PCDC to Sponsor First Ever Portland Dance Camp

PCDC is proud to present the first annual Portland Raindance, set to take place in May, 2008. Version 1.0 will kick off on Friday, May 2nd and run through Sunday May 4th. It will be held at the beautiful (air conditioned) Norse Hall. Headlining will be those stars of stage and screen, the Hotpoint Stringband, getting their feet wet for the first time in Portland.

Mark Burhans on fiddle and Hilarie Burhans on banjo have been playing together for over 30 years, and are the driving central force of this dynamic group from Athens, Ohio. Rounding out the instrumental fireworks are Marlene Shostak on piano; Mark Hellenberg on doumbek, kanjira, djembe, bodhran, snare, cymbals, feet, and other percussive toys; and Nick Weiland on bass.

Hotpoint has been expanding the style of contra dance

music through their inventive use of percussion, fascinating arrangements and catchy snippets of wellknown tunes mined from such musical greats as The

Rolling Stones, Bob Marley and Jerry Garcia. This is not your parents' contra music! Sneaking in through your ears, Hotpoint will take control of your body and run it at red line speed until the tank is empty.

Doubling up on you will be the McKassons. This hot band from Seattle has been melting the sneakers off unprepared dancers. Ryan McKasson, on fiddle and viola, last played for us at Dusk 'til Done 2006 with his other band, the Syncopaths. Twice U.S. National Scottish Fiddle Champion, he has also played with Bobby McFerrin, Elvis Costello and the Tacoma Symphony Orchestra.

Ryan's sister, Cali, plays piano with the power of a thunderstorm – vibrating the floor boards. On drums and percussion is Matt Jerrell whapping the beat that tells the feet when to meet. If we told you the fourth member of the band you wouldn't be able to contain yourself so for your own protection that information will be released when it's safe.

Calling with these two great bands will be Susan Kevra. Coming to us from Nashville, Tennessee, Susan calls and plays music on both coasts and both sides of the Atlantic. She began calling dances in 1991, appearing in New England Grange halls in tiny, snow-covered villages as well as major festivals and dance camps throughout North America and Western Europe. Susan is noted for her charm and wit; her clear teaching and diverse repertoire are appreciated by happy dancers all over the country.

Also calling will be Marlin Prowell from Bellingham, Washington. Marlin has an easy-going way of sliding complex dances out on the floor so that your feet know what to do before your mind has time to worry about it. Marlin's

ability to match the dances with the music doubles the enjoyment of both.

As an extra added attraction we will be doing a full court press, double intensive, you're finally gonna get it, Hambo teaching series in the upstairs lodge room at Norse Hall.

The Portland Raindance is an "urban dance weekend," which means no camping and no food. You sleep in your own bed and eat your usual breakfast. Just come dance with us from Friday evening through Sunday afternoon. No wet tents, no hard bunks. All fun all the time. And if you'd like to offer a spare bed to a Raindancer coming from out of town, we can guarantee they won't bite or shed.

Now the best part: the cost is only \$105 for general admission, \$100 for PCDC members and \$80 for students. These rates are for registrations postmarked by February 29th. After that the cost increases by \$20. There will be a lottery for all registrations postmarked by February 29th and the weekend will be gender balanced.

Mark your calendars! The 11th annual Portland Megaband dance will happen on March 8th, 2008, the 2nd Saturday PCDC dance. Erik Weberg will call. As of this writing in early December, preparations are fully underway. With 73 returning members signing on, the band has expanded its 75-member limit to make room for 6 newcomers. Starting in January, we will be rehearsing Sunday afternoons at the Fulton Community Center. (Some have suggested that we invite a few dancers for the stage while we are rehearsing on the floor!) The dance in March will be held at the spacious and comfortable Smith Memorial Ballroom at PSU in downtown Portland, with free parking available in the structures across the street. Instruments include more than 30 fiddles along with banjos, banjo ukes, mandolins, autoharps, accordions, flutes, whistles, clarinets, saxophones, hammered dulcimers, guitars, trombone, bass, harp, piano, and percussion. The band is open to any musician on any instrument at any level of experience and/or expertise, and band members run the gamut from highly accomplished to beginner. The English Country Dance Committee has determined that volunteers for English dances will be allowed free admission to the dance at which they volunteer.

A motion was passed to authorize Karsten Kelly, Dave Hamlin, David Blanchard and Rick Kimball to be signatories on the NW Passage checking account at Washington Mutual.

The board discussed the rental policy for the PCDC sound system. The rental rate for the sound system is currently \$20.

Musicians' Workshops

Portland musicians will have a unique opportunity to participate in concurrent music workshops presented by premier Québec musicians, fiddler Lisa Ornstein and guitarist André Marchand. A founder of the Québécois supergroup, La Bottine Souriante, André Marchand has defined Québécois music for the past thirty years with his legendary voice, his repertoire of traditional songs, and his unique guitar accompaniment. Lisa Ornstein is also a former member of La Bottine, the only American import in the group's 30+ year history. Her dynamic and meticulous fiddling, musical scholarship, and bottomless bag of off-the-beaten track tunes have inspired a generation of Québécois musicians. Lisa and André have been playing together for thirty years and have a wealth of experience bringing the music of Québec to life.

French-Canadian Dance Music Workshop: "When I teach Québécois fiddling", says Lisa, "I try to delve deep into the heart of what makes this particular music sound the way it does – what it is which makes that regional or individual style of playing instantly recognizable, even if one only hears the briefest fragment of a tune. Style never boils down to a single element; it is the sum of many parts. And the tunes themselves have stories to tell, because they intertwine with the history and culture and dances of the families and

communities which have passed them along. In my workshops, we explore these tunes and their stories, and dig our fingers deep into the rich stylistic topsoil which gives them their unique sound. In this workshop, you'll learn a couple of tunes in detail and I'll also record, for those interested, a couple of "take-home" tunes. Tunes taught will include both "square" and "crooked" melodies. All instruments welcome!"

French-Canadian Guitar Workshop: "André Marchand's unerring instinct for chords and textures has made him one of Québec's most distinctive and sought-after guitarists. In this workshop, he'll present his approach to accompanying instrumental music, including back-up for the tunes which I (Lisa) will be teaching. In the last half-hour, André and I will bring the groups together to play the tunes we learned. We will also talk about how we approach guitar-fiddle duets."
