### What's a "Good" Dancer?

During a discussion on the newsgroup rec.folk-dancing about the definition of good dancing, David Millstone of Lebanon, New Hampshire posted this comment. Some of you will remember Jack Shimer from his visit to our Suttle Lake camp with his late wife Genevieve in 1989.

I remember my first encounter with Jack Shimer at a dance camp some years ago. I didn't know who he was, but Bob Dalsemer pointed him out to me and said, "Watch how the dancing improves behind him."

It was fascinating. As he progressed down the set, Jack left a visible wake of dancers who were noticeably dancing better and having more fun. You could actually see people perk up, their posture improve, their timing sharpen.

What did he do? I think it was a combination of the joy he brought to dancing combined with being an extraordinarily good dancer himself. He smiled, he laughed, he danced and he was always on time, he always assisted his partner to be in the right place at the right time, he brought the other couple into the dance with winks and nods and smiles and occasionally (perhaps as a last resort?) a gesture. There were no extra twirls to fill spaces left over from rushed-through phrases because there was no rushing. He was having a great time himself and he lifted the spirits of all who encountered him, helping make the entire set dance better. That's good danc-

## **Dancing with Beginners**

As a caller of contra dance I take great joy in what I do. I enjoy seeing dancers get into a groove when the dance feels good and the music feels good and life is smooth. I enjoy the energy passed between the dancers and the musicians in the form of compelling dynamics and exuberant whoops. One of the greatest feelings as a caller is to have dancers who have never danced before enjoy themselves and tell me with huge smiles that they hope to do this contra dance thing... a lot! Of course the caller and musicians play a large part in creating an enjoyable evening for everyone, but of significant importance are the interactions that dancers have with each other.

I believe that this is true especially for beginning dancers. While experienced dancers may be taken in by particular dances that feel great, or by unique and driving sounds from the band, beginner dancers are focusing on where they are supposed to be and what they are supposed to be doing, and are mainly aware of their immediate environment. That environment consists of the floor, their feet, and other dancers. Those of us who have danced for a long time may play the biggest role in whether a beginning dancer comes back for more. If a beginner is treated respectfully and kindly, that beginner will want to return to the next dance. If a beginner is treated otherwise, that is what he or she will remember the following weekend when making plans for Saturday night.

While calling in Portland I have been very happy to observe from the caller's stand an abundance of kind, respectful and helpful treatment of beginners. Start with smiles. A warm smile goes a long way toward making a beginner feel welcome. I see beginners dancing with regular dancers; the best way for anyone to learn to dance. I see experienced dancers helping beginners (and each other) by pointing in an appropriate direction of movement such as during a hey. I see balances and swinging positions being taught during time-outs at the top or bottom of sets. And I see experienced dancers apparently enjoying their evening just a little bit more knowing that they have not only helped a beginner, but their dance community as a whole by ensuring that we will have new enthusiastic dancers joining us in the future.

If you're one who has not yet joined in this essential aspect of our community, try reserving a dance some evening for a beginner. Try an exaggerated gesture to help a beginner understand a dance figure. Try a big, warm smile when a beginner (or any one of us) makes a bonehead mistake, and be obvious about inviting that person back into the flow of the dance.

I have many pages of thoughts on this topic, which I won't share with you here. I just wanted to say that things look pretty good from where I stand between you and the band. Keep it up or join in; whichever fits you. If I were a beginning dancer, I'd want to dance in Portland!



PCDC November Board Meeting Minutes (digest). Two possible halls for 2nd Saturday dances: St. Andrew's and Friendly House. Each has pluses and minuses. The PCDC English series continues to lose money, so as of January it will move to a smaller, less expensive hall. As of January, PCDC membership fees will be raised. A lengthy discussion of musician pay policies led to a decision to continue the current temporary flat fees, and to send out a letter to area musicians outlining PCDC's current financial difficulties and the many steps being taken to remedy these. Sue spoke with Brad Foster and the CDSS Executive Board about our recent "harassment" issues. Brad advised doing nothing about Internet finger-pointing. The other issues regarding various forms of undesirable behavior on and off the dance floor have been under discussion at many dances across the country. Brad's advice regarding off-dance-floor behavior is that the board should not get involved, but should encourage individual dancers to discuss problems with each other. The board reached no decisions on these

PCDC January Board Meeting Minutes (digest). Robert Buchanan will replace Michael Bissell as Assistant Chair. Some local musicians and callers came to discuss PCDC pay policies. A long discussion and airing of views ensued. We will return to the longstanding policy of musicians receiving a share based on the dance's net income, but will lower the guaranteed minimum payment from \$70 to \$55. Bands from out of town will be paid the same, but their travel allowance will be raised by \$5. During the
