It's time to sign up for the annual Portland English Country Ball to be held on Saturday, November 3rd, 2012, at Oaks Park Dance Pavilion in Portland. This will be the twentieth Portland Ball, and this special year we take great pleasure in welcoming as our Dance Master noted caller Bruce Hamilton. Bruce has taught English and Scottish dance in the Bay Area for many years and has also called in Europe and Canada, always to great acclaim. "There's no special theme for this year's ball," says Bruce, "just a mixture that I think will be fun. The dances span a wide variety from slow to energetic, simple to complex, and new to familiar — all with terrific music."

That music will be provided by Seattle's Anita Anderson; Shira Kammen joining us from the Bay Area; and our own Erik Weberg.

English country dance is similar to contra, and there is still plenty of time to familiarize yourself with the form by attending our weekly dances, held every Friday at 7:30 at the Burlingame Water Tower. In addition, three pre-ball styling workshops are planned for Sept. 22nd, Sept. 29th, and Oct. 13th, to be led by three different callers in turn: Dave Macemon, Mary Devlin, and Nan Evans. All workshops will feature great live music. Bruce urges all to attend the ball regardless of expertise. "If

you find a dance too energetic, too complex, or too slow to suit you, don't feel compelled to dance it. You can still enjoy the look of the dance, the music, and the others' enjoyment. I've tried to make the majority of dances familiar or easy enough that you can appreciate the music, be playful with the other dancers, notice who is sitting out, watch the band members' faces, and take in the whole room." Bruce also means to leave time between dances for a gracious thank you to your partner. Not to mention that we'll have a chance to get dressed up in our favorite ensembles and admire each other. (We encourage festive dress, but don't worry, it's not required.)

Here is Bruce's message to you for this year's ball: "I hope you can attend, and that you'll relax, and have a wonderful evening." So say all of us on the Ball Committee and in the English country dance community.

#### **PCDC Board Meeting Minutes**

We all welcomed new PCDC Board member Mike Voss and thanked outgoing secretary Cindy Correll.

The annual meeting was held on June 9th. Board and committee members were introduced and thanked.

Five hundred dollars will be moved into the Contra Innovation Fund to be used to buy CD's and other items to raffle off at contra dances.

Erik Weberg is the new English dance caller scheduler and Mary Devlin will be the convener of English caller meetings. The current issue of the *CDSS News* features an article by Mary Devlin about Renaissance School students attending an English dance evening. The cover photo is of some students dancing.

The Raindance weekend went very well and ended up in the black.

There will be a special techno contra at the end of June. The New Year's Eve dance will be on Saturday, December 29th at Norse Hall with Adina Gordon and The Syncopaths.

Dan will follow up with the Contra Committee regarding the Rainbow Dance suggestion.

Northwest Passage registration is lower than it was last year at this time.

Eight Dean Kenty scholarship requests were received and approved. There are no new or pending scholarship requests. The board plans to review the scholarship information on the PCDC website to make sure it's clear and consistent.

Fulton Park is no longer a community center but is still available, at least for a year, as a rental facility. Rent is going up \$30 for evening dances.

Mary Devlin is taking over secretary responsibilities in place of Cindy Correll who has left the board. Mike Voss will take over the PCDC mail pick-up and distribution job. Dan Cottle will take over the scholarship job.


A donation was sent to the Community Music Center in honor of Sue Songer, Gordy Euler, Betsy Branch and Erik Weberg to thank them for their Megaband work.

Plaques will be affixed to the pianos at Fulton and the Water Tower identifying them as PCDC property. The English country dance has a new caller PA.

Registration for Northwest Passage is still low. As of mid-August there were 90 people registered with 110 being the desired break-even point. Carmen reported that she's heard from other organizers that their residential dance camps have also been slow to fill up. The board unanimously passed a statement of support for the Northwest Passage Committee and its work. Any financial shortfall from the weekend will be covered by the general fund. Jon gave membership statistics as of July 1, 2012. There were 254 total memberships which probably translates to about 300 individuals since some memberships are for households. There are currently 113 individual memberships, 60 household, 18 senior, 2 student, 11 senior household, and 50 organization (organizations only receive the newsletter).

It was decided to pay \$30 each for up to two musicians for PCDC caller workshops. An out-of-town caller assisting in the workshop will receive \$25 to support travel costs. Payment of the Directors and Officers (D&O) insurance was approved.

From frozen immobility to magic fluidity. Now a tall sweaty man with a wrinkled shirt, now an octogenarian with few teeth and even less hair but an ancient finely pressed plaid shirt, to an unexpectedly young girl (maybe 8 or 9), who quickly turns into somebody's well groomed and cared for husband... Then back eventually to the place where you started. But somehow not at all the same as where you were before you gave yourself to that place where the next note moves your feet forward, then sideways. And your heart (which knew this all along) gets to dance your rarely passive mind around while it sits back in wonder that everybody doesn't simply collide and fall over...

Robin Weber died recently after a 2-year struggle with ovarian cancer. She came to Fulton and participated in dancing only once, then came again to listen but did not have the energy to dance. She was quite taken with the experience and wrote this piece about it afterwards.
