Are You in Tune with the Contra Pulse?


From Kathy Story

Farewell Dear Rick

March 18th, 1952 – October 12th, 2022

Rick Piel played piano and fiddle, and danced English and contra. He was involved in many aspects of the work and organization of music and dance in Portland (and Austin, before he moved to Portland in 2005). He played in the band Unleashed, and was also in the Megaband. He was Treasurer on the North West Passage committee. For years, he was the PCDC webmaster and kept the online calendar of events. He sent out notices of dances and jams. For eight years he did all the shipping of the Portland Collection books and CDs, and the David Kaynor book.

Besides dancing, Rick loved to read and watch movies. He was in at least one book group. He got together with another group of friends once a week to play pinochle. He loved to sing, and he was a runner and walker.

One fellow dancer says "He was incredibly thoughtful and respectful. I know he worked hard to be a good person. He also gave amazing hugs."

BOARD MEETING SUMMARY—SEPTEMBER

COVID Updates: The Board moved to allow ECD's indoor policy change to allow having snacks in the hall basement during the break.

Portland Contra: The August 30, 2022 dance was cancelled due to weather. Committee may develop policies for doing this in the future. The contra-announce email list is getting regular use. The New Year's Eve dance will be at Fulton and folks are working on party favors. There will be a George Marshall event in November at Norse Hall. An event is being planned to honor Kim and Christine Appleberry, likely around December 3rd . Megaband has its rehearsal schedule set, but at Ip-3p (earlier) due to hall availability.

ECD & Ball: The 2nd Sunday advanced series will restart depending on band/caller availability. The Ball has 76 registrants and will definitely happen.

Northwest Passage: Camp was very successful with 88 out of 91 registered campers attending. Program was well received and evaluations were strongly positive except for some food/kitchen issues, which we're working on with Kiwanis. Folks indicated appreciation of our Covid measures and no positive test were reported. Next year's callers are Brad Foster and Orly Krasner. The bands are Goldcrest and Fine Companions. Committee is down to 4 members and needs new volunteers in order for camp to continue.

Hillsboro Contra: Series looking for a potential start in spring, 2023.

Grants: I new grant was approved.

Membership: Counts are up 1 for the month and up 69 compared to last year.

Community Values: The taskforce circulated a draft statement of mission, vision, values, and goals & objectives for PCDC. After getting Board feedback and suggestions, the draft will go to committees and PCDC membership for additional comment. The taskforce is now working on a bylaw's revision as well.

Oversite of Committees: The Board has begun discussions on better ways to deal with "bad situations", setting new policies, and interactions between the Board and Committees, and better financial controls.

BOARD MEETING SUMMARY—OCTOBER

Safety Procedures: The Board discussed recent behavior incidents at dances and has passed procedural changes to the Safety Taskforce to help committee members respond to issues more quickly and effectively.

Logo task force: The group is looking into new possible stationary, graphics, and marketing materials.

Covid Policies: The Board conducted an online survey of members and event attendees, to get a sense of the community in terms of continuing masks and vaccination verification. A sizeable majority of respondents stated they are more likely to attend dances if the current Covid protocols remain in place. Meanwhile, the Board accepted a request from the Portland Contra and an event planning committee to revise our indoor policy, so PCDC will now allow snacks and drinks in designated areas apart from the dance floor.

Special Event: A party for Christine and Kim Appleberry is being planned for December 3 rd . More details to come. The Board authorized a budget of \$350 for the event.

Portland Contra: At the last dance, a sign went up about Rick Piel's passing. Many were shocked and all were sad at the news. Rich Goss made a special announcement at the dance, and an open chair was left for Rick at the open band/open mic night. George Marshall will hold an event in Portland on November 15.

SECOND THURSDAY TUNES TEACHING

The Second Thursday Tunes Teaching sessions are in full swing once again! Taught by well-known fiddlers George Penk and Betsy Branch, who we see regularly on the stage, these sessions have been ongoing for decades and have been the backbone of many local Portland contra bands. Tunes are taught by ear. All melody instruments and any level of musicianship are welcome. The traditional folk style of teaching by ear also helps us pick up new tunes more easily at jam sessions.
