Cascade Promenade and Portland Roadhouse just around corner

The week leading up to the Portland Megaband Dance on March 8 offers a unique dance experience called Cascade Promenade (cascadepromenade.org). Cascade Promenade links together dance events up and down the I-5 corridor from Eugene to Bellingham. Dancers pick up a passport at one of the dances (or print it from the website) and get it "stamped" at the dances they attend. At the final event, the Portland Roadhouse Dance on March 9, dancers turn in their passports for either an Iron Dancer ribbon (for dancers who attend 4 or 5 dances) or a Titanium Dancer ribbon (for dancers who attend 6 or more dances).

The Portland Roadhouse Dance (<u>portlandroadhouse.org</u>) is the traditional final event of Cascade Promenade and a benefit for Northwest Folklife Festival in Seattle. This year's event features five bands and five callers. Here are more details:

Spring is in the air, which means it's time to start thinking about your end-of-summer plans!

A wonderful way to wrap up the summer is to attend PCDC's Northwest Passage English Country Dance Camp on Labor Day weekend. The event is held at the Mt. Hood Kiwanis Camp, where the days are warm, the evenings cool, and the scenery spectacular. Enjoy three evening dances, two full days of workshops, two concerts, and a final dance party on Monday before heading home.

Northwest Passage is known for friendly dancers, a high level of dancing, great callers, and out-of-this-world music. This year will be no exception. Our featured callers are Brooke Friendly (OR) and Jenny Beer (PA). We are pleased to bring back Roguery (CA/WA), who last appeared together at NWP in 2012, and to introduce Idlewild (OK, TX, NM). John Oorthuys, our camp sound engineer for years and years, will return and use his wizardry to make the sound fantastic.

While primarily focused on English Country dance, workshop offerings include a musician's track, singing, calling workshops, and, new this year, gentle yoga led by Caroline Klug. Caroline will also lead morning stretches for those who want to join in. Concerts and musical workshops highlight the many talents of our staff in addition to their ECD prowess.

Brooke Friendly, caller

Brooke Friendly is known for her warm, yet commanding, personality; her clear and concise teaching; her creativity; and her sense of whimsy. A dancer for more than 40 years, she teaches English Country dance and community dance using global/positional language. While she hails from Ashland, Oregon, Brooke has been on staff at weeklong dance and music camps, weekends, festivals, and events throughout North America, England, and Australia. She has led numerous workshops for callers, including online courses, using a balance of engaging material, lively discussions, and interesting exercises. Also a dance choreographer, Brooke, in collaboration with Chris Sackett, has published six books of dances (Impropriety Vols. 1–6) and produced seven CDs with the band Roguery.

Jenny Beer, caller

Jenny Beer calls Philadelphia her home dance community. She leads English Country dancing and occasionally Scottish and contra. A joyful caller, she strives to give everyone in the hall a good time—the long-time dancers, the musicians, the now-and-then dancers, those with high energy, those who are feeling less spry, those eager to experience new dances, and those who love old favorites. Post-pandemic, she has started a new community contra dance series that mentors callers and musicians, as well as an afternoon "Gentle English" dance. And, yes, she crafts a new dance now and again and will bring some of those with her to Northwest Passage!

Roguery

Roguery (Anita Anderson, piano; Dave Bartley, mandolin, cittern, guitar; Shira Kammen, violin; Jim Oakden, clarinet, mandolin, recorders, whistles, and more) formed in 2008 to record Impropriety, an album to go with Brooke Friendly and Chris Sackett's first volume of dances. Since then, they have met in Oregon's Rogue Valley to record six more albums. The band's varied influences include English, contra, early music, classical, Breton, Scottish, Irish, Cape Breton, Galician, French, Balkan, jazz-fusion, gospel, Scandinavian, and Greek.

Idlewild

Idlewild is the Southwest's newest English Country and contra dance band featuring the joyous melodic fancies of Mirinisa Stewart-Tengco (violin) and the rowdy grooves of multi-instrumentalists Clara Byom (clarinet, accordion, bass clarinet, piano) and Jacob Chen (piano, accordion, fiddle). Originally united in March of 2024 for "one night only," this playful trio brings together The Parson Sisters from New Mexico and Jacob Chen from Oklahoma. Whether playing for an elegant English Country dance or a rowdy contra, dancers are captivated by Idlewild's ever-changing instrumentation, whimsy, and spontaneity.
