Anita Anderson, Rex Blazer, and George Penk with Woody Lane - January 7, 2000 at the Multnomah Art Center

Anita Anderson on piano and Rex Blazer on fiddle, have played together for years, producing hard-driving contras and squares at festivals, camps, and dances all over the country. Melding influences from Cape Breton, gospel, French Canadian, Scandinavian, and jazz traditions, they specialize in playing the perfect tune for each dance. Anita and Rex combine the hottest of new contra tunes with traditional melodies, and include an impressive and emotional range of international waltzes dances.

Caller Woody Lane completes the percussive element as he clogs as well as calls. Woody, Anita and Rex have extensively toured the Pacific Northwest and California.

Portland's popular fiddler for 15 years, George Penk will contribute his energy to create a rousing dance evening.

Anita Anderson lives in Seattle, where she is heavily involved in many aspects of music and dance. She plays regularly for contra, English Country and Scandinavian dances, and until two years ago, was a member of the immensely popular 40's/50's singing group the "S" Curves. She has written many dance tunes, and has published a book, "Tunes From the Western Edge," which includes her well-known tune "Bus Stop Reel."

Rex Blazer, who lives in Juneau, Alaska, has been fiddling for 20 years, first through his interest in Bluegrass music, and then for his love of Cape Breton fiddling. He studied in Cape Breton in the 1980's. Known for his "liberal" interpretation of traditional music, Rex has been touring the U.S. for the past 15 years.

Woody Lane has called contras and squares in the Pacific Northwest and across the country for more than 15 years. He enjoys calling smooth, active contras for all levels, as well as adding one or two fast squares to an evening. Woody has been on the staff of a few dance and music camps, including Fiddle Tunes in Spokane, Bear Hug in Montana and Raincoast Ruckus in Vancouver, B.C. Woody is a founding member and performer in a number of clogging teams, and sometimes does step dancing when he calls.

Pleasures of Home with Mary Devlin January 8, 2000 at Fulton Community Center

Seattle band Pleasures of Home brings, as always, its "signature" mix of dance tunes from the Pacific Northwest, Yankee traditional and recent contra tunes, with the musical influences of Northumbrian, Irish, Quebecois, Saskatchewan Metis Canadian, Missouri, and Prairie Canadian.

Stuart and Vivian Williams are two of the region's best fiddlers, capable of the power of paired unison fiddles, or exquisite twin-fiddle harmonies. Vivian recently became the U.S. Old-Time Fiddle Senior Champion. Stuart has long been a field interviewer, scholar, and preserver of the styles of Pacific Northwest Old Time fiddlers.

Phil Williams on guitar, mandolin, and tenor banjo, has more than 30 years experience in American traditional music. He is a founder of the N.W. Folklife Festival.

Phil Katz, who has played melodeons for 16 years and now owns four, specializes in traditional Yankee, Northumbrian, North English, Quebecois, and Newfoundland music.

Seattle Bass Player David Cahn - Besides his 20 years in several bands in the Seattle area, David has often played with Rodney Miller's band around the country, and is on two of the band's CDs "Greasy Coat" and "All-round Collection." David also plays fiddle, mandolin, guitar, and banjo, as well as writes his own tunes.

Portland caller Mary Devlin's infectious spirit makes her a favorite in the Northwest and around the country for contra, square and English country dances. Known for calling "feel good dances" which emphasize great connections, she has garnered a reputation for her explicit teaching, clear, crisp calling and flowing dances.

Mary has called dances and taught workshops throughout the U.S. and Canada, and has appeared numerous times at the New England Folk Festival (NEFFA), Northwest Folklife Festival, and The Alaska Folk Festival. She has toured with some of the finest musicians in the country, such as Seattle band KGB, Larry Unger and Elke Baker, and Rex Blazer and Anita Anderson.

And as anyone who has danced to recorded music will tell you, the experience just can not compare to the thrill of dancing with real warm-blooded tune smiths cranking away up there on stage. Here in Portland some of our finest musicians take part in a monthly session designed to nurture, teach, encourage and direct beginning and intermediate musicians as they work to learn new tunes and refine styles. The sessions are held on the first Wednesday of each month from 7 to 9 pm at the home of Charlie Hartness and Flavia Moshofsky. The teaching is directed primarily toward fiddle players, but other lead instruments are encouraged as well. And the two musicians imparting their skill and wisdom are George Penk and Dan Compton. How have dancers benefited from such an ongoing session? Some of our favorite bands here in Portland first got together at the music sessions. And each new musician or band adds to the musical riches we've come to rely on as dancers. Do you play a fiddle or some other lead instrument? She has recently completed two years of organizing programming for BACDS's English week at Mendocino Camp. Alisa is a past member of the Governing Board of the Country Dance and Song Society.

Under Alisa's knowledgeable artistic direction, and with her effervescent and engaging personality, you won't want to miss what promises to be a rewarding week, full of revelry and play.

Irish Night - February 4, 2000

Be prepared for energetic Irish and contra dances delivered by an eclectic mix of great musicians and callers. Portland musicians Dan Compton and Fran Slefer will be joined by Seattle harmonica and concertina player Joel Bernstein to create some exquisite dance tunes.

Dan Compton, on fiddle, piano and button accordion, is known locally as a member of the contra dance band Jigsaw, but is also involved in numerous Irish music efforts up and down the I-5 corridor, notably with Randal Bays and Joel Bernstein, a.k.a. the Rashers. Dan's interest in fiddle music focuses on the styles of Ireland, Quebec and Appalachia, which are often reflected in many of the tunes he writes. Dan has also recorded CD's: one of his guitar music, entitled "Walking in the Neighborhood;" and one of his fiddle tunes, entitled "The Walk Home."

Fran Slefer, who plays piano, fiddle and button accordion, grew up in Limerick, Ireland. Fran played the piano at an early age, but later explored instruments more commonly used in traditional Irish music, especially the fiddle. Her first fiddle teacher was Maire O'Keefe from Tralee, Co. Kerry, from whom Fran learned a number of Kerry polkas and slides. Fran resumed playing the piano a few years ago, partly by being inspired by the playing of Montreal's Benoit Legault.

Joel Bernstein is one of the best Irish-style musicians around, and a world-class harmonica player. He has been playing since the 1970's, and is a member of the Seattle band The Rashers. Joel has contributed his excellent harmonica and concertina sounds on a recording with Randal Bays entitled "Pig Town Fling," and with Seattle fiddler Ruthie Dornfeld and Keith Murphy on a recording entitled "Ways of the World."

Contra Dance Caller Nan Evans, popular for her warmth and enjoyment of energetic, but flowing dances, has been calling in Portland for 10 years. She has called many dances in the Northwest, and at festivals and camps such as the Northwest Folklife Festival, Lady of the Lake in Coeur d' Elene, and Glen Echo in Washington, D.C. Nan has been dancing for more than 20 years, and draws her sensitivity to dancer's needs from that experience. Nan, also an English country dance teacher and caller, is responsible for spearheading the nationally-popular English Country Dance Ball held annually in Portland.

Set Dance Caller Rick Russell, has been dancing since 1993, when he and his wife Judy went to County Clair in Ireland to learn set dances. Rick calls basic Irish set dances every third Friday at the Portland Police Association hall in southeast Portland. He also coordinates and instructs dances on Monday nights at the Metropolitan Learning Center in northwest Portland. At dances, Rick calls, and Judy helps from the floor. Rick is a member of the Portland Ceili Society.

Ceili Dance Caller Mary Lowes, a member of the Portland Ceili Society since the 1980's, Mary calls and performs ceili dances at the Portland Police Association hall in southeast Portland, and is active in many affiliated Ceili dance activities.

Jigsaw with Mike Richardson - February 12, 2000

Portland band Jigsaw plays traditional folk music from around the world, and specializes in music as lyrical as it is rhythmic. The common thread: it makes you want to dance! Whether they are steaming through Appalachian breakdowns, Quebecois reels or Irish jigs, or tracing the delicate outlines of a French waltz or a Swedish hambo, the members of Jigsaw serve up sound as pleasing to the ear as to the feet.

Fiddler George Penk is well known on the West Coast for his flights of syncopation and melodic play, which simply drives dancers wild. His playing is solidly based on the traditions of New England, Ireland and Scotland, but his personal style is unmistakable and irresistible. He has served on the staff of many dance camps and festivals, including the Festival of American Fiddle Tunes in Port Townsend, Washington. George, along with his wife, Heather Pinney, are members of Jigsaw as well as the English country dance band Full Circle. Heather will not be playing for this dance.

Dan Compton, on fiddle, piano and button accordion, is featured above for the February 4, 2000 Irish and contra dance.

Clyde Curley, besides being a powerhouse on mandolin, octave mandolin and banjo, has a wealth of traditional music stored in his brain and fingers. He has been on the Pacific Northwest folk scene for nearly 30 years, and lending his energy and versatility to groups like the Highwater String Band, the Backstairs Band, and the Rose City Aces — the later of which gives him a continuing forum for his old-time fiddle playing. His mandolin playing is remarkable for its fluidity and punch. Clyde has extensive dance and music camp credentials, including several tours on the staff at the Port Townsend Fiddle Tunes Festival.

Seattle caller Mike Richardson has called and played fiddle since 1985 in the Seattle area as well as in 14 states, two provinces, five shires, two oblasti and four countries. While promoting "no-fault" dancing, Mike has staffed countless dance and music camps, and called at numerous festivals throughout the U.S. and Canada.

Mike calls contras, squares, Irish set dances, French and English country dance, Australian bush dancing and Morris dancing, and has written a number of tunes and dances, some of which are collected in his book, "Crossing the Cascades."

A national board member of the Country Dance and Song Society, Mike also was founding Webmaster for CDSS, the New England Folk Festival Association, and the Northwest Folklife Festival. He was recently hired to teach American dance and fiddle at the prestigious Sidmouth International Festival of Folk Arts in England.

Summary of PCDC meeting on November 3, 1999. Present: Allan Cook, Eliza Romick, Naida Sanchez, Frank Poliat, Rob Hoffman, Betty Woerner, Erik Weberg.

The Suttle Lake Dance Camp financial report was reviewed. Policies and procedures for doing the door at St. Andrew's were reviewed. Allen Cook submitted his resignation from the PCDC board effective Dec. 1. The PCDC family dance was discussed with a vote of support and renewed energy. The contract with MAC for the first Friday dance was reviewed. It was voted to move the second Saturday dance to FCC. The board agreed on a \$50 budget for decorating the hall on Dec. 31. Promotional activities are ongoing.
