NW Passage Dance Camp 2005

When the newly-created PCDC held its first weekend of contra and English country dance in 1981, who would have predicted the resulting twenty-five year unbroken run of dance nirvana?

In celebration of our amazing success, this year we're throwing restraint (and our budget) to the wind, bringing to Oregon two big-name, high-energy, riotously fun contra dance bands, plus two renowned, enthusiastic, funny contra callers—all from the other side of the continent!

From New England: **Airdance**, one of the country's most in-demand contra bands. From Ontario: **Flapjack**—*another* country's most in-demand contra band. From North Carolina: **Beth Molaro**, wildly popular caller. And from Boston: **Rick Mohr**—caller, dance author, musician and composer. But wait, there's *more*...

Outstanding Portland singing leader **Mark Douglass**. Totally awesome chef, baker, and all-around wrangler of

comestibles, **Annie Johnston**. And, in a special (re)appearance for this special occasion, Seattle sound impresario **Warren Argo**.

As usual, our Labor Day camp starts with an evening dance on Friday, September 2, and ends in the early afternoon of Monday, September 5.

The budgetary distention caused by all these cross-country airfares and big bands will require a small increase in this year's admission price, from last year's \$199 to \$215. That's right—for an additional cost equal to that of just one CD, you'll be part of a dance weekend that will be the talk of the century! Application forms should be available in May.

Mark your calendars now, and keep your eyes open for the camp applications that will appear in your mailboxes and at local dances in early May.

Rick Mohr has been calling, dancing, choreographing, singing and fiddling for almost twenty years. His crystal-clear calling and well-paced teaching, his compelling dance repertoire, and his warmth and humor have made him a coast-to-coast favorite. Rick's many other accomplishments include

the composition of both dances and tunes, many of which are performed throughout the country, plus an extensive career dancing and teaching Morris and rapper.

Remember those great musical supergroups? Cream? Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young? Bands whose members all brought stellar reputations from their former groups, joined together in synergistic triumph? In the contra universe, the supergroup of supergroups is **Airdance**.

Since its formation in 2000, Airdance has played at festivals, concerts, dances and camps throughout the U.S. and abroad. Fiddler **Rodney Miller** leads



the band with his unique blend of traditional New England fiddling with his own virtuoso swing, jazz and other diverse influences. Honored by the National Endowment for the

Arts as a "Master Fiddler," Rodney is also a famed violin maker.

Mary Cay Brass has been playing contra dance piano and accordion for twenty years. Her solid yet wonderfully varied style, with its exuberant Irish drones and French-Canadian swing, provides Airdance's rhythmic and harmonic foundation. She's joined by longtime collaborator Stuart Kenney, whose driving bass and banjo playing is probably best known in these parts from his work with Wild Asparagus.

Moving fluidly between melody and backup, the guitar, mandolin and bouzouki of the astounding **David Surette** will one minute be swapping pulsating solos with Rodney, and then a moment later lock into full groove with Stuart and Mary Cay. Finally, behind everyone else (literally, on most stages), percussionist extraordinaire **Sam Zucchini's** high-spirited inventiveness on drums and rhythm toys fills out the amazing Airdance sound.

New Dances in Town!

There are two new contra dances in Portland that you'll want to know about...

Begun August 2004 as a brainchild of Betsy Branch and Moggy Vanderkin, the first of these new dances happens every month that contains a **5th Tuesday**. The dance features the rollicking music of **Night Owl**: George Penk and Betsy on fiddles, and Mark Douglass on piano, with **Moggy Vanderkin** as the group's caller.

Held in the North Star Ballroom, a comfortably elegant structure whose outstanding amenity is an intimate wood paneled lounge where dancers can repair between sets for conversation and cookies. The address is 635 N. Killingsworth Court - on the corner of N. Borthwick St. just one block south of N Killingsworth St. (It shares the block with PCC Cascade campus's physical education building.)

Check this dance out on 5th Tuesdays. Dancing from 7:30 until 10:30 PM, with a beginners teaching session at 7 PM. Admission is \$7, which includes homemade treats during the break. Mark this year's dates now: March 29th, May 31st, August 30th and November 29th.

Then, on the **4th Sunday** of each month **Elinor Preston** is hosting (and calling) a "Zesty Contra" series for experienced contra dancers who would like to dance more challenging dances. Also at the North Star Ballroom, these dances run from 7:00 until 10:00. Admission for this dance is \$7 for general admission, or \$5 for students and seniors.

Megaband on the Horizon

Set your television dials for OPB (Channel 10), at 8:00 P.M. **Thursday, March 3rd**. That's when the program Oregon ArtBeat will feature the Portland Mega-

band. The filming was done in 2004, the show producer and film crew recording Megaband rehearsals, conducting interviews, and filming the Megaband dance. Since then, they have created a short feature on the Megaband event. You might even see yourself dancing on TV.

The Portland Megaband will play the 9th annual Dean Kenty Memorial Scholarship Dance with Erik Weberg calling on Saturday March 12, 2005. Once again, the event will be held at the spacious and comfortable Smith Memorial Ballroom at PSU, with free parking in the structures across the street. Dancers from Portland and other Northwest locales rave about this dance; no one will want to miss it. Celebrating its 20th anniversary, Camp Wannadance will be held April 8-10, 2005 at Fort Flagler on Marrowstone Island in Washington. Also, George Wilson will bring his melodic fiddle music from New York to be accompanied by Laurie Andres on piano and accordion in New England and Cape Breton style tunes. And Greg and **Iere Canote** will lead singing and teach ukulele for all and stay up playing into the wee hours.

There will be dances on Friday and Saturday evening with workshops on Saturday and Sunday in contra and square dance, Spanish Colonial dance, hula, flatfoot clogging, fiddle, old-time band, ukulele, singing and lots of time to jam. Five sumptuous meals served up by **Julie Yerxa** and crew. The location is an easy hour north of Seattle by ferry with great views of the Puget Sound, the mountains, and the sun.

Lift Ticket

One of the hottest new voices on the contemporary dance music scene, Lift Ticket is currently touring the nation, captivating dancers at dances and dance camps from coast to coast. Lift Ticket fuses an extraordinary repertoire of fiddle tunes, rendered with flair and flame, with grooves ranging from smokin' to sublime. It all comes together in an unforgettable dance experience in Portland on **Saturday, April 30** (and Eugene on Tuesday, April 26), with calling by **Woody Lane**.

Rex Blazer (violin, mandolin) has long been astounding contra dancers from coast to coast with his unique and powerful dance music. Known for a spontaneous and wildly fun fiddling style, he delights dancers with his jazz-inspired improvisations on dance tunes from the Northern, Southern and Celtic fiddling traditions. Rex ascribes to the theory that life should be a nonstop music and dance party, and is renowned for his knack of matching music to fit each dance. Rex started playing bluegrass fiddle in Montana in the 1970s, after which his love of traditional music led him to study in Cape Breton in 1983. These days, Rex enjoys blending Québécois, Scottish, old-time and Irish music into his own uniquely improvisational style of "new-wave" contra and square dance music. Rex been touring the U.S. for the past twenty years. Says Fiddler magazine, "Rex is a wonderful fiddler and an inspiring teacher." Rex also plays in Timezones (with David Kaynor, Peter Siegel and Susan Songer). Find out more cool things about Rex at www.rexblazer.com.

Seth Houston, on piano, keyboard and guitar, is the perfect illustration of "creative madness meets noholds-barred driving groove." While adept at traditional style of dance music accompaniment — Irish, New England, and Québécois —Seth infuses his playing with funk, pop, blues and swing. And the dancers go wild! Seth also plays in Honk the Moose (with Nat Hewitt and Adam Broome), Crazy Quilt (with Mary Lea, Anna Patton and Peter Siegel), and Firetruck (with Ethan Hazzard-Watkins and Anna Patton). In between weekends, Seth teaches music at the Monadnock Waldorf School in Keene, New Hampshire; directs Big Sky, an independent teen chorus based in Brattleboro, Vermont; plays jazz; and composes. His choral compositions and arrangements are widely performed by Northern Harmony and other ensembles. Seth enjoys teaching singing workshops, a big hit at dance camps and festivals.

Brian Perkins, a.k.a. "Mr. Groove," plays mandolin, tenor banjo, bouzouki and Quebecois percussive feet. Rooted in the Québécois, Irish and Scottish traditions, Brian is also a great tunesmith, and he jams with flair and flame. Brian founded and directs Celtic College, a popular traditional music workshop series in Burlington, Vermont, and plays in Atlantic Crossing (with Viveka Fox, Peter Macfarlane, and Rick Klein).
