A New Northwest Passage!

(PCDC's Labor Day Weekend Dance & Music Camp)

Last year a central Oregon conflagration inspired our lastminute move from Suttle Lake—home to PCDC's Fall dance weekends for more than 20 years—to Camp Namanu in Sandy, Oregon. Everyone enjoyed the new location so much that we've decided to return to Namanu this year, even without a forest fire to motivate us!

Although we still have a sentimental attachment to the name "Suttle Lake," somehow that now seems a less-than-perfect choice for an event 80 miles from our old fishing hole. So we hereby present our camp's new moniker: **Northwest Passage**. (Who'd have guessed the thriving metropolis of Sandy as the site of that elusive goal sought by explorers from Lewis and Clark to Captain George Vancouver?)

The name may be different, but as always this year's camp will feature a choice selection from the country's most exciting callers and musicians. World Beat will meet contra in **The Groovemongers** of western New York, while New England and Seattle will join forces when **Bob McQuillen**, **Cathie Whitesides** and **Laurie Andres** come together as **The Rhythm Rollers**.

Hailing from Ohio and New Hampshire respectively, callers **Kathy Anderson** and **David Millstone** will fill the weekend with smooth contras plus fast-moving squares. Our own **Mark Douglass** will round everything out with his singing workshops.

John Oorthuys will again provide his trademark crystalclear sound reinforcement. And—as goes without saying— **Annie Johnston** remains the only cheft o whom we would consider entrusting our kitchen.

The extra-long Labor Day camp starts with an evening dance on Friday, September 3 and ends in the early afternoon of Monday September 6.

Mark your calendars now, and keep your eyes open for the camp applications that will appear in your mailboxes and at local dances in early May.

And now, on to the staff...

Kathy Anderson, renowned for her flowing contras and fast-moving, exciting squares, has been delighting dancers from Alaska to Florida—not to mention Canada to the Virgin Islands, and Denmark to England—for more than twenty years. What makes her such a popular dance leader? Well,



besides her vast repertoire of fun contras and energetic squares, there's her unstoppable enthusiasm, her quick and clear instruction, and her mischievous sense of humor.

Before teaching herself to call, Kathy started as a musician, playing old-time banjo and piano. No wonder, then, that through both her calling and her dance compositions she loves connecting dancers with the music of all the great bands she gets to work with.

The Groovemongers: What do a Southern old-timey mandolin player, a classical violinist turned fiddler, a pianist rooted in Northern traditions, and a percussionist/didgeridoo player have in common? How about two CDs and a résumé that includes being hired by most of the top dance camps in the U.S.?

The Goovemongers' repertoire spans New England,



Southern, French Canadian, Celtic, klezmer, and ragtime traditions. Their vibrant, high-energy sound blends spontaneous harmonies, improvisation, and lots of rhythm.

C.W. Abbott is the

band's mandolinist extraordinaire—though he's also been known to play guitar, bass, fiddle, pedal steel, and jug. (If the band's car passes you on the way to camp, he'll be the guy at the wheel practicing his mando licks.) Building on his Southern musical roots, C.W. has embraced new styles such as French Canadian reels and Irish jigs with abandon.

After spending many years in the classical world as a pianist and vocalist, **Jane Knoeck** eventually advanced to playing contra piano and accordion. In non-Groovemonger settings she has also been spotted behind a hammered dulcimer. Jane's difficulties in setting musical boundaries will be evident as you find yourself joyously dancing to her weave of French Canadian, jazz, classical, and Latin influences.

Fiddler **Rebecca McCallum** has a reputation for her driving rhythm and the inherent danceability of her playing. You'll also hear plenty of classical precision and tone from all those years growing up as a "violinist." She favors Northern styles in her contra fiddling, but also indulges her Mediterranean roots by playing in a Greek band on the side.

Teilhard Frost's percussion background includes several years playing in the Cuban Son band "Orquesta klave y Kongo," as well as experience with the Canadian old-time dance band Flapjack. In addition to bongos, washboard, dumbek, feet, and countless other percussion instruments, he also plays didgeridoo, harmonica, fiddle, guitar, and flute

Becky Hill is well known for her smooth calling style and wonderful selection of dances. It's no wonder that she keeps getting invited back to the Pacific Northwest to call at our camps!

The dance will be held at the PPAA (Portland Policemans Athletic Association) 618 SE Alder in Portland, with a lesson at 7:00 and the dance starting at 7:30.



Portland Morris Dancing

2003 was a milestone year for Morris dancing in Portland. It marked the 25th anniversary of Portland's first Morris team, Portland Morris. That team, which continued until 1992, was begun by Dick Lewis, Edith Farrar, Robert Reed, and others. In 1993, a new Morris side, Bridgetown Morris Men, was founded and in 2003 celebrated its tenth year with a Morris Ale that gathered teams from up and down the west coast. Finally, in 2003

a men's and women's team, Renegade Rose, blossomed in Portland. With its bells, ribbons, hankies, and lively music, this old English ritual and performance tradition has been going since the Middle Ages. There are more than a hundred teams in the U.S. It's fun, it's aerobic, it's a great entertainment around town. And, there's always room for more dancers. If you'd like to try it, Bridgetown Morris is offering a series of evening workshops in March. If you like to dance, check out this Portland tradition. Bringing together the new and the old, music and dance, the East and the West, old time and New England, and points in-between, the 21st Camp Wannadance will be held March 19 - 21, 2004 at Fort Flagler on Marrowstone Island, WA.
