The Other Half of Raindance

The Portland Raindance will be held April 24-26, 2009. In the last issue of *Footnotes* we told you about one of the bands, the Great Bear Trio, and one of the callers, Cary Ravitz. Now for the rest of the story:

The Clayfoot Strutters are a Vermont based band of six



people whose melodies from pop and jazz combined with hot dance-floor rhythms from the Afropop, swing, Latin and Cajun worlds really push out the edges of what

contra music is. And, as composers and arrangers they are constantly contributing new material to their unique repertoire. Caribbean island music, roadhouse, string-band, the sound track from "Mr. Hulot's Holiday." Makes you want to slither and slink.

Founded in 1990, the Strutters seldom get out to the Wild West but are more often seen in the crystal chandeliered contra dance halls of the east, where the glitterati of the contra scene hold their lighters high when the Clayfeet start Strutting. Speakeasy jazz, smooth groove, sleazy swing band. Makes you want to jiggle and wiggle.

The Strutters are: Jeremiah McLane (accordion and piano), Pete Sutherland (fiddle, piano, and vocals), Peter Davis (guitar, piano and sax), Mark Roberts (banjo and flute), Harry Aceto (bass), and Russ Sternglass (drums).

Steve Zakon-Anderson is a master contra dance caller and teacher. He has performed at dance camps and festivals

in 36 states. His own dance compositions are well-known among dancers and other callers. Steve's clear teaching, energetic calling and sense of humor have made him a favorite of dancers far and wide.

Steve sits at the top of the heap in New England where callers are stacked like cordwood outside the Guiding Star Grange.
He doesn't often come to the West Coast so save yourself the cost of a plane ticke and come to Raindance.



Portland Megaband Dance

It's a new year in Portland, and to many local musicians, that means: Time To Practice! The 13th annual Portland Megaband Dance will happen on March 14, 2009, at the 2nd Saturday PCDC dance. Erik Weberg will call. With more than 75 returning musicians signing up to play, the band has expanded its 75-member limit to make room for 4 newcomers. The sets are selected and band members have been working on the tunes since December, so that they will be in top form by March. Starting in January, we will be rehearsing Sunday afternoons at Fulton. (Visitors are welcome at the rehearsals - we have plenty of room in this great venue.) Instruments include: fiddles (more than 30), banjos, banjo ukes, mandolins, autoharps, accordions, flutes, whistles, clarinets, saxophones, hammered dulcimers, guitars, trombone, bass, piano, and percussion. The band is open to any musician on any instrument at any level of experience and/or expertise, and band members run the gamut from highly accomplished to beginner. In the 12 years that the band has been playing, dancers have been delighted with both its energy and musicianship. As in the past several years, the dance will be held at the spacious and comfortable Smith Memorial Ballroom at PSU in downtown Portland, with free parking in the structures across the street.

For more than two decades, PCDC has had an annual benefit dance in memory of one of the first contra dance musicians in Portland, Dean Kenty. Beginning in 1997, the Megaband has played for this dance, and the official title of the event has been the Dean Kenty Memorial Scholarship Dance. While the event will not change at all, it is time to change the title of the dance. Henceforth, it will be known as The Portland Megaband Dance: A Celebration of Dance Community. Proceeds from the dance will continue to go into a fund for scholarships for musicians and dancers.

Because of the immense popularity of this dance, not only with Portland dancers but with dancers who come from all over the Northwest to attend, advance tickets will be available (by mail order only). Purchasing your ticket in advance will ensure you a spot on the dance floor without having to wait in line to pay for admission. Look for flyers with order forms at local dances, or download an advance ticket order form from the PCDC or Portland Megaband website. Tickets will be sold at the door for the same price as the mail order tickets and we anticipate that there will be plenty of space in the ballroom for dancers who prefer to buy their tickets at the door on the night of the dance. Megaband t-shirts, as well as the live recording from the 2002 dance will be for sale at the dance. Don't miss out on this unique and memorable contra dance!
