Suttle Lake Dance Camp--Labor Day 2003

What should you expect at this year's Suttle Lake Dance & Music Camp? Wild contra dances and smooth English country dances—plus rowdy English dances and flowing contras! Music so exciting you'll dance with abandon--along with music so gorgeous you may abandon dancing, just to listen! And, of course, a great lakeside holiday amongst the trees of the Oregon Cascades.

This year we have the extraordinary fortune of dancing to two of the country's best callers: **Glen Morningstar** and **Joseph Pimentel**, each an expert at enhancing dancers' enjoyment of both the contra and English forms.

Our amazingly versatile bands hail from opposite sides of the nation: **Goldcrest** from the southeast and **Claude Ginsburg**, **Liz Dreisbach**, and **Chuck Ward** from the west.

Portland's favorite sound-shaper, **John Oorthuys**, will be running the mixing board. And it wouldn't be Suttle Lake without **Annie Johnston** orchestrating the kitchen.

The extra-long Labor Day camp starts with an evening dance on Friday, August 29 and ends in the early afternoon of Monday, September 1.

Mark your calendars now, and keep your eyes open for the camp applications that will appear in your mailboxes and at local dances in early May.

Goldcrest combines three seasoned musicians of national reputation, steeped in the folk dance traditions of Appalachia, New England, and the British Isles. Fiddler Daron Douglas, pianist Dave Wiesler, and multi-instrumentalist Paul Oorts play English, contra, and couples dance music of exceptional quality and unsurpassed variety.

The dance fiddling of Daron Douglas reflects her traditional Appalachian upbringing—she also thanks her grandmother for the gift of her ballads (and her gardening preoccupation). She has played with the Knoxville Early Music Project, the Hominy, and the contra dance



band Misbehavin'. Daron has been on the staff of numerous national dance camps and of the John C. Campbell Folk School in Brasstown, N.C. She now lives and plays music in New Orleans.

For nearly a decade Dave Wiesler has been building a

national reputation for his rhythmic and innovative piano playing. At home in a huge range of styles, Dave plays for concerts and dances of every kind: contra, swing, vintage, couple dance, English and Scottish country dance. He has performed at the Kennedy Center, the Washington Folk-Life Festival, the Honolulu Academy of Arts, and the Smithsonian Museum, plus festivals and dance



camps across the U.S.A., Canada, Scotland, and England. Dave has several recent recordings to his credit, many featuring tunes and songs he wrote, and is also a capable guitarist and singer. His other bands include Laura and the Lava Lamps, Cabaret Sauvignon, The Avant Gardeners, and The Gigmeisters. Dave presently lives in Charlottesville, VA.

Multi-talented Paul Oorts performs nationally on classical guitar with New York dulcimer player Steve

Schneider, with whom he made the highly acclaimed recording, 'Momentum.' He often plays in duo on steel-string guitar and Irish bouzouki with his wife, Karen Ashbrook, with whom he has recorded a CD, 'Celtic Café.' When not backing up dulcimers, Paul plays mandolin, tenor banjo, and musette accordeon in D.C. area contra



dance bands Cabaret Sauvignon, Martin's Flight, and The Gigmeisters. Paul teaches part-time for the Humanities department of the Peabody Conservatory and has been on the faculty of Common Ground, the Swannanoa Gathering, and the Augusta Heritage Center. Hailing

originally from Belgium, Paul is also an accomplished and knowledgeable player of Flemish and French folk music.

At Suttle Lake Goldcrest will play for contra and English dances. Daron, Dave, and Paul will also lead as many instrument, vocal, and band workshops as we can fit into the schedule!

Joseph Pimentel has been contra dancing and calling (in New England, Jordan, Egypt, Michigan, and these days Columbus, Ohio) for almost twenty years. At home he is an active organizer of the local dances, and the leader of a fun and successful series of dance workshops. All around the country, dance camps welcome Joseph for his skillful, charismatic leadership and infectiously joyful calling and teaching of both contra and English country dance.



At our camp, Joseph will be leading workshops designed to help you discover more of the bliss possible in every dance, and ways you can promote that joy with future dance partners.

Megaband Is Mega Now!

Some claim that the Portland Megaband is the largest contra dance band in the universe. Maybe so, maybe not. But nobody can dispute the fact that with more than 70 musicians, the Megaband is a huge contra dance band, which year after year has generated huge enthusiasm among dancers from all around the Northwest. This year, the annual Portland Megaband dance will be held on **Saturday March 8th** at the Smith Memorial Ballroom at Portland State University, 1825 SW Broadway, Portland. There is free parking in Structures 1 and 2 across the street. The dance starts at 8:00 with teaching for newcomers at 7:30. Admission price is \$9 for PCDC members, \$10 for nonmembers, and \$7 for students and seniors. Erik Weberg will call. This is a benefit dance, and all proceeds go to the PCDC scholarship fund for PCDC members who wish to attend dance or music camps.

For Budding Dance Musicians...

If you have ever considered learning to play contra dance music either as a newcomer to a musical instrument or as a newcomer to this style of music, drop in on the First Wednesday teaching sessions taught by contra dance musicians George Penk and Dan Compton. George and Dan have played for contra dances in Portland for more than 20 years and teach all the tricks of the trade. Usually, two contra dance tunes are taught by ear.

Stylistic pointers are given, and some time is spent playing as a group. It is an intimate, safe setting to learn about dance music and explore musical interests. Atlantic Crossing To Pacific NW

On **Saturday March 22** PCDC is fortunate to have New England band Atlantic Crossing. Atlantic Crossing performs songs and instrumental music of New England, Quebec, Maritime Canada, and the British Isles, as well as original material inspired by these musical traditions. The band's arrangements feature rich harmonies and driving rhythms, showing a deep love for the tradition along with



a high level of creativity, emotional expression, and just plain fun. Atlantic Crossing has appeared at numerous festivals, concert series and workshops. They have been featured on Ver-

mont Public Radio, and have toured in the U.S. and in England. A high energy contra dance band, they have been invited to play at some of the major dance series in the U.S., including Boston, Washington DC, and Seattle. Brian Perkins (bouzouki, tenor banjo, mandolin, feet, vocals) is a versatile performer, music teacher and sound technician, as well as director of Burlington's popular Celtic College workshop series.

Rick Klein (guitar, vocals) developed his powerful rhythm playing through years of work in dance bands of all types. A licensed skipper who has lived and worked on the sea, he has a natural affinity for maritime music.

Viveka Fox (fiddle, bodhran) has played American, Scottish and Irish music since childhood, and especially loves the music of Cape Breton for its Gaelic soul and North American exuberance. Her solo recording Shores of Champlain was released in 1993.

Peter Macfarlane (fiddle, vocals) joins us seasonally from Oxfordshire, U.K. where he plays regularly for dances, weddings and other events throughout southern England. For 10 years, he organized and led the Aylesbury Fiddle Rally, an annual fiddler's gathering.

Joining them as caller will be that man with effervescent feet, known for his dance enthusiasm, his energetic squares, and (of course) for his elegant contras, **Woody Lane**.

Nightingale To Roost In Portland

PCDC was able to snag the incredible dance band Nightingale for an evening of dance (and perhaps song) on **Thursday April 10**! This is a special treat that you do NOT want to miss out on. Note that the starting times are a half hour earlier than usual, with a teaching session at 7:00 and dancing at 7:30.

Nightingale is a Vermont-based trio consisting of **Becky Tracy** (fiddle), **Keith Murphy** (piano, guitar, foot percussion, vocals), and **Jeremiah McLane** (piano, accordion). Their music travels through Quebec, Newfound-



land, Ireland, F r a n c e , Scandinavia and beyond to produce a blend of Northern music that is unique and compelling. With a core of fiddle, accordion and gui-

tar and the unrelenting rhythm of French Canadian foot percussion, Nightingale moves easily from carefully woven song arrangements to driving instrumentals. The group has consistently won the enthusiasm of contra dancers and has appeared with many of the country's finest dance callers (including Steve Zakon, Lisa Greenleaf, George Marshall, Mary Desrosiers and Tony Parkes). In concert, Nightingale displays an amazing versatility through creative new arrangements of traditional songs and instrumentals. Their debut recording, 'The Coming Dawn', captured the spirit and beauty of this sound and has received growing critical acclaim throughout the American traditional music world. Their second recording, 'Sometimes When the Moon is High' was produced by Grey Larsen and is a fitting sequel to 'The Coming Dawn' - more of their seamless arrangements tying together a dazzling variety of material. The combination of these three musicians is not to be missed.

Of course, to make the evening complete we have the sweet calling of **Mary Devlin**, CDSS president elect (but more on that next issue) to help make it a night to remember.
