Abandon the dots and learn contra dance tunes by ear from two masters of the genre: Dan Compton and George Penk. Portland Country Dance Community (PCDC) sponsors this series of teaching sessions on second Thursdays to bring new musicians and musicianship to the contra dance community in Portland.

Music for contra dance includes a variety of jigs and reels from Celtic, Old-time, Americana, Quebecois and other folk traditions.

All acoustic instruments are welcome such as fiddle (violin), mandolin, banjo, concertina, cello, guitar, etc. Intermediate skills on your instrument and the ability to learn a tune by ear at a rapid pace is recommended as we usually cover two or three tunes in a typical two-hour session. Note that instruction on musical backup or chords is not part of this class—the focus is on melody.

The cost is just \$7 for PCDC members and \$10 otherwise. Sessions are held at Etienne's house in SE Portland from 7-9 pm. Please arrive a few minutes early so as to be ready to start promptly at 7. For more information contact climb2ski at hotmail dot com.

PCDC Board Meeting Minutes

September 16, 2013. Present: Mary Devlin, Carmen Doerge, Sarah Goss, Jon Neff, Mike Voss.

Carmen announced that Doug Plummer's calendars will arrive soon and will be sent to the Contra Committee.

The next ECD Committee meeting will be October 25th before the dance. Ball plans are going nicely and the ball is almost full. There are three special ball workshops scheduled for Sept. 21, Oct. 5 and Oct. 19, all from 2-4 pm.

Jon had a suggestion for the ECD Committee regarding how often small ensembles (mix of paid and unpaid musicians) might play for dances. Mary will take it to the committee.

The New Year's Eve dance will be on Dec. 31st at Norse Hall.

Northwest Passage was a great success (even though not enough people came to break even). Everyone had a wonderful time and the staff members loved the camp.

PCDC will not apply to be a location for the CDSS Centennial traveling special events because those are intended for smaller communities. We will develop local celebrations.

Mike is developing a draft safety and behavior policy for PCDC that the board will consider at its next meeting.

The board agreed that treasurer positions on committees are exempt from committee turnover requirements. It's important to have these key positions filled with people who are comfortable and competent with the job requirements. It's also useful to minimize the number of changes that have to be made with the bank.

Message from the Mother Ship...

Dear Dancers,

Because we love inclusive, safe, and respectful dancing, your Contra Committee has recently put together a list of suggestions to help encourage good dance communication. To help keep our community awesome, please consider doing the following:

- 1. Ask your partner about their preferences before the dance begins. Newer dancers, people with injuries, and those who get dizzy easily may prefer to keep it smooth and simple.
- 2. Ask if others would like help before giving advice. That person who looks new might have been dancing for years, or they might already be overloaded with information.
- 3. Be aware of non-verbal communication. If your partner or neighbor keeps their arm down during a turn, they don't want to twirl. If they don't make eye contact during a gypsy or swing, they may be feeling shy or simply uninterested in flirting. When in doubt, let them set the pace.
- 4. Be aware that you will meet: women dancing as leads, men dancing as follows and same gender people dancing together. If you find it confusing, just remember dance with the one coming at you.
