# SPRING DANCING IS HERE!

### Suttle Lake Dance Camp — Labor Day 2000

Contra and swing dance, music and singing workshops, hiking, canoeing, great food—yes, it's time to mark your calendar for PCDC's annual Labor Day dance and music weekend at Suttle Lake, September 1-4, 2000. Applications will be appearing at dances and in your mailbox in early May, so be ready!

Joining caller George Marshall and the Hillbillies from Mars, profiled last issue, will be Tom Hinds and Babes in Tuneland.



Tom has been calling for 18 years, and is a frequent staff member at dance camps around the country. This will be his second Oregon visit—long-time Portland dancers have great memories of Tom's workshops and dances at our 1991 Spring Festival. Even if you haven't been dancing that long, you have already enjoyed Tom's

work nevertheless. It is the rare contradance evening that lacks at least one or two of the exciting dances from Tom's four books of original dances.

In addition to New England contras, Tom is a skilled teacher of Appalachian and square dances, as well as ballroom, swing, country western, tap and clogging. At Suttle Lake he will focus on contradance, including workshops for callers. We've also asked him to teach us the secret art of the shim sham.

Babes in Tuneland comprise three of the Northwest's premiere dance musicians. Fiddler Ruthie Dornfeld is known on both coasts (plus Sweden) for her

exciting yet tasteful playing. Her specialties include New England contra tunes and Scandinavian dance melodies. Ruthie's fiddling has been featured on many recordings, including those of Yankee Ingenuity and the American Cafe Orchestra.



Cathie Whitesides is another amazingly versatile fiddler. Whether you're organizing a hot contradance, a Rumanian wedding or an Irish ceilidh, you won't find a better player anywhere. Her recordings include a recent release

with Bob McQuillen and Laurie Andres.

Ginny Snowe was last seen at Suttle Lake five years ago, playing bass for her longtime band Uncle Gizmo. This year she will be drawing instead upon her incredible piano expertise as she accompanies Ruthie and Cathie for hot contras, silky swing, and luscious waltzes.





### PCDC All-Night Dance; June 10-11

The annual PCDC Dusk 'til Dawn dance will take place from the evening of Saturday, June 10 until sun-up on Sunday June 11. The event will again feature four bands and four callers keeping us moving through the wee hours. As with the last several Dusk till Dawn dances, this one will be held at the Kinton Grange with its rural atmosphere and wonderful wood floor. Sometime during the dance PCDC will conduct its annual short-'n-sweet board elections; if you would like to help with dance production as a board member, please speak with Erik at 246-2219. To lead off the evening, Ben Allbrandt will call to the music of Cascadia Folk Quartet. Next we'll hear from Dave Smith and the musical talents of Kathleen Towers, Ellen Hansen, Dave Goldman and Jim Bell. After Midnight, Gordy Euler will be calling with UnLeashed!, and to bring us into the breaking of the day, Hal Mueller will be down from Seattle to call with Full Moon.

A beginner's instruction period will begin at 7:30 with the dance itself getting underway around 8:00. Admission is \$9 for PCDC members and \$10 for non-members. Kinton Grange is located approximately 5 miles west of Hwy. 217 on SW Scholls Ferry Rd., on the right as you're heading west. Take either old or new Scholls Ferry Rd, because they come back together again before you get to the Kinton Grange.

The Grange has asked us to not use black-soled shoes or any shoes that may scratch or mark the wood floor. For those who don't have special dancing shoes we will have mats and brushes at the door for you to use. And when parking your vehicle, please follow the requests of the parking attendants so we can fit as many folks in the parking area as possible.

Through the night there will be a potluck dinner in the basement of the grange so bring a dish to share. High-energy foods and juices are especially appreciated as energy flags during the night. As with all PCDC events, this dance is alcohol and smoke-free.

# May 13 - SWING NIGHT - Dave Smith Calling / Bo Snyder Teaching Swing (At Fulton Community Center)

The Band: Portland musicians Kathleen Towers on fiddle, Dave Goldman on piano, Jim Bell on guitar, and Fred Nussbaum on cello. Kathleen Towers and Dave Goldman are regular members of the band Moondog. Along with Fred Nussbaum, they are also in demand for English Country dances. Fred is a member of the English Country Dance band Full Circle. Guitarist Jim Bell is a member of the band Feline Groovy, and has performed with the Megaband.

Portland Caller Dave Smith's dynamic calling is peppered with frenzy-producing percussion played on various instruments. Dave has been calling since the 1980's on both coasts, and has lived and called in Spokane, Seattle and Portland in the more recent past.

Portland Dancer Bo Snyder made a natural evolution from clogging to contrato swing dancing because of his deep appreciation of dance. He started out 18 years ago as a Stumptown Clogger, and has been involved in the folk dance community since. Bo says "If you know how to dance, you will always have a partner," and for him that is true. He's always danced swing in some form or another, even in a contra line, although he cautions dancers to use good sense and manners to maintain the integrity of the dance. While contra dancers learn about dancing in a set pattern, swing dancing is more challenging because you are given the freedom to make up your own patterns. Bo's been teaching swing for around 10 years. A wood floor and a good band still gets him out there for contra, swing or cajun dancing.

# May 17, 2000 - SPECIAL DANCE WITH DAVID KAYNOR (At Fulton Community Center)

East Coast Caller and Fiddler David Kaynor just returned from his 8th visit to Sweden, where he presented music and dances from the Connecticut River Valley. Music has always been an important part of David's life, as he was exposed to many excellent singers and musicians as a child, and began piano lessons at age six. He played the trumpet in

the school band and sang in school choirs and ensembles as well. His father took him to his first square dance when he was 8 or 9 years old. In college, he began playing guitar and singing folk songs, eventually touring around the southern Maine coast and northern Vermont in the mid-1970's. He took up the fiddle in 1994, and has played in country-rock bar bands, string bands, and contra dance bands, mostly around the Connecticut River Valley. Gradually, David became involved in larger regional and national contra dance scenes. This summer will be his 18th consecutive year on staff at Northern Week at Ashokan and his 6th consecutive year on staff at Contra Dance Musicians' Week at the John C. Campbell Folk School in Brasstown, North Carolina.

The Band: George Penk on fiddle, Sue Songer on piano and Fred Nussbaum on cello. George Penk is a member of the contra band Jigsaw, and along with Fred Nussbaum, is also a member of the English Country band Full Circle. Sue Songer is a member of Portland bands Feline Groovy and Wild Cats.

The Cascadia Folk Quartet is known throughout the Pacific Northwest for its outstanding musicianship and affably warped sense of humor. Several members are alumni of the popular band Whammadiddle Dingbats! These veteran entertainers charm the audience with their warm and energetic stage presence. Chip Cohen on fiddle, vocals, bass and guitar, has been dubbed "The last of the hippie fiddlers," by Portland musician Dan Compton. Mick Doherty on hammer dulcimer and bass, works as a story teller, musician and composer of music for film, video and theater. Lawrence Huntey on hammer dulcimer and bases has worked with the Epicenter String Band and Bus Stop in Paradise, and has released numerous recordings of traditional music. Kevin Shay Johnson, a.k.a. Slim, has been singing and playing folk music in the Portland area for twenty years.

The Band: Fiddler Kathleen Towers whose music ranges from Celtic to classical. Ellen Hansen has been playing fiddle for Scandinavian, Scottish, English and contra dances since 1994. Jeff Kerssen-Griep is a guitar/voice vet of the south Puget Sound bands Contra-diction, Slainte, and the Lunar Moose, and is currently playing with the Celtic band Talisman.

The Band: Guitar/fiddle player Rick Macquoid, has played fiddle in Portland for at least 20 years - as early as the old Stumptown Clogger days at the East Avenue Tavern. Eliza Romick on hammered dulcimer provides a good percussive element. Dave Goldman, is UnLeashed!'s predictably unpredictably pianist. Jocelyn Goodall is a long-time Irish fiddler, who has lived and studied in Ireland.

Caller Gordy Euler is also an accomplished fiddler. His biggest claim to fame is as a member of the prestigious sea

shanty group Shanghaied down the Willamette. Gordy is also past chair of the Portland Folk Life Society. He is a member of the band FullMoon and co-conducts the Megaband.

The Band: Gordy Euler on fiddle. Janet Goulston on concertina and banjo, got started on concertina as a clown in the circus. Dave Hamlin on mandolin, has been with Full Moon since its beginning. He is past chair of PCDC, and also plays tenor banjo. Fran Slefer on piano, also plays fiddle and accordion. She is from Ireland, and has much of her musical roots and training from there.

Caller Hal Mueller, now living in Seattle, started calling with PCDC three years ago. He calls mainly contras, with a few "chestnuts" and squares. He called at the Dusk to Dawn dance last year with the Nettles and at Folklife in Seattle
