book on the contradance world, its community, its roots and its issues.

A musician and dancer, Dart handles the subject with expert care. Relying on interviews with thirty callers and musicians—including Ted Sannella, Steve Zakon, Gene Hubert, David Kaynor, Tony Parkes, Fred Park and Dan Pearl—she shows that contradancing and its world have changed remarkably in the past forty years. With this change have emerged issues like gender balancing, integrating newcomers, elitism and other concerns. She also details the factors in making a good dance and actual process of composing.

For the dance composer, this study is essential reading. For the caller it is worthwhile reading. And for the dancer it is just fun. At \$70, however, the book is not everyone. But get your library to buy it and then check it out yourself!

PCDC August 11 Board Meeting Minutes (summary). New Board members were welcomed. Tyler was re-elected for another term as Booking Coordinator. Marianne will take over as Treasurer, Barb will continue as Secretary, and Dave as Chair. PCDC will run an ad in the recently-created Oregon Dancer, and mention them in our newsletter. The June Dawn Dance went well. The special dance with Wild Asparagus was wonderfully successful. Merilee has set up every-other-month Family Dances starting in September, and is working to publicize them. PCDC will help sponsor a special English Country Dance and workshop by Fried Herman. It looks like MAC is not going to grant tenancy to any group without a permanent space there, but they will grant us two months per year of free rent, a \$720 savings. Jan is working on an official, detailed outline of door person responsibilities. Barb will try a sign-in sheet and name tags for parents and their children at dances. Some mothers who have expressed an interest in a parent co-op for kids at dances will be invited to a coming Board meeting. The annual question of continuing the Board's financial support but otherwise handsoff policies toward the First Saturday English Country Dance was raised, and after some discussion tabled to a special meeting in two weeks.

PCDC August 23 Special Board Meeting Minutes (summary). Present were nine Board members, three members of the current First Saturday Dance (FSD) planning group, and three other interested PCDC members. Personal stories regarding the FSD were shared; several of those present had had experiences ranging from boredom to feeling unwelcome to going twice and hating English dance as a result (though later coming to love it, after being literally forced by friends to try it elsewhere). Others present were quite surprised by these anecdotes, and felt they were atypical. The dance leaders noted that the consistently high proportion of new dancers to experienced dancers makes picking and teaching dances very challenging, and diminishes the overall energy level for the dancers. Molly prepared a thorough history of English Country Dance (ECD) in Portland, and she and Dick discussed how the ECD community had evolved into PCDC in the late '70's. PCDC, as a member of the national CDSS, has a stated goal of promoting ECD, but the Board's feeling is that the present FSD is actually turning people away from ECD. Some members of the FSD planning group eagerly welcome more involvement from the Board, while others would like to maintain their autonomy. Options considered included: completely severing PCDC's connection to the FSD; continuing to subsidize the FSD without other involvement; and fully adopting the FSD, with Board members doing the door and booking callers and musicians. The Board voted to defeat a motion to continue the status quo. A motion was passed expressing the Board's commitment to support the FSD. A motion was passed to subsidize the FSD for up to \$500 this season. Three Board members offered to attend a meeting with the current FSD planning group and discuss specific changes, including booking a larger variety of callers and musicians. They will report back to the Board at the next regular meeting, where further decisions will be made.

PCDC September Board Meeting Minutes (summary). Recent dances have gone well, including the first Family Dance. Tyler and Dave are exploring the possibility of a band workshop before the December 2nd Saturday Dance. MAC rental rates will again rise in the new year. Anyone with possible alternate dance halls is encouraged to come forward! A brief discussion of how well we handle new memberships ensued; henceforth door people will address, stamp and mail a newsletter whenever someone becomes a new member. The Willamette Pedestrian Coalition requested that one of PCDC's dances serve as a fund-raiser for their organization; the request was denied. Marianne will organize February's Ski-Dance Weekend. Mary Devlin, and possibly Paul McCullough, would like to offer some style workshops/classes; Keith and Mary will assemble a formal proposal. Discussion then returned to the English Country Dance. Several decisions were made. At least one Board member will attend each FSD as a liaison. The success of the series will be measured by attendance, holding onto the core group of dancers, and an improved atmosphere at the dance. Dave will prepare a specific proposal for the next Board meeting, to indicate that PCDC's continuing support is dependent on the Board assuming artistic control of the FSD, the Board reviewing each month's dance just as it now does the two monthly contradances, and the Board being kept apprised of last-minute schedule changes. The '94-'95 season will be a trial period for this new approach.
