Danciquette Queries

Q: I can't help but notice that many callers don't use the term "Gypsy" anymore for that move. Why not? And if I may ask a follow-up question, why does each caller have their own name for it? It's very confusing!

A: Ah yes, "the G-word" has become guite the controversial topic over the last couple of years. It was brought to the attention of callers that the term "Gypsy" has a pejorative meaning that could potentially be seen as offensive to people of the Roma (Romani) ethnic group. While callers and dancers did not mean any harm using this term (it has, in fact, positive connotations for many) it is now thought that using a term that designates any group of people especially a term that has been used pejoratively in the past - for a dance move, may not be appropriate. As for your second question, well, that's just us callers having some fun with you. Kidding. It's the folk process: for now, you will hear this move referred to as "right shoulder round," "pixie," "eyes only," "look-see," "gyre," or even "Gypsy," and each term has its proponents and its detractors (it's too long, it sounds too much like the G-word, it "coerces" eye contact, it sounds like a sandwich...) but as yet, none has achieved enough momentum to prevail over all.

The Best Ticket in Town, But at What Cost?

As I sat at the door collecting entrance fees to the dance last Saturday, there were a number of people who commented on what a great deal the admission price was for a dance featuring live music. Our current admission prices are: \$6 for a senior/student, \$7 for PCDC members, and \$9 for the general public. Every admission is also reduced by a



dollar for those who show up before the 7:30 lesson begins. It may come as no surprise that PCDC is losing money on our regular second, fourth and fifth Saturday dances. (First and third Saturday dances are not operated by PCDC.) Over the past 40 PCDC dances we only brought in more money than expenses on three occasions. For two of those three profitable dances the profit was less than twenty dollars. Last Saturday was no exception: at the end of the night we were \$374 in the red. The Contra Dance Committee has been scrutinizing spreadsheets and has identified several trends, some of which we can address to correct our course. This article is an attempt to start a conversation about how best to serve the needs of the entire contra dance community. We will be trying some new approaches, and

encourage all dancers, musicians and callers to weigh in with their thoughts by talking with members of the committee and writing in the comment book at the dances.

It's important to note that PCDC is an entirely volunteer-run organization. The values and goals of the Contra Committee are to provide an excellent dance experience and to support the fine callers and musicians who make our dances possible by providing a decent wage for their work. While we feel we're doing a pretty good job providing an excellent dance experience, there is no doubt that we fall short when it comes to paying a decent rate to the talent. Each musician (up to 4) and the caller is guaranteed \$70 for the night, plus a small stipend for those who travel long distances to get to our dance (\$25 from Seattle for example). If a dance actually makes money above expenses, the profits are divided into shares that are equally distributed among the musicians, the caller and PCDC. For example, if we make \$100 in profit with a three-person band and one caller, the profit shares would be distributed as \$20 for each musician. \$20 for the caller and \$20 for PCDC.

Factors that contribute to financial losses from dances include:

- steadily increasing rent for Fulton Hall
- bands with more musicians
- reduced attendance
- low admission prices

To take these in turn:

- Fulton Hall rental, while going up is still reasonable considering the real estate reality of Portland. We are happy to call Fulton home and in fact would be in quite a pickle without it.
- More musicians in a band often makes for a more dynamic sound and an energetic dance experience and we don't want our pay policies to discourage these larger bands.
- The Contra Committee will be developing outreach and promotion for Saturday dances. If you have energy and ideas to share, please contact us and/or consider joining our efforts on the committee. For the rest of you, start inviting your friends to contra dances!
- It's time to revisit our admission prices. (No one could remember the last time admission was increased as it seemed to be before our time!) We are aware that raising admission prices across the board

may negatively impact the ability of many dedicated dancers to attend. However, recent experimentation with a sliding scale admission policy at special event dances resulted in higher than usual revenue. The September 8th "Then & Now" dance which will be celebrating 40 years of contra dancing in Portland will provide an opportunity to test out sliding scale admission at a regular Saturday dance. Let's dance like it's 1978, but for those who can afford it, pay like it's 2018!

We welcome your thoughts, feedback and volunteer help as we correct our financial course while staying true to the values of our dance community. PCDC Board Meeting Minutes

June 19, 2018. Present: Christine Appleberry, Ric Goldman, Rich Goss, Noah Grunzweig, Sara Munz, Sue Songer.

Opening: The board welcomed Sara Munz as the new ECD Committee Rep.

Secretary's Report: The board will now review outstanding action items from prior meetings to ensure that nothing falls through the cracks. We have received the Oregon CT-12 charitable activities form to fill out for tax year 2017. Insurance certification locations will be updated.

Treasurer's Report: Records for the last fiscal year are being finalized; the organization is moving towards a system where all records will be online.

Chair's Report: The PCDC annual meeting was held on 6/9. Still seeking a Family Dance Rep.

ECD Report: The weekly English dance is breaking even. The recent price increase covered the higher minimum staff payments. This year, the pre-ball dance on Friday will be at Pioneer Community Center in Oregon City. Starting in 2019, both the Friday pre-ball dance and the ball itself will be held in October at Oaks Park.

Contra Committee: PCDC and non-PCDC organizers met to work on issues affecting all series. They will poll the community about behavior issues, caller and band feedback, experience on the floor and more. The committee is considering switching to a sliding-scale admission similar to what Corvallis uses. Plans for the annual picnic are going well and a bigger turnout than last year is expected.

Raindance Report: 2019 talent will be Wild Asparagus and Tidal Wave, with callers George Marshall and Will Mentor.

Northwest Passage Report: still not sure whether 2019 will be Contra or ECD. The committee will approach talent that can do either/both.

Grants: 1 approved; 1 in process.

Membership: Numbers are holding steady

New Business: Possible topics for next month's strategic meeting were discussed. It was decided that Ric's "At a Glance" flyer will include non-PCDC activities in the local Portland area. The search for hardcopy archival history of PCDC for the new online repository continues.

July 17, 2018. Present: Christine Appleberry, Ric Goldman, Rich Goss, Noah Grunzweig, David Macemon, Sara Munz, Jaydra Perfetti.

Opening: The board welcomed David Macemon as the new Family Dance Rep.

Strategic Goal Discussion – Individual Grants: The board decided to revise the current policy on individual grants from PCDC. The new proposal states:

- Annual budget for grants will be capped at \$3,000 per fiscal year.
- The policy of grants not being need-based will continue. Grants are intended to support the local community by bringing out-of-towners to our events, and to improve the skills of our members through their participation in out-of-town events.

[The new policy will close a loophole that allowed out-of-towners to join PCDC and then apply for a grant to attend any dance camp, anywhere.]

- Grant applicants will now be asked 1) how they participate in the community (for example, performing door duty, serving on a committee, etc.) 2) what they expect to get out of the event and 3) how their attendance would benefit our community.
- Applicants must be a member in good standing for 6 months or have lapsed within the last 3 months and brought their membership up to date. Only 1 grant per person per rolling 12 months.

The new policy is being reviewed for a final vote at the next meeting.

Strategic Goal Discussion – Organizational Grants: For now, these will continue to be examined on a case-by-case basis, as PCDC needs to reserve funds for local hall search/retention issues, such as for Fulton Park.


