A Change of Drivers

The PCDC board has recently decided to make some major changes in the structure of the organization, creating a Contra Dance Committee to supervise the planning and management of all PCDC contra dances. Details of the contra dances are currently handled by the PCDC board, leaving little time for the work of long range planning and community development. It is hoped that when the new committee is up and running that the board will be able to be more proactive with big picture items. Under the new structure there are **no** changes planned for the English Dance Committee, the NW Passage Dance Camp Committee, the Megaband or the Family Dances.

The committee will be appointed by and report to the PCDC board, but will have full responsibility for all regular and special contra dances. The committee is defined as being four to six people, one of whom will come from the board. The rest must be members of PCDC who are active participants in the contra dance community. Recruitment is open to any PCDC member who wishes to apply.

We all love the dances that we currently have. After many years of hard work by those who have gone before, PCDC has a pretty smooth operation for running the contra dances. We don't mean to risk any of that with big changes. For starters the committee will simply put their hands on the steering wheel and make sure the bus stays on the road, the tank stays full, and the oil gets changed regularly. Once the new drivers are settled in they can discuss adding new chrome bumpers or maybe some white wall tires. Whether this results in any noticeable change at the dances will depend on the energy and creativity of the new committee members.

PCDC is looking for a few good people with some enthusiasm, a desire to build an even better dance and the willingness to put in the effort needed to make it all work. Is it time for you to step up and take part in the creation of our swinging Saturday nights?

As if contra supergroup **Airdance** and Boston caller **Rick Mohr**, (profiled last issue,) weren't already a campfull of staff, we're also welcoming **Beth Molaro**, **Flapjack**, and **Mark Douglass**.

Since 1994, **Beth Molaro**'s calling has taken her from Asheville, surrounded by the mountains of Western North Carolina, to hundreds of contra and square dances from coast to coast—not to mention Denmark and Canada. She is in demand as a caller and teacher for community dances both small and large, for dance weekends and



folk festivals as well as weddings, family reunions and other gatherings. Beth's clear instructions and mellifluous voice are the perfect complement to her smooth, flowing contras and high-energy, turbocharged squares. In addition to calling, Beth is a skilled and exuberant foot percussionist in the Appalachian flatfoot style.

Energetic and passionate about traditional music, the Ontario-based band **Flapjack** plays old-time Canadian bush swing—a unique fusion of fiddle tunes, backwoods ballads, kitchen percussion and jug jazz.



Born in Toronto, but with family roots stretching back to the Appalachians, **Jay Edmunds** plays fiddle, mandolin and guitar, and sings. His influences range from Norman Blake to David Grisman to Woody Guthrie; his inspirations emerge from Ontario's landscape, musical traditions and living history.

Karen Taylor sings and plays fiddle and clawhammer banjo. After years of studying violin, piano, oboe and French horn, Karen's first love these days is playing for dancers—whether it's an Ontario square dance, contra, clogging or English sword-dancing.

Jay and bassist **Sam Allison** are longtime collaborators, originally hooking up a decade ago as the old-time and bluegrass band Slappy and the Brushcutters. Since then Sam has trained as a jazz musician and written award-winning music for theater. Despite such sophistication, he's still been known to whip out a bass harmonica from time to time.

Along with his guitar, **Tony Mason** recently returned to Canada after a decade on Music Row in Nashville. He also toured in Tennessee and Texas, playing music that ranged from Christian rock to alternative rock to bluegrass. He's known for his lightning fast fingers and a steady groove!

After his fantastic contributions to last year's camp, we've invited Portland's own **Mark Douglass** back to lead our singing workshops. Long before his talents as a dance pianist blossomed, Mark was singing in the big Lutheran laps of his parents and grandparents on Sunday mornings.



He eventually went on to study choral work at Pacific Lutheran University. Since then he has picked up various styles of sacred, folk and global song from various persons and places in the Northwest. A trained "music animator," Mark is currently Director of Music and Arts at Central Lutheran Church in Portland.

Dusk Til Done: Redux

This annual dance (Saturday, June 11) is once again going to be at the Kinton Grange, 19015 SW Scholls Ferry Road, Beaverton. (From Highway 217 take the Scholls Ferry Road Exit and head west five miles. The Grange is on the right.) Please carpool if possible, as parking is limited and always tight for this dance.

As in the past, we ask that dancers bring goodies for snacking on during the evening.

Remember that no bottles, cups, mugs, jugs, urns, cisterns, or any other liquid-containing devices can be

allowed into the dance hall itself, so if you bring one (or more) you will need to leave it out in the foyer. Don't worry if you forget, though; we'll be there to remind you!

The dance will begin at 7:00 P.M. with a lesson, then on to the serious frolicking at 7:30, eventually closing out the dance at about 1:00 A.M. with that final waltz.

The evening will begin with music by **The Nettles**, that smoking hot, high energy band from down the valley. The second band of the evening will be **The Beat Queens**, a brand spanking new band from the distant metropolis of Seattle. Comprised of Anita Anderson, Cathie Whitesides, and Joanne Lauterjung, they play tasty dance tunes on fiddle, flute, accordion, and keyboard, peppered with percussion, vocals, and tangy harmonies both traditional and contemporary. A rich, multilayered sound will float above a rock-solid beat that dancers won't be able to resist.

Megaband Was Way Incredible!

There's a New Band in Town

The latest addition to the ever-growing list of local bands is **Hands4**, and you can catch them at the June 25 PCDC dance, with Erik Weberg calling. This new band brings its high energy music to dance halls throughout the Pacific Northwest. Hands4 is comprised of: **Keith Moe** (fiddle, mandolin), **Hank Laramee** (mandolin, fiddle, guitar, percussion), **Fran Tewksbury** (whistle, flute, percussion) and **Carl Thor** (piano, hammered dulcimer). Combining seldom-used traditional tunes with original tunes by band members and other musicians, Hands4 creates a unique blend of music that is definitely "not your usual contra tunes," and will have feet and bodies moving in short order.

All four band members are several year veterans of the illustrious Portland Megaband as well as other dance music configurations. Keith played violin long before becoming interested in Scottish fiddle music and contra dance music, and is now a strong lead fiddler, though he's usually too modest to admit it. Fran and Hank lived, played and danced for several years in Massachusetts, at the heart of the New England contra dance world. As founding members of the Oregon Country Dance Or-

chestra, they started the Eugene contra dances and played for the first all-contra dance at the Northwest Folklife Festival in 1982. Carl has played hammered dulcimer since 1990 and piano a lot longer than that, performing and recording for over ten years with the Celtic folk ensemble, Talisman, and playing piano for English Country dancing and contra dancing for the past several years.

Hayloft Music Series

The Hayloft Music Series, so-named because it takes place in Sharon Moore's hayloft (5304 Center Street in Salem, at the east end of Center), has received much acclaim by those who have attended in the past.
