After the break and the annual meeting and election (see separate article), local hero, Joyride will be playing for your late night dancing. Sue Songer on piano and Jeff Kerssen-Griep on guitar provide all the horsepower needed to drive us up the mountain. Kathleen Towers on fiddle is the finely tuned suspension that leads us through the curves while Erik Weberg on flute and harmonica provides the sound of the sunny wind through our hair, until he pulls out the bombard and then the whole operation becomes a fire truck barreling down on us with lights flashing and siren screaming. Taking the late night calling shift will be William Watson. Since William is from alt.texas (Austin), he has fit right in here in Oregon. He brings a level of precision in calling that allows us all to dance a little above our level. Coffee will be available because you won't want to go home early.

Lots of contras, scrumptious swing dancing, plenty of music and singing workshops, hiking, great food – be sure to mark your calendars for PCDC's dance and music weekend, August 31-September 2. The Avant Gardeners and southern California caller Susan Michaels (profiled in the last issue of Footnotes) could, by themselves, keep us all dancing and happy for a whole weekend. So imagine the ecstasy when we add Ron Buchanan and The Hillbillies From Mars to the mix!

Ever since he was four years old, **Ron Buchanan** always loved the 4-H dances held in his aunt and uncle's western

Pennsylvania barn. "No spitting snuff or chewing tobacco on the dance floor," proclaimed the sign, while strong farm women gave him a swing until his feet were high above the floor.

Ron decided he'd be a caller when he grew up. And so for 35 years now he's led hundreds of contra and square dances from Boston to L.A., from Tampa to Fairbanks. Known for his high-energy patter calling, efficient teaching.



and quick wit, he's a favorite at dance camps in at least four countries.

For Northwest Passage we've asked Ron to also teach swing dance, one of the many varieties of couples dancing he loves. Ron's relaxed teaching style has boosted thousands of dancers from swing novices to experienced practitioners of Pretzels and Dips.

The Hillbillies From Mars have been rocking the contra dance scene in the San Francisco Bay Area since 1983. They

combine their love of and dedication to Celtic and American traditional fiddle music with a healthy dose of their own "folk roots" of rock and roll, swing, Latin, and African beats, forging their own new tradition of dance music. Besides playing for square and contra dances around the Bay Area, the Hillbillies have also performed at music and dance festivals from Fairbanks to Atlanta.

Kevin Carr's powerful fiddling forms the backbone of the band's French Canadian and Irish repertoire. He also adds musical texture through his virtuosity on the Irish bagpipes and diatonic accordion.



Ray Bierl's background in Appalachian and Cape Breton styles adds another dimension to the group's repertoire, as his driving fiddle backup technique shifts squares and contra dances into high gear. Ray is well known on the west coast as a folk singer, and his country and cowboy songs are of-

ten featured in Hillbillies performances.

Daniel Steinberg's polyrhythmic piano/synthesizer backup and dynamic flute playing fill out the band's sound. The Hillbillies perform many of his original dance tunes and feature Daniel's innovative arrangements of traditional material. Daniel's singing workshops have received rave reviews at dance festivals around the country.



Often teaming up with his California colleagues, Seattle's **David Cahn** adds his versatile accordion, guitar and mandolin to the mix. David has toured and recorded with many great musicians, and teaches at the Puget Sound Guitar Workshop, Fiddletunes, Pinewoods and several other nationally renowned camps and festivals.

The contra committee reported on the upcoming Dusk 'til Done dance, set for Sat., June 9. Kim reported that the committee is looking to fill a vacancy and is still researching the possibility of an urban dance camp in Portland. Gerhardt reported on his continued outreach efforts. NW Passage: Help Wanted!

Northwest Passage offers several **work-trade** positions. In return for a few hours of help with essential camp tasks, work-traders receive a \$65 refund from their camp fee and the satisfaction of helping make NWP a great camp. Work-trade tasks are arranged for minimal overlap with scheduled events.

Northwest Passage also hires several **dishwashers** for part-time work over the weekend. Each will receive room, board and \$100; in addition, dishwashers may participate in camp events when they are not scheduled to work. Proposed Changes to Bylaws

The PCDC Board is proposing several changes to our bylaws, some of which are 'house-keeping' changes while others are intended to help the organization continue to run smoothly. In accordance with article 9 of the bylaws, these



changes are outlined below. To conserve space, only that portion of the article necessary to explain the changes is shown. Deletions are in square brackets [] and additions are in **bold**. If you have comments, please contact any board member.

Article 9 of our bylaws states that the board shall have power to make, amend and repeal bylaws of PCDC by a two thirds vote of all board members at any regular or special meeting of the board, provided that the proposed change has been previously brought to the notice of the membership through notification in the newsletter and a copy of the proposed change has been given to each member of the board at least seven days before the meeting at which it is to be voted on.

<u>Article 2: Educational Purpose</u>. A wording change dropping duplicate language.

The Portland Country Dance Community is organized [exclusively for,] and operated exclusively for educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code.

Article 4: Board of Directors. A change in the term of board members from two to three.

Elections to the board will take place each year near the change of the fiscal year (June 1 – May 31) at an annual all-members meeting. Board members are elected for terms of two years by majority vote of the membership present at the meeting. No board member shall be elected for **more than** three consecutive terms. Duties of board members include attending two thirds of the board meetings per annum as stated in the minutes. If a board member resigns, his or her place may be filled by appointment by the board within a two month period from the date of resignation to fill the unexpired term.

Article 5: Officers. 1. Change allows additional person(s) to sign checks as designated by the board so that bylaws are in line with current practices. 2. Changes in the wording regarding communication to members and general meetings of the membership.

The duties of the offices shall be as follows: Chair: The chair shall be the principal officer and shall preside at the meetings of the members and the board. The chair shall sign all instruments requiring formal execution and acknowledgement, except that checks drawn on the organization account may be signed instead by any of the other officers or other person(s) designated by the Board. Secretary: The secretary shall be responsible for the taking and archiving of minutes at all meetings of the board and general meetings of the membership. The minutes will be [mailed] communicated to the board members and available to others upon request.

Article 7: Meetings. Added wording to match that of article 5.

Minutes of the meetings of the board and **general meetings** of the membership shall be [mailed] **communicated** to board members within two weeks of the meeting and shall be available to members upon request.

through live performance and participation. With this newsletter we hope to exchange information and share concerns about traditional music and dance. We publish the newsletter every other month and distribute it to members of PCDC and to other folk organizations. Membership is \$15 a year for individuals, \$12 for students and seniors (65+), or \$25 for households.
