Swingin' in the New Year!

Putting It All Together Part 1

You've shown up at Fulton Community Center on a Saturday night to contradance, something you can do in Portland every Saturday night year-round. There's a band, a caller and somebody doing sound. Did you ever wonder how all that is arranged? I am currently the booker for PCDC dances, which are held on the second, fourth and fifth Saturdays of each month. (Calico and UnLeashed! sponsor the first Saturday (Cats and Dogs) dance; Jigsaw 'owns' third Saturdays). And, in this two part series, I hope to explain how everything gets put together for a night of fun on the dance floor.

Let's start with venues. We are lucky in Portland to have the same dance venue (Fulton) every Saturday night. Even so, the need to find other venues does arise during the year. In 2005 we used the Kinton Grange for the Dusk-til-Done dance in June, the Oaks Park Dance Pavilion for Wild Asparagus in November, and the Multnomah Arts Center for the New Year's Eve dance. And let's not forget the PSU Ballroom for the March Megaband dance! We maintain a spreadsheet of venues, but are always on the lookout for more. If you come upon a promising place, please let one of the board members know.

Then there is sound, necessary for the caller and the band since we dance to live music. We are fortunate to have three excellent local sound providers, John Oorthuys, Lanny Martin and Carl Thor, and each does several PCDC (as well as other Saturday) dances during the year. We've scheduled it so that John does second Saturdays, Lanny does fourth Saturdays and Carl does fifth Saturdays and fill-ins. These fellows lug in their own equipment for each dance, and are the first to arrive and the last to leave.

Most of my effort then, involves booking the bands and callers for PCDC dances. When I started booking I inherited a Rolodex with caller and musician contact information, and the marvels of e-mail make the job relatively easy (I can't imagine doing all of it by telephone!).


I usually do not book a band unless one of three things has happened: 1) I've danced to or called with them; 2) I'm aware of them through their recorded music; or 3) the band submits an audition recording. Often I get a phone call or e-mail from a local dancer, musician, or caller saying that PCDC should consider having a band they've heard play in Portland. Attending dances, festivals, dance weekends and dance camps also helps.

Caller and concertina player **George Marshall** led the dancers through an evening of New England style contra dances that were fun for beginner and experienced dancers alike. George puts a lot of effort into searching out the best dances and with his years of experience he always provides a great evening of dancing.

Wild Asparagus has been playing together for over 20 years Originally they were a terrific band. Still for someone who has danced to their music since they first started playing together in 1984 it is clear that every year they are more energetic and the musicianship keeps reaching new highs. The lead melody players **Becky Tracy** and **David Cantieni** weave together melodies and harmonies that are rich and rhythmic. As George Marshall put it, "We're always striving to make better dance music that compels people to **MOVE!**"

Megaband is on the March... ...For March

Already, at the time of this December writing, the **Portland** Megaband is gathering steam for its 10th annual local appearance and only performance anywhere this year. The 75member dance orchestra will play the March 11th second Saturday PCDC contra dance with Erik Weberg calling. The event will be held at the spacious and comfortable Smith Memorial Ballroom at PSU (downtown Portland) with free parking in the structures across the street. Musicians begin practicing and attending weekly rehearsals in January so they can be in top shape for the big night. Instruments include: fiddles (more than 30), banjos, banjo ukes, mandolins, autoharps, accordions, flutes, whistles, clarinets, saxophones, hammer dulcimers, guitars, bass, harp, piano, and percussion. The band is open to any musician on any instrument at any level of experience and/or expertise, and band members run the gamut from highly accomplished to beginner. In the 9 years that the band has been playing, dancers have been delighted with both its energy and musicianship. All are welcome. No partner or dancing experience necessary to completely enjoy this unique and memorable contra dance. March 11th, 8:00 pm (7:30 workshop for newcomers) Smith Memorial Ballroom at PSU; 1825 SW

Because of the immense popularity of this dance, not only with Portland dancers but also with dancers who come from all over the Northwest to attend, you may buy an advance ticket, which will insure you a spot on the dance floor and no waiting line to pay for admission. The tickets will be sold by mail order only. Look for flyers with order blanks at the local dances. In addition, advance ticket order forms may be downloaded from the PCDC Web site and from the Portland Megaband web site. Tickets will also be sold at the door for the same price as the mail order sales. We anticipate there will be plenty of room in the ballroom for dancers who prefer to buy their tickets at the door on the night of the dance.

This is the annual **Dean Kenty Memorial Scholarship** dance with all proceeds going to the PCDC scholarship fund.

The Dean Kenty Scholarship Fund was created to fund PCDC members to attend dance and music camps and workshops. The scholarship fund is currently primarily funded by the proceeds from the annual Megaband dance, usually held the second Saturday in March.

RULES AND CRITERIA

- 1. The applicant must be a current member of PCDC, and must have been a member for at least six months.
- 2. The applicant must not have received a scholarship in the previous fiscal year. (Our fiscal year ends on May 31st.)
- 3. \$100 dollar scholarships are given to those applicants attending workshops/camps that are five days or longer. \$50 dollar scholarships are given to those applicants attending shorter events.
- 4. PCDC will not fund greater than 100% of any event, e.g. if the workshop costs \$35, we will give a scholarship no greater than \$35.
- 5. All PCDC members are encouraged to apply for scholarships.
- 6. Scholarship recipients are expected to give back to PCDC. This can be by participating in Megaband, performing volunteer work for PCDC, serving on the PCDC Board, serving on a PCDC related committee, calling at dances, playing music at dances, or other similar activities.
- 7. The PCDC Board must receive the completed *scholar-ship form* no later than two weeks prior to the event.
- 8. Scholarships are given at the PCDC Board's discretion. However, it should be noted that the PCDC Board has not, in recent memory, denied a scholarship except for the above reasons.
- 9. Suttle Lake Dance Camp work scholarships are handled entirely by the Suttle Lake Committee. They set their own eligibility rules, and define their own criteria for acceptance.
