There's a chill in the air, the days are getting shorter and the spiders are running wild, but while the change of seasons brings a sad goodbye to berries, swimming and bicycling it also means a welcome return to sipping tea, snuggling up under blankets, and most importantly, dancing! As we usually do this time of year, the Portland contra community is hosting a whole slew of special contra dances in the coming months. Mark your calendars!

November 15-17 Rose City Dance-a-Rama is a new urban contra dance weekend, organized by George Marshall in coordination with PCDC. George Marshall and Lisa Greenleaf will call to the music of Wild Asparagus and The Faux Paws all weekend long at Norse Hall. In addition, there will be three half-hour waltz sessions during the weekend. Talky workshops? Nope, just dancing, dancing and more dancing! Space is still available at press time. Don't want to dance all weekend? No problem! The Sunday night dance, also at Norse Hall, will be open to the public. Introductory lesson at 7 pm, dance from 7:30-10:30 pm. Cost: \$10-\$20, sliding scale; free

November 26 PCDC brings back George Marshall and The Faux Paws for a special Tuesday night dance at Norse Hall. With instrumentation that includes saxophone, banjo, fiddle, mandolin, foot percussion, guitar and voice, The Faux Paws pack a vast amount of music and heart into a small package. Noah VanNorstrand, Chris Miller and Owen Morrison bring a

deep, energetic groove to original and traditional old-time, Irish and Quebecois tunes. Noah's genre-defying fiddle



and mandolin playing (along with his unique take on foot percussion) has a skillful counterpoint in Chris's saxophone and banjo, and is supported by Owen's driving rhythm guitar. A typical set shifts from intricately arranged compositions to completely spontaneous bursts of improvisation, but the music is always infectious, taking dancers along for a wild ride. Aug. 20, 2019. Present: Christine Appleberry, Ric Goldman, Rich Goss, Noah Grunzweig, David Macemon, Sara Munz, Marianne O'Doherty, Jaydra Perfetti, Sue Songer.

Chair: Suggestions and feedback on potential PCDC logos have gone to the respective artists.

Finance: The board reviewed and approved the budget for the 2020 fiscal year. Ann Nokes is up to speed as bookkeeper. Our CPA should submit our returns by October 15.

English Country Dance Committee: The advanced dance series is shifting to an October-July season. The committee received an anonymous \$300 donation for the ECD Community Band; the next planned community band session is in October. Ball registration is open and going well.

Contra Committee: We had a good summer, with "Math Camp" students boosting attendance. We will try out more dances with gender-neutral calling, and this will be noted on our website calendar.

Northwest Passage Committee: Registration was down this year for a variety of reasons. The committee will review camper evaluations as well as solicit feedback from community members to determine a vision for the camp's future. Several committee members are leaving after the 2020 camp, so we're looking for new volunteers.

Family Dance Committee: The series is booked except for the March 2020 dance. The previous manager has retired so David Macemon is serving as acting manager and will help form a new committee. A family dance article will appear in *Footnotes*.

Marketing: Efforts continue to develop a new PCDC logo as well as marketing materials for a future membership drive

Fulton: We helped the new Fulton leaseholder clean out the hall, and we are working on formalizing our new relationship with them. Everything is positive so far.

Note: This meeting was a strategic discussion of various topics with no formal committee reports or action item review.

Fulton: In the interests of good relations with L'Etoile French Immersion School, who is now the manager of Fulton Hall, PCDC has offered to host a free family dance for them in November of 2019. PCDC would provide the caller, band and sound person.

Publicity and Membership: David Macemon will work on updating our old tri-fold brochure aimed at new dancers.

Organization: It was decided to limit PCDC board officers (president, treasurer and secretary) to being on no more than one additional PCDC committee in order to ensure that they have the time to do justice to the work required of their position. The board discussed the value of providing a second board member with access to and credentials for PCDC's online accounts and materials.
