**Carol Ormand** has been calling traditional contra and square dances since 1990 and regularly calls at dances, weekends and festivals all over the United States and occasionally abroad. She is loved throughout the dance commu-

nity for her smooth and unflappable style, wickedly fun dances, and her penchant for keeping all the dancers smiling. Her enthusiasm, delightful dance selections, and concise, relaxed teaching style keep dancers coming back for more!



Now in its sixth year, **Lift Ticket** has firmly established itself as a favorite band at dance camps and weekends from coast to coast. They weave traditional tunes and new compositions into music that inspires and infuses dancers with amazing energy.

Rex Blazer's exuberant presence has been energizing dancers nationwide for over 25 years. His powerful fiddling blends tradition with a big dose of improvisation based on modern musical motifs. From growling to "trad", blues to swing, his fiddling is always full of surprises. Rex subscribes to the theory that life should be a nonstop music and dance party, and is renowned for his knack of matching the music to



the dance.

T.J. Johnson's irreverent style and high energy mandolin playing inspire dancers and musicians alike. Starting out as a teenager playing contemporary bluegrass, TJ has branched out over the years to enjoy many different styles from jazz to Middle Eastern. Of all the music he plays, he likes playing for dancers best.

Russell S.'s approach to rhythm and to contra dance drumming spans the world. In addition to playing a standard drum kit, Russell drums out seductive dance grooves on a South American box drum and a West African hand drum and is a bongo-meister for all seasons. As well as playing with Lift Ticket, Russell currently performs in various musical settings and with other great contra dance bands.

Seth Houston heats up the dance floor with his ultra-kinetic dance grooves on the piano and guitar. While adept at traditional styles of dance music accompaniment – Irish, New England and Québécois – Seth infuses his playing with funk, pop, blues and swing.

## ECD Community Agrees on New First Friday Arrangement

A new schedule has been agreed on for music on first Fridays at PCDC's English country dances.

Beginning in March, 'open band' will alternate every month with 'small ensembles', the latter to be composed of three musicians from the paid band roster and two non-paid players. The new arrangement will provide an opportunity for musicians who currently play only in the larger open bands to experience playing in a small band. The plan was approved at the Feb. 7th meeting of the ECD Committee, with its music sub-committee and other community members in attendance. The new arrangement will be tried for eight months and evaluated by the whole ECD community, with a formal evaluation in January of 2014.

A proposal about open band, put together by the five-member music committee, had been sent out in January to musicians, callers and the ECD Committee, and written comments were invited. On the basis of comments and suggestions by over 35 individuals, and further discussion on February 7th, there was consensus to implement the open band/small ensemble mix. It was also agreed that increased communication between open band players, leaders and callers, both at rehearsals and music workshops was needed. In addition it was decided that musicians would sign up in advance for open band, allowing lead musicians to plan accordingly. Those wishing to participate in the first Friday small ensembles can sign up with the booker, Sean Nolan.

It was generally agreed that more special dances for both musicians & dancers, as well as more music workshops are desired. Many people emphasized that ECD open band's objectives should include: community building, inclusiveness, opportunities to play, enjoyment of music, playing well for dancers, and more musician development.
