PCDC's Annual Labor Day Dance & Music Camp

Mark your calendars now for four days of high-energy contras and sprightly English country dances at this year's Northwest Passage Dance Camp Aug. 31-Sept. 3, 2012. By popular demand this year's camp will once again be held at Mt. Hood Kiwanis Camp.

We could have limited ourselves to searching the major dance communities in the U.S., or even the U.S. and Canada, and provided you with excellent bands and callers for this year's camp. But no, we went beyond that. We searched far and wide, from smaller communities in the U.S. to across the ocean to Europe, and are bringing to you exceptional bands and callers at this year's Northwest Passage camp.

Paul Hutchinson and John Hymas



Some of you might remember Paul Hutchinson. Way back in 1999 Paul came over from the U.K. to play for us at Suttle Lake as one half of the duo Belshazzar's Feast. The scandalous details of those performances haven't made it to Homeland Security and so Paul is being permitted to return to the U.S. in 2012 to again use the power of his mighty accordion to drive dancers to the point of ecstatic exhaustion on the dance floor. This time around, Paul will be playing with John Hymas, a fiddler, who is also from the U.K.

Paul started his musical career as an organist but quickly realized that it's difficult to stir up a dance frenzy with an organ and soon adopted the accordion. Since then he's worked in quite a few U.K. bands, including the dance band The Old Pull & Push and the country rock band Ida Red. With his band Belshazzar's Feast, Paul was a 2010 BBC Folk Awards nominee.

John Hymas is a professional composer as well as a

performer. He has composed for dance companies and theater ensembles and has recently had his music used for the BBC arts series, Imagine. As a performer John plays the fiddle with several folk bands, and the viola and accordion with the roots band Little Rumba.



Paul and John have been playing together since 1997, first in the trio Hoover the Dog and more recently in the band Big Top. They excel at providing driving music for both contra dancing and English country dancing and we are delighted to be able to bring them to perform at Northwest Passage this year.

Rebecca Lay

Who better to know how to organize parallel lines than a farmer? Direct from her Ten Speed Farm in Brattleboro, Vermont we bring you Rebecca Lay.

Rebecca is an exciting young caller of both contra and English country dances and is quickly making a name for herself at camps and festivals throughout the U.S. In 2011 alone,

Fulton Still in Danger

Fulton Community Center is still under threat of closure by Portland Parks & Recreation (PP&R). People's efforts over the last two months have had an effect but Fulton is not yet out of the danger zone. About 100 contra dancers, dressed

in red, turned out at the one public meeting held by PP&R on Jan. 9th. Hundreds of letters, emails and phone calls have been received by PP&R, the city commissioners and the mayor.

All city bureaus submitted budgets with 4%, 6%, and 8% cuts. PP&R initially put Fulton closure in all three cut levels. The strong reaction of the contra community, along with the many other users and supporters of Fulton, caused them to take it off the 4% cut level. However, it remains in the 6% and 8% levels.

The budgeting process is now in the hands of the mayor and city council. The upcoming public meetings listed below will provide opportunities for people to show their support of Fulton. If you wear red you will be identified as a supporter of Fulton.

- June 21: council votes to adopt the budget

Two reasons were given for closing Fulton. One is that it has the "fewest visits overall." However it has been pointed out that Fulton has fewer visits only because it is small. A tracking of visits per square foot puts it in line with the other community centers.

Reason two was that Fulton "has high general fund subsidy." Those who have studied PP&R's numbers find that Fulton is actually above average for percentage cost recovery. All 12 community centers lose money. Southwest Community

Center for example loses over a million dollars a year. In straight dollars, Fulton's \$75,000/year subsidy is the second lowest of all.

It's not about the money.

The continuing efforts of all the individuals who want to keep Fulton open may yet succeed in saving this unique hall for the enjoyment of all its users. Press on.

March Open Mike Night

Open mike night has become very popular at Fulton. Not only is there a "mini-Megaband" up on stage, but more and more folks have been trying their hand at calling. If you would like to call a dance, you can find a plethora of contra dances online. Just google "easy contra dances" or "back-pocket dances." Many callers and dance choreographers maintain websites where they publish dances that they have written. Even Cary Ravitz, that master of the complex, has posted a few easy dances on his website.

If you are calling for the first time, choose a dance that is fairly simple, i.e. most of the moves are accomplished in 8 or 16 counts. It might be tempting to choose a really interesting double progression dance that has a shadow alternating with a trail buddy that you only meet every other time through and a cool diamond formation with a celtic knot on the left diagonal, but resist the temptation. You (and the dancers on the floor) won't be sorry. If the music is good and the calling is smooth, the dance will be fun!

Practice calling the dance at home and remember that your calls should come a couple of beats *before* the actual move so that dancers have some warning of what's to come. Once you're actually calling the dance, shorten your calls as much as possible and even more once the dancers have 'got it.' It's ok to stop calling at some point but keep your eye on the floor and recommence calling if it looks like the dance is not going smoothly or if you spot trouble in one of the lines. When it's time to end the dance, signal the band during the B-part that you would like them to play the tune two more times through.

Open mike night is on **Sat. Mar. 31st**. There will be a signup sheet on stage for callers. Interested musicians should contact Lori (primefiddler "at" yahoo) for the set list.

In an effort to ensure that all interested parties learn about upcoming workshops, PCDC members will now be able to indicate their interest in receiving information about workshops when they fill out the membership application. The English Ball was successful and we even received some donations from attendees – thank you very much! The English Committee will meet in early 2012.

In the contra world, NW Passage was not as well attended as in previous years, so the committee surveyed people who had attended in the past to learn why. It certainly wasn't because of the caller or the bands, which received rave reviews. In fact, the dance received national attention due to the presence of Ralph Sweet. Feedback indicated that the Labor Day weekend didn't work this year for many people and some didn't attend because of financial circumstances. We expect to be back on track for Northwest Passage in 2012.

Many PCDC members do not know that they might be eligible for a scholarship. Scholarships give the board the opportunity to support our dancers, callers and musicians. PCDC members, who have been a member for at least six months, can request a scholarship bi-annually to help pay for attending a dance or music camp, or musician or caller workshop. Scholarship information and the application form is on our website. All scholarships are reviewed by the PCDC Board.
