Sunday at the Roadhouse

Mark your calendars for the 2019 Cascade Promenade, happening March 6-10. This will be the tenth annual Cascade Promenade, and it features lots of opportunities up and down the I-5 corridor to dance. Check out the website for a complete listing of Promenade activities at www.CascadePromenade.org, or visit Cascade Promenade's Facebook page.

The two primary Portland events are the Portland Megaband Dance on Saturday, March 9th (see article at left) and the Portland Roadhouse on Sunday the 10th. (On Friday, March 8th there is an English dance in Portland as well as a contra dance in Vancouver, WA). The Portland Roadhouse is also in its tenth year, and will once again be held at the Milwaukie Community Club (MCC), 10666 SE 42nd Avenue, in Milwaukie, Oregon. Dancing starts at 11 am and goes until 9 pm. Eight Northwest bands and nine callers will keep the energy and fun going all day and well into the evening. This year's bands are: Au Contraire (Seattle, Olympia); Campaign for Reel Time (Portland); Heliotrope (Bellingham); Hot Cider (Seattle); Improper (Seattle); The Nettles (Corvallis); Riffraff (Olympia) and The Waxwings (Seattle, Olympia). Calling this year are: Tarka Ayres (Portland); Isaac Banner (Seattle); Noah Grunzweig (Portland); Michael Karcher (Seattle); Woody Lane (Roseburg); Susan Michaels (Seattle); Jesse Partridge (Olympia) and emerging callers Valerie Cohen (Seattle) and Becky Nankivell (Ashland).

House managers will be Lanny Martin and Kirben Smoody; stage managers are Dave Goldman and Isaac Banner; and sound will be provided by Rich Goss, assisted by Jon Neff and Carl Thor.

The MCC is a grange-style hall with a hardwood floor ballroom and a downstairs common room where dancers seeking respite can refuel, replenish and relax. This is a great chance to rub shoulders with contra dancers from out-of-town, and to dance all day long, if the Megaband dance and other Promenade events are just not enough!

There will be a day-long potluck downstairs so please bring food to share, being mindful that it may sit out for a long period un-refrigerated. Think finger-foods like peanut-butter & jelly sandwiches, trail mix, chips & salsa, cheese or fruit. Sweets and chocolate are always appreciated. There is also space for jamming so feel free to bring an instrument along with your dancin' shoes.

Admission is \$20 at the door (\$17 if you arrive before 11:30 am or purchase your ticket in advance online) and entitles you to in-and-out privileges all day. As in years past, the Roadhouse event is a benefit for the Northwest Folklife Festival with musicians and callers donating their time and talents. The Iron (four events) and Titanium (five events) Dancer awards will again be given out this year.

PCDC Board Meeting Minutes

Dec. 6, 2018. Present: Rich Goss, Noah Grunzweig, David Macemon, Sara Munz, Jaydra Perfetti, Sue Songer.

- A dancer has been banned from PCDC events for 6
 months. Other dance communities have requested
 details before deciding whether and how to proceed.
 Noah has communicated with the person in question
 and the board will proceed with notifying the person
 about the ban. Jaydra will submit an article about this
 for Footnotes.
- A survey is being created which will be sent to contra and ECD attendees.
- A possible replacement for the Fulton Community Center has been identified: Hillsdale United Church of Christ.
- David Kaynor was recognized for his significant contribution to the Pacific Northwest dance community. Rich is having a plaque made and PCDC will give David a \$200 gift.
- The board discussed its strategic goals: setting financial goals, generating budgets and streamlining banking procedures. Jaydra proposed that the board create a budget in March. It was noted that Chase Bank is difficult to work with. David will bring this up at his branch.
- Pending strategic goals for later discussion: develop outreach and improve our brand/community visibility; boost membership; create a centralized document repository; come up with a means of recognizing significant contributors.
- Sue is talking with Tarka Ayres about taking over the running of PCDC's family dance.
- Membership is down significantly and there was a discussion about how this can be remedied. Some ideas were: make announcements at dances, create a PCDC flyer, have member buttons, ensure that there is always a board member at PCDC events, update the ancient trifold membership application (Ric?), push membership at the door, Facebook matching on giving Tuesday, tiered memberships, print names of members in newsletter. Jaydra will make a 'membership thermometer' to put out at dances. When we hit 400 members, we could have a free-to-members dance, both contra & ECD. Membership drive can start when we have the brochure and button templates.

Memo from the Board...

Organizers for PCDC and other local contra dances received a concerning report that a dancer was engaged in a pattern of behavior harmful to other community members and in violation of PCDC's safe dancing policy. The board formed a team comprised of Rich Goss, Noah Grunzweig and Jaydra Perfetti to investigate the matter and provide the board with a report.

The investigative team spoke to all the parties directly involved as well as members of the community who had witnessed the behavior and/or spoken to the accused dancer about their behavior before PCDC was notified. During the course of the investigation, another person came forward with an independent report of their experience of the same harmful behavior from the same accused dancer.

The specific behaviors were sexual coercion, which is defined as: "unwanted sexual activity that happens when you are pressured, tricked, threatened, or forced in a nonphysical way. Coercion can make you think you owe sex to someone. It might be from someone who has power over you, like a teacher, landlord, or boss." Sexual coercion can also occur with a partner or in a dating relationship. For more information go to: https://www.womenshealth.gov/relationships-and-safety/other-types/sexual-coercion. The website provides several clear examples of behavior that is classified as sexual coercion.

Although the specific acts of sexual coercion in this case occurred outside of dances, the accused dancer was meeting their victims at dances, which is why PCDC is concerned with this behavior within our community. PCDC dances are meant to be a safe place, where all are welcome, and should be free of predatory behavior. Therefore, the PCDC Board has decided to ban the accused dancer from all PCDC dances for 6 months.

This temporary ban is designed to create a safe space for all dancers and to provide the accused dancer with the opportunity for personal growth. Members of the investigative team have suggested learning resources to the accused dancer to help in their personal growth process. The team will continue to check in with the person from time to time, and after 6 months we will meet with them to determine whether they will be able to engage in the community in a healthy way.

Summary of PCDC Board Meeting Minutes for 11-8-18

Chair: The board went into executive session to discuss a sensitive behavior issue; appropriate follow-up actions are being taken. Treasurer: New QuickBooks training continues. The new dance form (report filled out by organizers at a dance) is completed. There was a proposal to change how funds are disbursed at contras between performer guarantees, PCDC's share, and any talent shares. ECD: The committee is considering switching to a sliding scale admission but is waiting to see how it works at contras; will revisit in January. There will be a Seattle Ball workshop at the January Advanced Dance. A community band event is planned for 2019. The ECD Ball was an artistic success. The ball, weekend, and pre-ball workshops will now be budgeted collectively. Contra: The hall is still an issue. The committee is trying to better market sliding scale admissions, but this is helping the dances self-support. The committee will be looking for new members as Brian Woodward (volunteer/housing coordinator), Jenine Moscove (primary talent host) and Noah Grunzweig are leaving. Big thanks to all for their service. Family Dance: An ad with *Portland Parent* is being considered. Grants: 1 approved. Membership: Membership is down about 50 compared to last year. The board will take this up at the December strategy session. Hall Search: Many folks continue looking at new or alternate locations. One possibility is the United Church of Christ in Hillsdale. There will likely be a trial dance arranged to see how dancers feel about the location.
