Empty pockets keeping you home? The PCDC Scholarship Fund can help!

The PCDC Scholaship Fund is a little-used benefit available to all PCDC members. The Fund, which is supported by the Dean Kenty benefit dance, was established to make grants-in-aid to PCDC members to help defray the cost of attending traditional dance and music events. The requirements are simple: the event must be something from which the member will bring back new knowlege of dance or music. The application procedure is also simple:

- You must apply to the PCDC Board in writing, before the event.
- The board needs at least two weeks to make the decision, and at least a month to guarantee that you'll get a check. (So apply early if your decision to attend depends on receiving a grant, and apply even earlier if you would like the money in advance.)
- Provide an estimate of your total cost of attending the event, including travel, registration, and other expenses.
- -Describe, in a short sentence or two, what you expect to learn and bring back to the community.
- You will probably get the fastest response if you e-mail your application to a board member.

The maximum grant depends on the duration and location of the event: the actual amount depends on available funds. The following table lists maximum grants. (The dividing line between east and west is somewhere around the Mississippi river.)

BETTY'S BIRTHDAY BASH


