As if the exuberance of **Elixir** (Ethan Hazzard-Watkins, Anna Patton, Jesse Hazzard-Watkins, Owen Morrison, and Nils Fredland) and of caller **Susan Michaels** – both profiled last issue – weren't already going to keep us delightedly exhausted, wait until Elixir trombonist **Nils Fredland** steps up to the vocal mike. And then duck and cover when **The Syncopaths** take the stage!

Mild-mannered New Hampshire music teacher by day, Nils

Fredland becomes the "Mick Jagger of contra dance callers" on nights and weekends. He currently resides in Keene, New Hampshire with his wife Amy and their cat Shade, where he spends late nights at the kitchen table thinking about contra dance choreography. Really! He loves his work.



Nils started calling dances in 2001. Since then his technical skill, disarming friendliness, comfortable stage presence, distinctive deep voice, and trombone playing have delighted dancers in 31 states and 5 countries. Nils believes in the power of dance to create community, connection, joy, and a sense of belonging. That's what you'll feel in every dance he calls.

Fusing Celtic tunes with jazz, rock, and even calypso, **The Syncopaths** have created a vibrant new California Celtic sound. Of their 2005 debut CD, "Rough Around The Edges,"



the Irish Herald wrote that with this band "the possibilities are endless—such is the skill of the players."

Ryan McKasson's inventive and dynamic fiddling is the heart and soul of the band. Ryan –twice the U.S. National Scottish

fiddle champion – is also a noted classical musician, and has shared the stage with Bobby McFerrin and Elvis Costello. At [continued on page two]

Another arc of the circle is Heather Pinney, pounding and plinking on the piano keys, adding great detail and rhythm to the circle. At the center of the circle is George Penk, bow flying, fingers dancing, up on his toes poised for action. Pushing the intense fiddle out through the dancers. All of it carefully snapping together to make a...well, a Full Circle.

The second band, Riffraff, comes to us from Olympia, WA. The twin fiddles of Lindon and Evo Toney are matched with Jim Erlandson on mandolin and Warren Argo on guitar. The band has been together for 10 years, practicing, just for this gig. They play in the Fast and Rowdy lane. If you have a feeling you're being watched, it's them. While playing, they are focusing on the dancers to make sure they're riding you hard enough. The putting away wet is up to you.*

the Valley of the Moon Scottish Fiddling School, he met renowned Scottish fiddler Alasdair Fraser and Cape Breton fiddle maestro Buddy MacMaster, who have since been his greatest influences.

Jeff Spero's energetic, creative style at the keyboard serves as the perfect foil to Ryan's fiddling and provides the driving power for the Syncopath engine. Well versed in genres from folk to rock to country, Jeff plays in several well-known Southern California contra bands, including Chopped Liver and Outré Limitz, and is also a nationally respected contra dance caller and dance composer.

Drummer and singer Christa Burch lends power and groove to the Syncopaths with her non-traditional bodhrán style. Also a noted member of a vibrant new generation of American folk-singers, Christa's flexible, expressive voice is fresh, powerful, and instantly recognizable.

Bill Flores is a multi-instrumental wonder: accomplished on dobro, guitar, saxophone, pedal steel, mandolin, button accordion, fiddle and banjo! His versatility provides ever-varied colors and textures to the Syncopaths' palette. Bill has played professionally for over 25 years, exploring a variety of styles including blues, Cajun, old-time, bluegrass, Celtic and Norteño. He has performed and recorded with notable artists from Bob Dylan to Stevie Ray Vaughn.

February 23. Present: K. Appleberry, T. Gojio, S. Goss, D. Hunt, C. Mullooly, J. Wiser, and guest Carmen Doerge.

Chris, of the English committee, reported that their monthly workshops had begun...and that they were "stylin'!"

Kim, of the contra committee, announced that preparations for the Megaband Dance were coming along swimmingly. The board unanimously agreed to honor the master maestros and the consummate caller for that dance with gift certificates. Many thanks to Sue Songer, Gordy Euler, and Erik Weberg for the tremendous effort and dedication to this year's big dance! Kim further reported that registrations for the 2009 Raindance were strong with a good gender balance.

Chris moved that the Northwest Passage committee be represented on the board by Carmen Doerge. That motion passed and Carmen reported that the Labor Day dance weekend will take place at Camp Kiwanis this year and next year. This year's bands are Elixir & The Syncopaths.

The outreach position on the PCDC Board is still open. Tim hopes to have this position filled before the board retreat.

The board voted to provide \$100 for a Megaband musicians' workshop and \$150 for an English musicians' workshop.

Rick delivered his final treasurer's report to the board...and then proceeded to deposit three boxes' worth of financial records in the lap of our new treasurer, Sarah! The board heartily commended Rick for his hard work as PCDC Treasurer and wished him well in his next volunteer endeavor! The board decided to purchase the latest version of Quickbooks to replace the 2001 version we currently own. Rick reminded us that while the board does not and need not operate under a formal budget, the treasurer has oversight over the various PCDC accounts except for the checking accounts. This arrangement helps ensure the safety of PCDC's financial assets.

Chris announced that the English dances are going well and that the annual English Country Ball will be held at Oaks Park on October 24th.

Kim announced that 411 dancers attended the Megaband Dance. He also noted that one of the scheduled callers for the Raindance, Steve Zakon-Anderson, had to cancel due to an accident. With much last-minute phone-calling, Kim managed to snag Beth Molaro to fill in. 190 dancers are registered for the weekend.

Carmen reported that the Northwest Passage team will be visiting Camp Kiwanis soon for a detailed walk-through.

The board approved a \$500 expenditure for the Contra Innovation Fund. This fund was designed to cover promotional costs for dances (CD giveaways, decorations, etc.) in a continuing effort to introduce contra dancing to the world!
