PCDC Board member at large (new member)



Testing the Waters: Mask-optional Dances

We are ready to test the waters for optional masking at PCDC dances. The PCDC Covid-protocol survey last March showed that although the largest number of respondents were likely to attend dances with the existing mask and vaccine protocols in place, many respondents were likely to attend if the masking requirement was relaxed. (They were less likely to attend if the vaccine/booster requirement was lifted, however.) At our April meeting, the PCDC board authorized the Portland Contra and English committees to plan one mask-optional dance a month, which they have done. We will evaluate comfort levels and attendance at these dances to inform decisions about a more permanent change to mask protocols. There is no change in the requirement for vaccines and boosters at the present time.

Here are some words from the committee chairs about their decisions.

From the English Committee—by Cynthia Stenger

Following the PCDC board's decision to allow individual dance committees to introduce some mask-optional dances, the English Country Dance Committee has elected to make the first Friday dances in May and June (May 5 and June 2) mask-optional. We will be able to open the windows and let in the fresh spring air! We hope this will provide an opportunity to participate for dancers who cannot dance in a mask. Remember, mask-optional does not mean completely mask-free—all are welcome to attend these evenings, with or without a mask.

From the Portland Contra Committee—by Kathy Story

Based on recent survey results and the PCDC board decision, the Portland Contra Committee has decided to try a mask-optional dance on June 10. To inform the community well in advance, we will announce the dance at our upcoming dances and through Facebook, the PCDC website, and the Contra-announce email list. We hope our dancing friends who cannot dance in a mask will join us, along with both those who prefer not to wear a mask and those who prefer to wear a mask. Vaccinations and boosters are still required, and we will have extra ventilation in the hall.

CDSS Board visit: CDSS has asked Portland to host their October executive board meetings in October. PCDC will arrange the meeting space, provide a community meeting, and have CDSS board members who can call local dances. The board authorized up to \$500 for hosting expenses.

Membership: Counts are the same as last month and up 74 from last year.

Grants: Yosef Trachtenberg's and Kelly Tabor's grant requests were approved.

Covid Protocols: Based on the results from the latest community survey, PCDC will retain vaccine requirements and look into possible mask-optional dances.

Portland Contra committee: Betsy Dana has joined the committee.

Community Values task force: Rewrite of the PCDC bylaws has been completed and proposed language sent to the membership for feedback.
