The very successful PCDC Family Dance series resumes on September 14. Series organizer Merilee Karr will lead the party, with the able assistance of George Penk & Heather Pinney. If you don't have any kids of your own, borrow some, or just come by yourself—these dances are a blast! 5 PM at MAC.

If you don't make the Family Dance, you should still come early for the evening dance to join the Inter-dance Potluck Dinner. All comestibles are welcome. 7 PM at MAC.

But make sure to get your digesting done promptly, because Mary Devlin and Moondog will soon have you yelping in joy at the PCDC Second Saturday Dance. 8 PM at MAC.

The next weekend, September 20-22, a lot of your fellow dancers—and hopefully you, too—will be at PCDC's Fall Dance & Music Weekend at Suttle Lake. Afterwards, though, a piece of camp will return to town in the form of a Special Monday Night Post-Suttle Lake Dance, September 23. Portland's own caller with a growing East coast reputation, Mary Devlin, will be joined by present and recent-past left-coasters Peter Barnes, Mary Lea & Ruthie Dornfeld. These three amazing musicians have been involved with surely a dozen or more of the best-known New England

contradance bands of the past two decades, and can be heard on doubtless double that number of tapes and CD's. This will be a rare Portland opportunity to dance to their driving playing. 8 PM at the Sellwood Masonic Temple.

The Sellwood hall will also be the site for October's PCDC First Friday Dance. Everyone who's been there has praised the hall's ambiance and location, and the acoustics get better with each event (as Bill the sound guy figures out the necessary tricks). All of which discussion will hopefully distract you from wondering who will be calling this dance, a detail unknown at press time. But we do know that the band will be Seattle's Hank Bradley & Cathie Whitesides. Most of you have heard Cathie's wonderful fiddling at least a few times over the past couple of years, as she has visited with a variety of California and Puget Sound luminaries. Meanwhile, the old-timers among you will be itching to hear Hank again—one of the founding musicians of the Northwest square and contradance scene, he has been wandering for the past several years among the socket-wrench time signatures of Balkan and Eastern European music (5/8, 9/16, and whatever). Now Cathie's got him back to the contra stage, where he'll try to stick to good old 4/4 and 6/8 most of the night. 8 PM at SMT.

The next evening, October 5, Hank and Cathie will stay in town for a House Concert. They'll feature traditional and original tunes and songs on fiddles, banjo, bouzouki, and guitar. Space will be limited, so to reserve a spot and get directions call 503/231-0205. A music party for all will follow the concert, so bring instruments if you've got 'em. 8 PM.

English country dance fans will get another chance at elegance at the PCDC First Saturday English Country Dance, October 11. Teaching will be Dick Lewis, with George Penk & Heather Pinney providing luscious accompaniment. This is the sort of dancing done in the movie Emma—if you ask Dick very nicely, maybe he'll do one of the dances from the movie (with such great names as "Auretti's Dutch Skipper" and "Mister Beveridge's Maggot"). 8 PM at FCC.

The PCDC Second Saturday Dance of October 12 will feature one of the most popular combo's in all the Northwest: Dave Smith and the Traveling Lundbergs.

Jack and Arvid put out the energy of ten normal musicians, and Dave's percussion playing (while simultaneously calling) adds another megawatt or two. *Plus* they'll be offering an afternoon Music Workshop (see details inside). 8 PM at MAC.

The Magic of English Country Dance

Settlers from England brought their music and dance to this continent in the late 17th and early 18th centuries. With changes in the social scene and the introduction of music and influences from other cultures, English country dancing evolved into what we now know and love as New England contradancing. In fact, English country dance could be considered the great-grandmother of contra and square dancing.

Yet English country dancing continues to occupy a special place in the hearts of many dancers. With its great variety of mood, music, tempo, formation and pattern, this dance tradition captures the imagination and draws the dancer into the sheer joy of movement. From playful and rowdy to elegant and graceful, there is a richness and depth that fascinates and delights.

Figures—some familiar from contra, some not—are woven into a series of patterns that create a whole. Each dance is danced to a specific tune, creating many magic moments where movement and melody intersect—community set to music.

We are fortunate in Portland to have so many opportunities to enjoy this wonderful dance form. The PCDC First Saturday English Dance returns in September after a summer break. The Second Friday English dance has

PCDC Financial Crisis Looms

For the past few years it has been evident to each successive PCDC Board of Directors that finances are becoming more and more of a problem. Dance attendance is down, hall costs are up. Just printing and mailing the newsletter and other flyers costs more than annual membership payments bring in.

The board continues to try to improve attendance by improving publicity, and by scheduling excellent bands and callers. At the same time, cost-cutting efforts have included moving the First Friday dance series from MAC to the much less expensive Sellwood hall, and canceling two traditionally poorly-attended summer dances. Other measures, such as modifying the newsletter to save printing costs, and changing the details of PCDC's pay policy, are currently being worked on.

Despite these ongoing efforts, PCDC's reserves will probably be depleted by the end of this year.

The board continues to pursue new ideas. Although the Sellwood hall is saving us money, it is not necessarily the ideal long-term hall for our Friday dances. And a cheaper alternative to MAC for the Saturday dances would be welcome, as well. The board has a few halls that it is actively investigating, but if you know of any possible alternative venues for our dances, please contact one of the board members.

As individuals, the easiest way for you to help PCDC is by attending more PCDC dances—First Friday, Second Saturday, First Saturday English, and the Family Dance. Bring your friends! Bring strangers, even!

If your PCDC membership will expire soon, consider renewing it early. If it has already expired, please renew right away. And if you aren't a PCDC member, think about joining—your membership payment not only helps PCDC produce its dances, but also supports PCDC-sponsored workshops and other activities that improve the skills of our dancers, musicians and callers. Dues are only \$10 per year for an individual, \$15 for a family. (Inside tip: membership dues are likely to rise in a few months.)

Of course, PCDC always welcomes additional contributions. PCDC is a registered non-profit organization, so any contributions apart from membership dues are tax-deductible.

You're invited to give the board your own suggestions for improving attendance or saving money. Just talk to any board member—or else write your suggestions on the back of a signed check and mail them to PCDC, PO Box 14636, Portland OR 97214.

discussion, the decision was made to hold the dance from September through December, with an evaluation after the November dance to decide whether to continue the series beyond December. In the meantime, ECD will be publicized in the newsletter and elsewhere. The Family Dance will again run every other month, stopping for the summer. After July's Second Saturday Dance, a few people complained to board members about an incident of shocking behavior they observed at the dance. After much discussion, the board decided to write to the individual involved to state that such behavior was not appropriate at our dances, and that any future inappropriate behavior would result in dismissal from the community. Sue has talked with the Traveling Lundbergs about a music workshop prior to their October dance; the board approved this idea. A member's letter pointed out that this year's Suttle Lake dance weekend conflicted with Yom Kippur. After some discussion, the board decided that keeping the date consistent from year to year was important, so this side effect will unfortunately continue to occur every few years.
