Cascade Contra Camp

The ninth annual Cascade Contras dance and music camp will take place **April 2-4, 2004**. As usual it will be held at the ever popular Sky Camp, 45 minutes southeast of Eugene. This year the camp will focus on contras, with swing and blues dancing, plus instrumental and singing workshops.

The featured band this year is **Reckless Ramblers**, with Nat Hewitt on fiddle and guitar, Larry Unger on various guitars and banjos, Sam Bartlett on mandolin and tenor banjo, and Ginny Snowe on upright bass. The caller with this great band will be **Becky Hill**, of Cleveland, OH. Becky is known for her smooth calling style and wonderful selection of dances.

Playing get-down blues and pump-it-up swing for workshops and dancing will be **Blue Moon** from Eugene, OR. A novelty swing band with a bluesy edge, Blue Moon features Judith Rhys on vocals and bass, Guss Russell on keyboard, Michael Anderson on bass and guitar, Jerry Gleason on guitar, bass and pedal steel, and Jim Reinking on drums.

Rounding out the weekend will be delectable dining provided by **Annie Johnston**, and sound engineering by **Warren Argo**.

The price of the camp is: If application is postmarked by February 15, \$155/adult (9+ years), plus \$75 for each child 2 to 8 years of age. If after, the price is \$165/adult, plus \$80 for each child. Children under two years have free admission, but they must be registered regardless.

A lottery will be held for applications postmarked by **January 19** if the number of applicants exceeds the number of openings at the camp. Results will be mailed to everyone by February 15.

Flying With the O'Carolans

Based in the mid-Willamette Valley, The Flying O'Carolan Brothers are multi-instrumentalists and singers who bring wide-ranging influences. You could run into any or all at Irish pub music sessions. Just as likely, you'll hear some of them playing swing, or bluegrass, or Brazilian choro. They have variously shared the stage or studio with the likes of Kevin Burke, David Grisman, Bill Monroe, and Riders in the Sky. The Flying O'Carolan Brothers play dances, concert halls, house parties and colleges from Ashland to Seattle.

Brother Roy Rowland is the go-to fiddler for the O'Carolans; He also plays mandolin and tenor guitar. Brad Johnson's concertina kicks the melodic energy up a notch; Brad also picks up the guitar from time to time. Jon Neff's resophonic bass or rhythm guitar is the foundation we build upon. Tim Crosby has a banjo and is not afraid to use it. Todd Silverstein completes the circle with his wealth of tunes and songs on bouzouki, penny whistle, and saxophone; Todd is also a highly sought-after contra-dance caller (so if you've just gotta dance, it can be done).

On Saturday **February 14** the Flying O'Carolan Brothers will be playing for the PCDC contra dance, with Todd Silverstein and Brad Johnson tag-teaming as callers.

A genealogical note: Turlough O'Carolan (1670-1738), famed blind harper and composer, is arguably the single most influential Irish musician of all time (Bono notwithstanding). We like to believe that we are the direct descendants of Turlough's beloved nephew Harpo O'Carolan. (Other descendants of this family line in the early 20th century were notorious Marxists.)
