
PCDC Upcoming Dances

PCDC's regular dances in October and November, plus one special dance, will offer dancers five evenings with some of the best music and calling available in the Pacific Northwest contradance scene. This back to back lineup of leading bands and callers features both new and familiar performers from around the region. It's a rare opportunity to experience a rich mix of excellent dance music and calling in a variety of styles, in just two short months. Read the introductions below and plan your dance calendars accordingly; that is: come to all of them!

Starting on Friday, September 4th, the Sybaritic String Band, from Vancouver BC, will bring their high energy contradance music to Portland for the first time. A long-standing group with several previous configurations, SSB has evolved into a leading dance and concert band in the upper Northwest. While playing regularly for dances in Vancouver, they have also played at a number of music festivals and dance camps. Their music draws from many traditions including Irish, French Canadian, Southern Appalachian and Cape Breton, but, as member Rich Sobel has said, "we'll use anything that makes a good dance tune!" Plus, they perform several original pieces composed by member Marilee Jones. Started many years ago by fiddler Brian Hayden, the band includes several multi-talented musicians. Barry Cole plays mostly mandolin but also guitar, banjo, bones and other things. Piano player Marilee Jones doubles on guitar and whistles. And veteran fiddler Rich Sobel can handle mandolin and various rhythm instruments. Their sound is eclectic and unique. When Brian and Rich are both fiddling and on a roll, they sound like three or four fiddlers at once. Taking their name from the ancient Sybarites, known for their dedication to the good life, the band has been known to provide succulent snacks to keep dancers refreshed. We are lucky to have this highly popular and talented dance band play in Portland while on a West Coast tour, SSB's Oregon

promoter and big fan, Woody Lane will be calling and clogging with them through the Northwest. The combination will be unbeatable for a high energy dance to start the Fall dance season.



Sybaritic String Band

On Saturday, September 12th, Portland's own Rose City Aces play with Seattle caller Suzanne Girardot. The Aces consist of Alan Garren on fiddle, Clyde Curley on mandolin, banjo and fiddle, Creighton Lindsay on guitar and Joel Bernstein on concertina and banjo. Suzanne has been calling and teaching dances for many years. This combination of accomplished musicians and a veteran caller is polished by the experience of many collaborations. A well-called Aces dance builds slowly with their old-timey tunes rolling out a steady crescendo of energy that develops to a seamless blend of music and dancing. Suzanne is a dance leader who has mastered timing and phrasing to the point that dancers almost forget they're being prompted. Together they provide the ingredients for a dance that moves dancers not so much by dramatic musical flourishes and complex figures as by a consistent driving flow of well-coordinated music and movement.

Regular Dances

Unless stated, all dances are open to everyone—experienced or not, with or without partners, and feature live music. All dances are taught. PCDC encourages sit-in musicians (unmiked) at regular PCDC dances at the discretion of the hired band and caller.

PCDC First Friday Dance. This contra dance showcases local and regional callers and dance bands. If you'd like to call or book a band for this dance, please contact PCDC. Musicians are encouraged to sit in with the hired band, but will not be miked. SAC, 8 pm, beginners' workshop 7:30 pm. \$7/\$6 for seniors and PCDC members.

PCDC First Saturday English Country Dance. English Country dance is a source of modern square and contra dance style. SBEC, 8 pm, beginners' workshop 7:30 pm. \$6/\$5 seniors and PCDC members.

First Saturday Cats & Dogs Contra-dance. Moondog and various Cat bands alternate months with guest callers. SAC, 8 pm, beginners' workshop 7:30 pm. \$6.

Second and Fourth Friday English Country Dance. Run by the Portland English Country Dancers, these two monthly dances feature a variety of callers and musicians. BWT, 8 pm, no beginners' workshop. \$5. (No street shoes allowed at BWT.)

PCDC Second Saturday Dance, the longest continuously running contra dance in the state. This dance is similar to the first Friday dance. SAC, 8 pm, beginners' workshop 7:30 pm. \$7/\$6 seniors/PCDC members.

Portland Ceili Society Dance is "a gathering of friends" with lively Irish music, frequently played by world famous musicians. Very aerobic dancing and a full bar are only a few of the notable features of this Third Friday of the month dance, held at PPAA. Cost \$6.

Third Saturday Contradance is organized by Paul McCullough. Dances tend towards the challenging side. FCC, 8 pm, beginners' workshop 7:30 pm. \$7.


Then on Monday, September 21st, the Queen City Bulldogs from Seattle will play the annual special Post Suttle Lake dance. For dancers who loved the Aces old-timey playing on the 12th, it's another chance to hear the string band style served up with high energy. For dancers who couldn't make it to PCDC's annual dance camp at Suttle Lake, it's an opportunity to share the fun with one of the camp's top-notch bands before they head home. Also fresh from camp, Portland's nationally-recognized caller Mary Devlin will bring her infectious commitment to high quality dancing and calling back to town. In recent years, the post Suttle dances have become small gems in the early Fall dance season. As a trailer to the weekend event, they're charged with dance camp energy from campers wanting to extend the bliss and musicians wanting to keep the groove going one more day. The dancing and music tend to be very good. With the Bulldogs and Mary, this year promises to be another little marvel. Come catch the secret.

October's First Friday dance, which falls on the second day of the month, features two performers who excel in setting the stage for euphoric dancing. On the special occasions when they team up, George Penk and Creighton Lindsay make the most expressive and danceable music you'll ever hear from a duet. Both veteran folk musicians, George on fiddle and Creighton on guitar combine technical mastery of their instruments with dynamic musical expression to make live folk art. They share an understanding of dancers' needs for rhythmic variety that makes dancing to their music like participating in a musical collaboration. George and Creighton don't play for the dancers, they play with the dancers. With 20 years of fiddling experience and long participation in the folk music community, George is well known in Portland for his driving playing with Jigsaw and Full Circle. Creighton first developed his considerable musical talents as a teenage bluesman in upstate New York and later as a member of the Moosetones and The Ambassadors, well-known New England contradance and concert bands. More recently, living in Corvallis, he has made cajun/zydeco music popular in the Willamette Valley with Blackfish and played for many contradance gigs as one of the best rhythm guitarists around. Don't miss the chance to hear these two talented musicians play together.

As caller, Erik Weberg is a great match for this band. Erik plans his programs with a mind to what the dancers' experience will be. He carefully chooses dances with patterns that fit the tunes to be played. And his clear and welcoming presentation complement the eagerness of George and Creighton's music.

If you'd like to experience contradance music and

calling at its warm-hearted, infectious best, come to this dance.

On Saturday, October 10th, the dynamic Travelling Lundbergs from Spokane will return to Portland with a new member of the band, percussionist Rick Rubin.

Enthusiastically received by dancers throughout the Northwest, the Lundbergs are widely traveled, playing frequently at festivals and camps including recent appearances at New England Folk Festival in Boston, Mass, Folklife Festival, Cascade Contras, and Slugs at Sunrise. The Lundbergs also work regularly with the award-winning Haran Irish Dancers, (traditional Irish stepdancing.)

With Jack on guitar and bouzouki, flute and whistles, Arvid on fiddle, and Rick on drum, this experienced trio plays extremely tight dance music that defines power playing for contra dances.

Jack Lindberg and Arvid Lundin have been playing together since they started performing for the weekly Wednesday night Spokane contradance series 10 years ago. Both professional musicians, Jack ran a music store in Spokane for years and Arvid is a fiddle maker and music teacher. Rick Rubin plays west African djembe and is involved with music on many levels as a guitarist and lute player and expert instrument repairer and restorer.

Veteran caller **Dave Smith** has drummed and called with the Lundbergs since his days as a leader of the Spokane dance community. There they perfected their collaboration into a well-honed contradance program that is widely recognized as one of the most powerful presentations this genre has to offer.

Band and caller are rarely so skilled and powerful. This is the 'Bergs yearly appearance in Portland... Don't miss it!

Notes from PCDC Chair

The dances produced by the Portland Country Dance Community have taken on some new aspects during the past year. Some are obvious, but others are behind-the-scenes, yet just as important. You may have noticed that our first Friday dance series is pegged with variety.

The Scandinavian/Contra (Scantra) and the English/Contra combination dances this year were well-received. PCDC has adopted the Waltz Evening concept from John Benecki and has incorporated it into the Friday dance series.

Tyler has done a terrific job of booking stellar combinations of performers. Any dancer who comes to the new dancer teaching session at 7:30 to participate gets \$1 off admission to the dance. The goal is to improve the teaching session, improve beginners' dancing skills, and ultimately improve everyone's dance experience at PCDC events.

Behind the scenes, we're working as well. Dave Smith led an effort to produce a set of performer guidelines which set a standard for all musicians and callers. The goal of this is to encourage consistent high quality by letting performers know PCDC's expectations in writing when they receive their contracts to perform. And now that PCDC is "in the black", the board has recently voted to raise the guaranteed compensation for performers. As our finances show further signs of stability we hope to raise the guarantees even more to match those of other dance communities.

Your dance community is thriving and working for you. Would you like to volunteer to help out your dance community? We have both one-shot tasks and longer-term commitments to fulfill. An ongoing volunteer need is for folks to pick a date to help open and close a dance and work at the door during the first half of the dance. 

July 15, 1998 Board Meeting Minutes Synopsis: Members Present: Erik Weberg, Randall Durand, Allen Cook, Dave Vogl, Dave Smith, Rob Hoffman. Also Present: Tyler. Terri has asked to resign from doing the newsletter. The statements Dave V. has put out were discussed. The Suttle lake committee (SLC) has made a request for \$350 to cover their "scholarships". Discussion ensued as to scholarships and accounts. The term "scholarship" may be misused here as SLC is giving a discounted entry fee in return for working in the camp. PCDC has two categories of monies, general funds, and scholarship funds. SLC's request was simply to have more money in their account to cover event expenses. Motion: to move \$350 from the boards general funds (not the scholarship account) to SLC's account. Passed unanimously. New Years Eve Dance '98 is scheduled for MAC. MAC is not available for '99. Discussion on where to hold '99. Discussed raising guaranteed minimum to performers. Minimum used to be \$70, is now \$55. Seattle is \$100 to \$150, Eugene is \$60 to \$80. Motion: Change our minimum to \$65. Passed unanimously. Special Newsletter Inserts to promote special dances. John Benecki could do them. Motion: Special expenses for a dance can be included onto that dance worksheet to calculate shares. Passed unanimously. Pre-dance workshop discount will continue. Country Dance and Song Society: The board agreed to paying this year's dues. Motion: include a donation of \$100. Passed unanimously. Post Suttle Lake Dance: discussed whether this dance should pay more than standard shares to performers. The board agreed to just go with new minimum (standard shares.)
