A zestful caller who puts a high premium on fun, Cis is in great demand at music and dance festivals all over the U.S.,

England, and Denmark. When not on the road, she teaches t'ai chi classes in her native Atlanta, Georgia.

The Lost & Nameless Orchestra

Branch on fiddle, brings the lilt and effervescence to the band. Todd Silverstein plays 17 different instruments but they don't all fit in his car so he'll probably leave the Theremin at home and just bring the penny whistle, the sax

and the bouzouki. Jeff Kerrsen-Griep provides the Chuck Berry stage moves and a solid rhythm guitar. Mark Douglass is Jerry Lee Lewis on piano, except without the 13-year old wife. All together they are the Rock Gods from the Outer Limits — Wild Hair.

Holding down two jobs, we will have Erik Weberg opening the evening by calling with Wild Hair. Mr. Smooth at the microphone, Erik will make you feel like you're on a party boat, but the captain will get you home safe and secure.

The second band, Joyride has the excitement of Vivaldi, the power of Beethoven, the precision of Mozart and the happiness of Afro-Pop. George Penk plays a powerful but playful fiddle,

leading the melody off on a snappy course. Eric Weberg plays a lovely, lyrical flute that can m a t c h George's incessant melody punch for punch. Erik



also plays a raunchy harmonica and sometimes the "blow down the barricades" bombard. Stand clear. Sue Songer, national queen of contra music, on the piano gives us the fabric that holds it all together. Double-dipping in both bands, we have Jeff Kerssen-Griep who puts the power in the pistons that push the driving wheels.

guitars, vocals) met in St. Louis in 1993 and formed an instant bond playing fiddle tunes and Patrick's original songs. Their musical travels took them throughout the USA and Europe until the band settled in Austin, TX, in 2006. The band has since grown to include 14-year old musical prodigy Kimberly Zielnicki (fiddle, bass, vocals, ukulele), Nathan Quiring (keyboards, accordion), and Chris Carroll (drums, percussion).



All five members are highly skilled and well trained musicians with a sincere love for making music together. The band's unique chemistry on stage creates an intimate atmosphere in the room and draws listeners into the music. As the intensity builds, it is not uncommon to catch band members dancing on chairs and fueling the fire of excitement in the room.

After a standing residency at Flipnotics (an Austin institution for the past 18 years), a calendar full of shows all over Texas and Arkansas, and their first tour under their belt, The Lost and Nameless Orchestra is currently in the studio recording their debut full-length album. The band's collective goal is to "put on an insanely great live show," and anyone who has seen the band will agree that the Lost & Nameless Orchestra delivers just that.
