PCDC Board Meeting Minutes

June 18, 2012. Present: D. Cottle, C. Doerge, M. Devlin, S. Goss, J. Neff, M. Voss.

Carmen initiated a discussion about the role of the board and its committees. The Contra Committee has a charter but the others – English Country Dance, Northwest Passage and Family Dance – do not. The board agreed that it would be helpful for all committees to have a charter and is asking for draft charters by March 1, 2013.

Sarah reviewed the profit and loss statement and the balance sheet. It was agreed to move \$4K from 'membership benefits' to 'retained earnings'. The P & L and the balance sheet will be posted on the PCDC website.

The new open/close procedures for Fulton are working nicely. Rent for Fulton is now \$330 a night. We are again able to use the side room which makes it easier to have refreshments for special dances.

Rather than set up a new rainbow dance, the Contra Committee prefers to make all the contra dances more inclusive.

Raindance will have a \$5 admission increase in 2013. The committee would rather implement occasional small increases rather than a large increase down the line.

The Northwest Passage Committee has some new members and changed responsibilities. Rich Goss is now the chairperson, Karsten Kelly is treasurer and Carmen Doerge, Dave Hamlin, Bonnie Voss and Mary Devlin are members. The focus for the 2013 weekend will be contradance.

There were no new scholarship requests for review. APPLY!

PCDC is reapplying for workers comp. insurance because our coverage was cancelled during a mail snafu. We expect to have coverage reinstated soon.
