Suttle Lake Staff Preview

PCDC's Fall Dance and Music Weekend at Suttle Lake is September 19-21. Applications are available at all Portland dances. See the May-June newsletter for a preview of the rest of the staff.

Princeton, NJ-based Sue Dupré has been an avid dancer and caller for over 18 years. During that time, she has called, perfored, and taught contra and square dances, English country dances, longsword, garland, and molly dancing, couple dances, and Cajun dances, all over the country — quite a talented and versatile individual! At Suttle Lake this year, Sue will be calling and leading workshops on contra and English country dance, including the thrilling workshop "Men in Chains." (Becky Hill has also provided us tantalizing titles for some possible workshops..."Bodacious Beckets," "The Tao of Contra," and "ICan't Get No Smoother Action," to name a few!) Sue and Becky will host callers' tables during Saturday lunch, providing an opportunity for callers, caller-wanna-bes, and interested dancers to discuss the ins and outs, ups and downs, and dos and don'ts of dance calling.

The BAT Band consists of Betsy Branch, Anita Anderson, and Terry Wergeland. Many of us are familiar with Anita's exquisite piano playing from her appearances with Rex Blazer, but she tickles the ivorys with many other Northwest musicians for contra and English dances in Seattle and across the country. Anita's

musical talents also include Scandinavian and do-wop singing (she has sung with the fun Seattle-based swing group, the S-Curves!).

Terry started playing for Seattle contra dances in 1990...at the piano. He took up the accordian to play with a Scottish band and now does most of his contra dance playing on this more mobile, vertical keyboard. Portland dancers (well, at least some of them!) will recall that Terry and the Seattle band Singularity were the high energy music meisters who kept folks on their feet during the 3:30-dawn shift of June's Dusk to Dawn dance. Besides playing for dances, Terry also teaches piano and theory, composes, and is exploring jazz via piano and trumpet.

Betsy played purely classical music until she discovered fiddle tunes in 1994. Since then she has picked up tunes at a fast and furious pace, playing in several contra dance bands in Seattle before moving down to San Francisco where she now plays in several more! Although she mostly plays Irish and other northern tunes, Betsy is enthusiastically branching out into jazz, ragtime, and old time.

When Anita, Terry, and Betsy combine their tremendous musical energy and talent, the result is marvelous! They have thrilled dancers across the West, including the Bear Hug camp in Montana, and will do the same at Suttle Lake. Hope to see YOU there!

Second and Fourth Friday English Country Dance. Run by the Portland English Country Dancers, these two monthly dances feature a variety of callers and musicians. BWT, 8 pm, no beginners' workshop. \$5. (No street shoes allowed at BWT.)

Second Friday Oregon Trail Contradance. A new dance series on the east side drawing enthusiastic beginners. Experienced dancers (esp. men) would be helpful. BVC, 8 pm, \$5. PCDC members with card who join beginner's workshop at 7:30 admitted free.


Fifth Annual English Country Ball is planned for November 15th. Mark your calendars early for this event!

The Portland Collection: Contra Dance Music in the Pacific Northwest

This volume of tunes from the Portland, Oregon repertoire, compiled by Susan Songer with commentary by Clyde Curley, has just been published after 2 and 1/2 years of work! The newsletter editor asked Sue what led her to take on such a monumental endeavor, and what it took to complete this comprehensive work.

"Nearly all of the contra dance musicians in Portland have been involved with this project, some very extensively. It is a book of their music. Many dancers in our community have had a part in the production of this book as well, from graphics, editing, and translation of other languages, to researching recording information. Except for the printing, the entire book was produced by people within PCDC!

"When I began contradancing in 1986, I fell in love with the music as much as the dance. It never occurred to me to try to play the music, though, until three years later when my daughter took up the violin. Since she was learning by the Suzuki method, I was required to learn the instrument along with her. After mastering "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star", I joined the monthly teaching sessions for beginners where I was constantly encouraged and inspired first by George and Clyde and later by Dan. I notated and indexed the tunes that were taught and began selling them to the other members of this group for the copying costs. This music was immensely popular not only among musicians who attended the sessions but with many other musicians from Portland and elsewhere. Many suggested I compile a book. I began playing for dances regularly in 1992. and dropped out of the teaching sessions around then. For years, people still approached me for music.

"Over time, I became aware of the wealth of dance music we have in Portland, with so many fine musicians and bands that play broad repertoires in such diverse styles. I wanted to somehow capture this music (inasmuch as that is possible) so it could be shared more among us as well as with people in other places. I was confident that I could notate the music the way it is played here, and also thought that I had enough organization and persistance to see the project through. Because of the response to my small music collection and because there have been no recent books of contra music published, I thought that there would be general interest in a book of contra dance music.

"Putting all of these thoughts together, I conceived of compiling a tune book based on the repertoires of all the Portland bands and musicians. I asked Clyde, with his many years of experience as a dance musician coupled with his writing ability, if he would like to be involved in the project. He was very enthusiastic about it. We spent a lot of time planning the style, shape, tone, and content for the book. I also surveyed the local musicians who were very willing to contribute both tunes and other knowledge to the book. I received the

promise of an interest free loan from CDSS to help fund printing. So we were off and running.

"First, I interviewed bands and musicians to get titles of their favorite tunes. I removed tunes that had already been printed elsewhere many times, and was left with about 300 titles. Portland musicians provided their versions of these tunes either in print or on tape. I then notated what they had sent me on computer software. I had to determine whether or not each of these tunes was in the public domain. If a tune had been composed within the last 75 years, I had to locate the composer or the composer's estate and obtain permission to print the tune. I had help from many people and organizations (including CDSS) in this phase of the project. When I found a composer, I sent him or her our version of the tune for approval. Most of the composers made corrections on the tunes I sent them wanting the tune printed the way they had written it rather than the way we play it here. Clyde and I also played each of the tunes both individually and together making sure notes and chords were correct (i.e., the way we intended there really is no one "correct" way to play these tunes). We thought about literally every note and chord in the book. When we had questions, we sent the music back to the composer or talked with the Portland musician who gave us the tune. Marianne Kandel edited the music for us, again going over every note and chord.

"We also looked into their histories. We endeavored to learn about each of the tunes from their sources—the composers or other musicians who brought the tune here. Almost all the music played at our local dances has come from somewhere else, so our searches led us to people in all parts of the United States and Canada as well as to many parts of the British Isles. (I haven't counted the number of people we have been in contact with in the course of this project, but I'll bet it's around 250.) We also talked to the musicians who play the music here to get their input on the tunes. Clyde then wrote up all of this information in the commentary. Clyde and I read through and amended the comments many, many times with the editorial help of Barb Tabachnick as well as other Portland musicians.

"Dancers are also represented in *The Portland Collection*. We interviewed dancers at one dance in March asking what they liked about contra dancing, and came away with 80 very enthusiastic responses. The remarks we had space for have greatly enriched the book.

"The Portland Collection was printed just in the nick of time for Folklife where it was well received by both Portlanders and musicians and dancers in other communities. I am now mailing out complimentary copies to the composers in the book and filling orders that have come in by mail. The book will be sold through CDSS and through other mail order companies. With all of this, the music and stories from Portland are now beginning to make their way into the world."

PCDC Board Meeting Minutes, 4/8/97

In attendance: Michael, Ann, Susan L., Susan K, Sue Songer, Ellen, Allen, Robert, Stan, Barb, and visiting Randall Durand. Concerns were raised about completing the dance form and counting cash at the dances, as some serious mistakes have been made. We need to get the form right every week. The mostion was made and passed to have a formal training with the new board, complete a form using a hypothetical band at the next meeting, and Robert will assist door people with the form at the next few dances. St. Andrews will be reevaluating rental policies and fees. Long term renters need to reapply. MAC said we are due for another fee reduction. Living Dance Center has been looked at by board members. It does meet some criteria, but some board members think it is structurally unsafe. Stan will ask Tyler (ex-board member and architect) to look at the LDC. Michael will set up a database of information on halls. All information on any hall should be given to Michael. MAC has already been taken for New Year's Eve, 1998. We need to reserve a hall now for 1998 and for 1999. Dusk to Dawn Dance will be at the Kinton Grange. T-Shirts will be sold at the dance. A sample of the T-shirt will be available at a May dance and orders will be/can be taken. Elections for new board members will take place at the Dusk to Dawn Dance. Eight positions are open.. Ann and Ellen presented a new scholarship policy. Since the bulk of the scholarship money comes from the Kenty dance, the dance will be held sometime in early March, preferably the second Saturday. The PCDC scholarship policy with the changes agreed by the board will be available at the next dance in May. Scholarship money will be available in the summer, and an additional amount in the fall. Mary Devlin requested and was granted a scholarship. Next Meeting: At Susan Kuhn's, May 6, 1997.
