Fifteen Glorious Years! The 2007 English Country Ball

Get your dance shoes and your most festive outfit ready for a very important English Country Ball on Saturday, November 3rd, as the Portland Ball celebrates its fifteenth anniversary. The ball and workshop will be held, as last year, at the historic old Portland landmark, the Oaks Park Dance Pavilion.

English dance differs from contra in that each dance has its own music, mainly written by composers of the 17th and 18th centuries, with some beautiful modern compositions as well. Special note to waltzers: the English Country Ball will feature half an hour of waltzing before the ball officially begins with country dances at 7:30.

Nan Evans will be the caller. (As it happens, she called the first Portland English Country Ball!) Music will be provided by Betsy Branch, Fred Nussbaum, George Penk and Heather Pinney.

The Saturday night ball is the highlight of a fun-filled weekend. On Friday, November 2nd, we will dance old and new favorites and greet out of town friends at Fulton Community Center. The dance begins at 7:30 PM; admission is \$8 for everyone. On Saturday, November 3rd, the fun starts with a workshop to practice the ball dances at the Oaks Park Dance Pavilion from 12-2:30 PM. After a break to rest, socialize, and get ready: THE BALL! Country dances begin at 7:30 PM, with pre-ball waltzing from 7-7:30. Note that this year the ball will end at 11:00 PM. On Sunday, November 4th, direct your well-used feet to the potluck brunch and dance at the Sunlight Community Rooms, 6402 SW Barnes Rd., beginning at 10:30 AM.

This weekend is fragrance free, so please review this topic on the ECB website at http://portlandecd.home.att.net/.

You can learn many of the ball dances by attending the weekly Friday night English Country dances at the Burlingame Water Tower. We hope to see you there. Also, Nan will be leading three workshops on Sundays in October (10/7, 10/14 & 10/21) to concentrate on the more complex dances.

Cost for the Saturday ball and workshop is \$35 per person. (Please note: it goes up to \$45 this year if postmarked after October 5th). Remember, you must pre-register. This year we will offer several partial scholarships. Pick up registration forms at the weekly contra or English dances or off the ball website above. Oregon Dance Fair is Back

The Oregon Dance Fair is a three day event with live music, dance performances, lessons, workshops, competitions and social dancing. All this will happen September 28-30, at five venues in Portland, most of which are within walking distance of each other. The majority of events will take place at Norse Hall (111 NE 11th Ave), including a contra dance on Sunday from 2-5 PM in the Lodge Room upstairs. The caller will be Mary Devlin with music by George Penk and Heather Pinney.

The first ever Oregon Dance Fair took place last year and was quite successful, so it will be back bigger and better this year. The event was organized by a young lindy and swing teacher named Larry Peacock and although its focus was predominantly swing and ballroom dancing, Larry wanted to include contra dancing too, so he asked PCDC for help. Kim Appleberry recalled that PCDC was able to recruit some 25 regular contra dancers to achieve a critical mass of experienced



dancers for ODF's contra dance. This worked well since attendees were otherwise experienced dancers who simply had never tried contra before. "I danced with a girl who was as lost as any beginner in a hay but I put her into a twirl and she would zip off three perfect Black & Decker spins" recalled Kim. He added, "In the following weeks I did see some of the people from that

dance at regular contra dances, which is why PCDC chose to participate in this event: outreach and exposure."

Last year, over 3000 dancers participated and about double that is expected this year. And the ODF has grown in many other areas: there will be 15 social dances with 7 live bands. Lesson tracks will include tango, salsa, ballroom/waltz, lindy hop and swing, offered by local instructors. Advanced instruction will be available by audition.
