AS THE WEATHER COOLS OFF, THE DANCE FLOOR HEATS UP!

MARLIN PROWELL WITH THE CASCADIA FOLK QUARTET (aka Whammadiddle Dingbats!) - September 11, 1999

Marlin Prowell

Marlin hails from Bellingham where he is president of the Bellingham Country Dance Society. He is well known throughout the Northwest, where he has called contradances with some of the top Northwest bands, and has called for dance camps at Slugs at Sunrise, Chehalis, and Vancouver B.C., and recently did a challenging six-dance medly at a dawn dance.

Because Marlin began dancing before he became a caller 10 years ago, he calls dances that he enjoys dancing, which often matches those called by callers Steve Zacon-Anderson, Jim Kitch and Ohio caller Becky Hill.

Although he called in Portland early this year, this will be Marlin's first opportunity to work with the Cascadia Folk Quartet.

Cascadia Folk Quartet

The Cascadia Folk Quartet has never opened for Wayne Newton in Las Vegas, nor played Carnegie Hall in New York City. But from the Pacific Northwest to the Rocky Mountains people in Portland, Seattle, Billings, Tahoe, Yakima, Coos Bay and San Francisco have enjoyed the music of the Cascadia Folk Quartet in concert halls, libraries, grange halls, living rooms, school auditoriums, parks, churches and community centers.

The Musicians

Chip Cohen, who plays five-string electric fiddle and electric bass, lives in Eugene. According to Portland fiddler Dan Compton, "He's the last of the hippie fiddlers!" Aside from playing with the Cascadia Folk Quartet, Chip also plays with the Eugene based Klezmer band Klezmonauts, and the cajun/zydeco band Bayou Cadillac. Chip recently released a CD entitled "Horsehair."

Mick Doherty, who plays hammer dulcimer and string bass, is a founding member of the Whammadiddle Dingbats!, a long-time Northwest favorite. He earns his living as a musician, storyteller, and composer of music for film, video, and theater. Mick has toured the U.S., Canada, Europe and Japan. Based in Portland since 1979, Mick also works with the Oregon Shadow Theatre and the Trail Band.

Lawrence Huntley, who plays hammer dulcimer and electric bass, is also a founding member of Whammadiddle Dingbats! He has played throughout the West for more than ten years, and is author of the little known tour guide "Best of the West Rest Area Tours." He currently splits his time playing for the Cascadia Folk Quartet and the band Bus Stop in Paradise, which has released a self-titled CD of its unique carribean music featuring dulcimer and steel drums.

Kevin Shay Johnson, aka Slim, on guitar, has been singing and playing folk music in the Portland area for twenty years. He released his first recording, "An Anachronism In His Own Time" in the early '80s, and has been active in the singer-songwriter community since that time. He was a member of Western Union, the Epicenter String Band, and Whammadiddle Dingbats!

TOTAL ABANDON - October 1, 1999

Total Abandon, which hails from Olympia features caller Carol Peining; Fiddler Kathy Erlandson; Eric Schlorff on bass and harmonica; David Batts on guitar; and Ann Robinson on the piano. October 1st will be Total Abandon's debut in Portland, and Kathy Erlandson says the group is exicted to have the opportunity to play here.

Since the group formed three years ago, Total Abandon has played for dances in Olympia, Tacoma and Seattle; at the Northwest Folklife Festival, and at the Western Washington Folk Festival. The group's wide repertoire of traditional contemporary music for New England country dancing should make for a pleasurable dance evening.

Carol Peining has been calling contras and squares throughout the Northwest for the past five years. She has gained a reputation as a skilled teacher and caller, and has been invited to call in serveral cities around Washington. Carol is the resident caller for Total Abandon.

KERRY ELKIN, MARK ROBERTS, DAN COMPTON and MARY DEVLIN to play a special dance October 29, 1999

A very special dance evening is being planned by PCDC for October 29th at Fulton Community Center, featuring four very skilled performers. Kerry Elkin, Mark Roberts and Dan Compton will play and local favorite, Mary Devlin will call. Kerry and Mark are travelling from the east coast and have agreed to stop in Portland as part of their tour.

Kerry Elkin, currently from Martha's Vinyard, Massachusetts, is regarded throughout the country as one of the best fiddle players available for contra dancing. His style is strongly melodic and his rhythm is danceably solid. Although he points to Irish dance music as his main influence, he also has an ear for the music of Brittany, Quebec and Cape Breton. Kerry has played for dances for over 20 years and has toured with such well-known groups as Wild Asparagus, Fresh Fish, and Childsplay. He can be heard on many recordings, notably "The Turning of the Tide" and "Soir et Matin".

Mark Roberts, from Providence, Rhode Island, plays flute, banjo, and a host of other instruments; he is a frequent collaborator with Kerry. Mark's amazing versatility and sterling musicianship has allowed him to play in a wide variety of bands, notably Touchstone (with Triona Ni Domhnaill and others), the Clayfoot Strutters (with Pete Sutherland and others), the Red Clay Ramblers, and the newly formed Newgrange (with Sara Blair and Sam Bartlett). Mark can be heard on a host of recordings put out by all of the above.

Dan Compton is known locally as a member of the contradance band Jigsaw. He is also involved in numerous Irish music efforts up and down the I-5 corridor, notably with Randal Bays and Joel Bernstein, a.k.a. the Rashers. Often seen playing fiddle or button accordion, Dan plays guitar with Kerry and Mark. Dan can be heard on Jigsaw's "Cut Up the Floor" as well as his solo recording of guitar music, "Walking in the Neighborhood."

Kerry, Mark, and Dan first met up at the Fiddletunes festival in Port Townsend in 1998 and played for a few concerts and dances there. Since then they've been looking

for a chance to perform together again and Portland is the place.

Portland's own Mary Devlin delights dancers all around the country with flowing contras supported by expert teaching and calling. She's led dance camps from Alaska to Texas and from California to New York, with lots of stops inbetween.
