



PCDC October Board Meeting Minutes (summary). The post-Suttle Lake Monday night dance was great, but lost money; maybe next year we can make even more announcements. Jinx Davis presented upcoming plans for the Folk Alliance Conference in February. He asked PCDC to sponsor an evening dance at the conference, to be open to the public as well as conference attendees. After discussion the Board agreed to his proposal; Tyler will coordinate with Jinx on the booking. Marianne is assembling the pieces for the Ski-Dance Weekend. Seattle's Pleasure's of Home will lead a set of music workshops prior to their December dance; Sue is coordinating. Tyler is organizing the New Year's Eve benefit dance; we will again provide coffee, which was so popular last year. Tyler will investigate the possibility of snagging Wild Asparagus for a PCDC dance when they're in the region in April. The First Saturday English Dance committee is proceeding as planned. A piano has been donated to MAC; PCDC will submit a written proposal to MAC stating that PCDC will pay for a piano dolly for the stage if MAC will pay for the necessary repairs to the piano. MAC has created a new category, "Friend of MAC," for PCDC, with an accompanying discount on our rental; the discount nearly meets 1995's rental rate increase. This leaves PCDC in the same position it was in last year when the Board was going to increase admission prices, but held off in hopes of becoming an official MAC "tenant." The Board decided to raise admission to \$5 for members, \$6 for non-members, starting January. At the same time, the guaranteed minimum pay to musicians and callers will rise from \$50 to \$70. For the moment there will be no other changes in the way payment shares are calculated; this will be re-evaluated in six months. A group of Zydeco fanatics are going to start a regular dance series in the Spring, with a special kick-off dance in December. They have requested that PCDC make them a \$300 forgivable loan and use of the PCDC mailing list. The Board agreed to a \$200 forgivable loan and one-time use of our mailing labels. PCDC will buy from Annie Johnston her approximately 12 PCDC T-shirts, to be auctioned off at some upcoming event.
