Monday, April 12 1999 Scottish Rite Ballroom

There are several bands on the national contradance scene about whom you might hear, "they're one of the leading contra bands in the country." With Wild Asparagus however, you can leave out "one of." Wild Asparagus has been blowing away contradancers for over 15 years and still generates musical energy and inventiveness as if they had just burst on the scene. Their music is consistently both beautifully played and dynamic. They have mastered the particular art of playing music for a live dance crowd, from gently sneaking into a tune while the walkthrough is still underway, to developing rhythm and tune in a seamless blend that makes dancers wonder why it doesn't always feel so smooth, to building an irresistible drive while maintaining perfect pitch and even tempo, and then ending so gracefully dancers are left thinking "that must be what it feels like to levitate." Many dancers think dancing to Wild Asparagus is as good as it gets.

While they hail from western New England, the contra heartland, the band's members travel far and wide as fulltime professional musicians. Their list of recordings, collaborations, tours and camps would put many popular music stars to shame. All play in a variety of musical configurations, but Wild Asparagus is where their substantial talents have matured and blended to continually push the leading edge of American contradance music. These guys are no vegetables. Ann Percival is the rhythmic core of the band. On keyboard and guitar, she is both the consistent beat setter and a powerhouse rhythm machine with tremendous musical range. She may play melodious harmonies or nearly pure percussion, plus she sings! Her singing waltzes are sublime. Around and through Ann's dynamic music, David Cantieni casts a flood of delightful woodwind notes. He plays a variety of blown things including flute, tin whistle, oboe and saxophone. And when this snake charmer cuts loose on his bombard in the middle of a dance, dancers gasp. Knitting the band's musical magic together is fiddle virtuoso Becky Tracy. Few have the expressive talent and technical mastery with this instrument that Becky does. That she plays so strongly and yet so tightly with her cohorts is a remarkable thing to hear, let alone dance to. Her melodies are clear and sparkling, her rhythmic bowing techniques make your feet fly, her timing is perfect and her musical expression is deep. Becky's playing epitomizes fiddling for dancers. This dance is "stepped" to blend flavors from a harvest barn dance, a folk discotheque and a rock concert into one delightful expenditure of high energy. We've invited Turner and Belshazzar's Feast to offer us a flavor morsel of Ceilidh as well as traditional English Country Dance.

Entree's also will include Contra Caller MARIAN ROSE and five musicians from New York known as GRAND PICNIC. They offer dancers an immense buffet of fun and unusual Contra dances. As a final treat, DAVE MACEMON will introduce the Rapper Sword Dance, to those who still have an appetite for high energy dancing with short, two handled blades!

playing on string and electric base, grounds the band with a solid bottom line and inventive runs. His base is an active participant in the band's amazing improvisational digressions. The dance will be rolling along and suddenly you realize the music has evolved into some jazz-like concoction with just a hint of the straight jig they started with. And finally there's George Marshall, the band's debonair caller, stand -up comic, sit-down concertina and bodhran player and generally bemused spokesperson. Always turning a phrase with economy and wit, George is one of the best callers around. He has mastered the art of getting large groups of people moving together in a variety of directions at just the right time with surprisingly few words. George truly makes dancing seem effortless and inevitable. If you haven't experienced one of his walkthroughs that just glides oh so smoothly into the dance, you're missing one of life's little wonders. With all of this talent and so much experience blending it, Wild Asparagus brings a relaxed expertise to their dance gigs. Not aloof however, they revel in playing to and with the dancers in a collaboration that usually leads to cheers and grins all around.

Previous Wild Asparagus dances in Portland have been knockout events with large crowds and energetic dancing. We're lucky to have them in town again. PCDC has arranged a special hall for the event - the Grand Ballroom at the Scottish Rite Center in downtown Portland at 709 SW 15th Avenue, just west of I-405. With high ceilings, a beautiful wood floor and a grand entry staircase, this should be a fitting site for a very special dance. The street entrance is on SW Morrison between 15th and 16th. Free covered, supervised parking will be available adjacent to the Center with entrances on SW 16th between Morrison and Alder and on Alder between 15th and 16th. The dance starts at 7:30 PM on Monday, April 12 1999. Mark your calendars now and come dance to Wild Asparagus!

March Dances

March starts out with a flair with the long-awaited Contra/Swing Combination Dance on Friday, March 5. Moondog has been polishing their swing repertoire to contrast with their contra creations and will show us their true musical multi-talents. Ben Allbrandt will teach and lead some basic scandinavian dances and call lots of contras in his friendly and personable style.

Then on Saturday, April 10, Elinor Preston will return to the PCDC callers stand with her wide experience from many dance communities around the country and her extensive collection of dances. Accompanying Elinor will be Portland band Scot Free, featuring twin fiddles and a variety of musical influences from scottish to classical.
