Megaband Blows into Town

Bow, blow, strum, pluck, hammer, tap, slap, squeeze, pull – that's what we do. Listen, read, study, memorize, practice individually, rehearse as a group – that's how we prepare. Enthusiastic, committed, hopeful, community-minded, excited – that's how we feel. Full, vibrant, energetic, tight, harmonious, inventive, dynamic, orchestral – that's how we sound. The Portland Megaband – that's who we are. All 77 of us are getting ready to once again play our way through an incredible evening of music and dance. You, you, you, and you (about 500 you's) – that's who we hope will join us.

From January 9th through March 6th, the Megband will be rehearsing from 3-5 PM most Sunday afternoons at Fulton Community Center. (Visitors are welcome.) Instruments include: fiddles (more than 30), banjos, banjo ukes, mandolins, autoharps, accordions, flutes, whistles, clarinets, oboes, saxophones, hammer dulcimers, guitars, trombone, bass, harp, piano, and percussion.

The band is open to any musician on any instrument at any level of experience and/or expertise, and band members run the gamut from highly accomplished to beginner. As in the past several years, the dance will be held at the spacious and comfortable Smith Memorial Ballroom at PSU in downtown Portland, with free parking in the structures across the street. Erik Weberg will lead us through the evening with masterful calling. Don't miss out on this unique, memorable contra dance.

Because of the immense popularity of this event, and because we are expecting an increase in out-of-town dancers due to the Megaband Dance being part of the regional Cascade Promenade dance events this same weekend, we highly encourage the purchase of advance tickets. This will ensure you a spot on the dance floor and you will not have to wait in line to pay admission. Advance tickets will be sold by mail order only. Look for flyers with order blanks at local dances. In addition, advance ticket order forms may be downloaded from the PCDC or the Portland Megaband website. Tickets will also be sold at the door for the same price. Megaband t-shirts will be available for purchase at the dance as well as the live Megaband recording from the 2002 dance. Proceeds from this dance will go into a PCDC fund for scholarships for musicians and dancers.

Techno contra, more broadly called crossover contra, has been perpetuated by thrill-seeking dancers, callers and DJs since the 2008 Youth Dance Weekend in Vermont. Along with non-traditional music, these events often feature spontaneous bouts of blues dancing, flamboyant costumes, low ceilings, eccentric lighting, and any other fabulous touches the organizers and participants can dream up.

PCDC is holding Portland's first techno contra dance on Sunday, January 16th, from 7-10 PM. The caller (who will debut at the preceding Saturday dance) is Wendy Graham, an endlessly-energetic crossover veteran imported from Colorado for your dancing pleasure. There will be no walkthroughs, so come prepared to dance until you're dizzy. Also, help us produce the appropriate ambiance by dressing up, down, or sideways. Wear white, weave glow-sticks into your hair, and rouge your knees. All ages are welcome. Some experience with contra dancing is recommended, but veteran dancers should have little trouble adjusting to the music. Cascade Promenade Returns

Last year's first ever Cascade Promenade was a massive & magical regional event encompassing contra, English and waltz dances from Seattle to Eugene and culminating in the ten-hour Portland Roadhouse Dance. And it was good!! So good that we're doing it again! This year's event begins on Thursday March 10th with the 6th Annual Contra Marathon Benefit for NW Folklife at the Lake City Community Center in Seattle. This is a 3 hour, non-stop, no walk-through contra dance with 17 callers and 25 musicians. On Friday there will be a special contra dance in Eugene, English country dancing in Portland, the new 2nd Friday contra in Vancouver, an evening of waltzes in Olympia and the regular Emerald City contra dance in Seattle. On Saturday, March 12th, there will be contra dancing during the day in Olympia and then, that evening, dancers from all over the Northwest will gather together for the Portland Megaband Dance at PSU in downtown Portland.

Don't stay up too late though because on Sunday, you will want to dance your heart out at the Portland Roadhouse Dance which will be held at the Milwaukie Community Club (10666 SE 42nd Ave, Milwaukie, OR). Dancing starts at 11 AM and goes until 9 PM. Eight bands – all from the Pacific Northwest, and eight equally homegrown callers will keep the energy and fun going all day and well into the evening. This is your chance to rub shoulders with contra dancers from out of town. Make new friends; learn new tricks! Maybe even find romance! The venue for this event is a grange-style hall with a hardwood floor ballroom and a downstairs common room where dancers seeking respite can refuel, replenish and relax. The committee will supply some finger foods this year, but feel free to bring food to share and instruments for jamming.

The admission fee of \$15 (\$12 if you arrive before 11:30 AM) entitles you to in-and-out privileges all day. This year the dance will be a benefit, however details have not yet been finalized; check the on-line version of *Footnotes* for updates.
